RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	FAGAN FORD STAYERS
<p>PRIMED AND READY began awkwardly and lost ground.</p> <p>ZANE BAY was held up rounding the turn and had to be angled wider to obtain clear running passing the 200 metres.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the run of CLIQUOT rider M Hills stated that the mare had travelled well throughout however had not responded when pressured and was disappointing. A subsequent veterinary examination of CLIQUOT revealed no abnormalities.</p> <p>Apprentice M Ward (PRIMED AND READY) admitted a breach of Rule 638 (3) (b) in that he used his whip excessively prior to the final 200 metres. After consideration the Judicial Committee imposed a fine of \$200.</p>	
Race 2	SUMMER FESTIVAL RACEDAY AT TAUHERENIKAU ON 2 JAN
<p>UJAZZI slipped on jumping. SHOT OF IRISH began awkwardly and shifted out bumping ADIDAZLER. CALM THE STORM began awkwardly and was slow away. LADY NUMBUS was slow away. NO CREDIT raced keenly rounding the first turn when being steadied. ZOHRA'S GEM made the first turn awkwardly taking NAH I'M GOOD over extra ground. SHOT OF IRISH</p>	

<p>was obliged to race wide throughout. BROWN BELLA was held up passing the 600 metres until near the 150 metres. PLATINUM PURRFECT was held up for a short distance rounding the final turn and passing the 250 metres was tightened and checked when to the outside of CHRYSOLITE. PLATINUM PURRFECT was then angled inward to continue to improve. B Lammas (CHRYSOLYTE) defended a charge of careless riding under Rule 638 (1) (d) in that he permitted his mount to shift out when not clear. After submissions the Judicial Committee found the charge proved and resultantly rider Lammas's licence to ride in races was suspended from the conclusion of racing on Saturday 26 November 2011 until the conclusion of racing on Friday 2 December 2011. CALM THE STORM lay out over the final 200 metres dictating BASTILLE KING wider.</p>	
Race 3	LITTLE AVONDALE 3YO SPRINT
<p>When questioned regarding the run of SHEZAZED, D Walker advised that the filly had raced greenly throughout and would benefit from further racing.</p>	
Race 4	HORSE AND HOUND CAFÉ AND BAR 1400
<p>DIANNA RIGG began awkwardly and lost ground. LA DANSEUR and TINDILL came together at the start. LA DANSEUR had difficulty obtaining clear running rounding the final turn. TULIP lay out rounding the final turn and made its finishing run wide out on the track. DIANNA RIGG was held up rounding the turn and the early part of the final straight.</p>	
Race 5	TUMU ITM 1400
<p>OUR LORALEI began awkwardly and shifted in bumping TRAVOLTA. GYMDANDY was slow to begin. NO SPURS NEEDED and JEROBOAM came together at the start. NO SPURS NEEDED and KIWI LAD both had to be steadied off heels near the 1000 metres when the pace ahead steadied. NO SPURS NEEDED was held up passing the 250 and had to be steadied. JEROBOAM was held up rounding the turn and only obtained clear running near the 200 metres. TE NAMU was obliged to race with without cover throughout.</p>	
Race 6	BALLANCE AGRI-NUTRIENTS SPRINT
<p>JAKADE was slow away. VALDERAMA was tightened at the start when runners either side shifted ground and as a result settled back. Near the 850 metres YELRACM, when in restricted room, had to be steadied after there was slight movement from runners to the outside. Passing the 200 metres SUNINSKY under hard riding shifted out dictating SANRIBA wider.</p>	
Race 7	MANGAN GRAPHICS 1000
<p>FOREVER DREAMING and SOU'EAST were slow to begin. JERRICO was held up passing the 600 metres until near the 300 metres. PRINCESS LINCOLN was held up rounding the turn and had to be angled inwards passing the 300 metres to continue to improve. LIZKEE raced greenly in the early part of the straight and shifted out inconveniencing SOU'EAST which had to be taken wider. RACEY RED had to be steadied passing the 100 metres when on heels. Trainer G Burton was advised a warning was placed on the racing manners of FOREVER DREAMING which had raced ungenerously throughout. LIZKEE raced wide throughout.</p>	
Race 8	NEW ZEALAND BLOODSTOCK INSURANCE MASTERTON CUP
<p>Shortly after being loaded into the barriers PESCIOLINI became very agitated and kicked out behind, striking the barrier structure. PESCOLINI was then withdrawn from its barriers where</p>	

<p>it was revealed that the mare had fractured its near hind leg. As a consequence of the injuries sustained PESCOLINI was humanely euthanased.</p> <p>Due to PESCOLINI being attended to the remainder of the runners were unloaded from the barrier and the event eventually started approximately 13 minutes after the scheduled start time.</p> <p>WYBAN ANGEL, KALGOORLIE BOMBER and YESHI SHINKO were all slow away. YESHI SHINKO over-raced in the early stages.</p>	
Race 9	BRUCE PERRY BLOODSTOCK 1400
<p>The start of this race was delayed 10 minutes due to the late start of the previous race.</p> <p>MISS ANA was slow to begin. LA BELLE FEMME shifted in on jumping away dictating the line of DUCATI for a short distance. BARKEEPER slipped behind on jumping away.</p> <p>MISS ANA raced wide without cover throughout. HOW THE BEEL was held up for several strides rounding the home turn.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of MISS ANA, Apprentice L Whelan stated that the mare had over-raced and had refused to settle. Apprentice Whelan added, that in her view, MISS ANA would be better for the run.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of LA BELLE FEMME rider R Hannam could offer no excuses.</p>	
Race 10	TRUST HOUSE MILE
<p>FABULOUS PRINCESS was scratched by order of the Stewards at 5.10pm after taking control of the rider and galloping a circuit of the track. Trainer F Auret was advised that the mare must be led to the start in future.</p> <p>BELLA CAROLINA began awkwardly.</p> <p>SURF PATROL was inclined to over-race in the early stages. REBEL'S RANSOM raced keenly in the early stages and had to be steadied off heels for some distance near the 1200. ALBUS raced four-wide throughout.</p> <p>B Lammas reported that after travelling well in the early and middle stages REBEL'S RANSOM offered nothing when put under pressure in the home straight.</p> <p>Apprentice A Taylor reported that BELLA CAROLINA had hung out throughout the race.</p>	
Race 11	SUPERLOO CLEAN, PROUD PROVIDERS OF TOAST MARTINBOROUGH 1600
<p>MISTY HEIGHTS was slow away. LUMINATION got its head up when being steadied shortly after the start and settled back. SAN PEDRO and OH SO VAGUE raced keenly in the early stages. LUMINATION commenced to over-race near the 1200 metres and had to be steadied off heels for a short distance. METRICAL was obliged to race wide throughout and made the final bend awkwardly when tiring, shifting out and bumping the hindquarters of POSTE RESTANTE which became unbalanced for a short distance. MALAYA lay out over the final stages and near the post had to be steadied.</p> <p>OH SO VAGUE returned to the enclosure with blood in the nasal area. A subsequent veterinary inspection revealed the mare to be a bleeder. Trainer N Auret was advised that OH SO VAGUE would be subject to the mandatory three month stand down period.</p>
