J Waddell did not attend the meeting.

All runners in race eight were pre-race blood tested.

RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1 FEILDING HOTEL MAIDEN

TINDILL began awkwardly and settled back. JERRICO raced ungenerously during the early and middle stages and had to be steadied for some distance near the 800 metres. DEHERE AND THERE was obliged to race wide throughout. JERRICO was held up rounding the home turn before being taken wide near the 250 for clear running.

Race 2 ELDERS LIVESTOCK 1200

ELINI over-raced in the early stages and approaching the 1000 metres, hung out badly making the turn awkwardly. ELINI then raced ungenerously for the remainder and over the final was eased down when beaten. Rider L Allpress advised that ELINI hanging tendencies had resulted in the gelding proving difficult to control. Trainer S Crutchley undertook to affect a gear change in an attempt to remedy the gelding's waywardness. Stewards advised connections that a warning had been placed on ELINI's racing manners.

Race 3 GOLDPINE MAIDEN

MASIH CHIANTIK underwent a veterinary examination at the barrier and was cleared to race after blood was found in the mare's mouth.

NICMAJAC raced keenly in the run down the back straight.

Rounding the home turn FIELD DAZE had to steady for a short distance when JAMOMITI improved around the outside.

ADIDAZLER made contact with the running rail near the 250 metres after shifting ground when being ridden out.

Race 4 TRU TEST HANDICAP

PACTUS lay in rounding the bend at the end of the back straight resulting in tightening to REMEMBA HOWE which had to steady for several strides.

Trainer D Williams was questioned regarding the improved performance of TURN ON D'LIGHT which had disappointed at the Woodville meeting on 24/10/2011. Mr Williams stated that the gelding, having not raced for four weeks prior to Woodville, had improved with that outing and was better suited to having less space between races.

Race 5 TOTALLY VETS HANDICAP

IRIODES raced keenly in the early and middle stages and passing the 800m was steadied away from the heels of ISTIDAADSUE and taken wider. WOTABUZZ raced keenly in the early stages. GEORGE NEIL returned to the enclosure with blood present in the mouth. Rider D Walker advised Stewards that the gelding had hit the front of its gate prior to the start. A post-race veterinary inspection revealed a damaged front tooth.

Race 6 COURTESY FORD REDCRAZE BOWL

RIOMORAL raced keenly for some distance in the back straight.

Race 7 PRATT QUARRIES 1600

ZANE BAY was slow to begin. TAURUS raced greenly when making the junction onto the course proper. POP YA BELT was inclined to lay out under pressure in the home straight. N Harris the rider of NUITS ST GEORGE reported to the Stewards that the gelding had coughed on two or three occasions when pulling up consistent with having swallowed a clod. A post-race veterinary inspection reported no abnormalities.

Race 8 RICOH FEILDING GOLD CUP - Listed

BEAU DANE began awkwardly. HERMAN MUNSTER was obliged to race three-wide without cover throughout. FAZZA was held up rounding the home turn until near the 250m. HERMAN MUNSTER was held up rounding the turn until near the 200m. RISING TIDE was inclined to lay in throughout the final straight and near the 200 metres, shifted in momentarily inconveniencing RUMOUR HAS IT NOW. JUST AS WELL lost the off-side foreleg plate during the running.

Race 9 NIGEL 'SHARKIE' CLARK MEMORIAL

GOLD CARD shifted out in the home straight when under pressure. When questioned into the run of ALBUS, apprentice R Hurdle said the gelding was unsuited by the track conditions near the fence.

Race 10: HUMPHREY FAMILY 1400

GOOD ONE GLADY was severely tightened at the start when runners either side shifted ground and settled back as a result.

TIDAL WAVE was obliged to race wide without cover throughout.
