RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1 RANKIN BUILDING LIMITED STAYERS

HEMPSTEAD and KITCH were slow to begin.

OUGHT TO BE BAD was crowded on jumping.

KITCH raced wide without cover throughout.

Shortly after the start FLOAISHA lugged outwards forcing LADY LINCOLN outwards across the heels of TE NAMU (K Smith) which was on an inward movement. This resulted in LADY LINCOLN clipping the heels of TE NAMU and becoming unbalanced. K Smith was issued with a warning.

Passing the winning post on the first occasion, TE NAMU, which was over racing, had to be steadied when LET'S GO FRATELLI (J Riddell) shifted inwards. J Riddell was reminded of his obligations to be clear when shifting ground.

Passing the 200 metres TE NAMU was buffeted for several strides when outside FLOAISHA (J Parkes), which was attempting to improve its position. J Parkes was advised to exercise care in similar circumstances when shifting ground.

D Nolan admitted a breach of Rule 638(1) (d) in that passing the 1400 metres he permitted his mount HEMPSTEAD to shift out when not clear of LUCKS PENNY which was dictated wider on the track. After consideration the judicial committee suspended D Nolan's licence to ride in races from the conclusion of racing today, 15 March until the conclusion of racing on Thursday, 21 March.

Race 2 MIKE DAWSON PAINTER FLYERS

Due to a lack of apprentice riders on course, D Bradley replaced A Forbes on SHESALLJAZZ. BAREFOOT was slow to begin.

DAUFINO raced keenly in the early stages.

BAREFOOT was held up rounding the turn until near the 250 metres.

M Todd the trainer of WHOOPI GEE advised the stewards that the mare had got its tongue over the bit during the running.

Race 3 PAHIATUA GOLF CLUB FILLIES AND MARES

THORA BOB reared on jumping.

A short distance after the start, HEART OF DARKNESS hung outwards resulting in crowding to the following runners: WENDY, RACEY RED, THORA BOB, PEARLS, which lost ground, and TE HORO BLING.

THORA BOB raced ungenerously throughout.

HEART OF DARKNESS was held up passing the 500 metres until near the 250 metres.

CRUMPET was held up rounding the turn until near the 250 metres.

L Allpress reported that the saddle on WENDY had shifted back passing the 500 metres, resulting in her being unable to ride the filly to full advantage in the home straight.

Race 4 BARRELHOUSE RESTAURANT AND BAR JUVENILE

BRUTALLY HANDSOME was slow to begin.

KALAMANJAR shifted out on jumping, crowding PADDY OWEN, which lost ground.

LADY GO LIGHTLY raced wide in the early stages.

KALAMANJAR hung outwards throughout and rounding the turn near the 800 metres, shifted out, taking LADY GO LIGHTLY wider.

BRUTALLY HANDSOME was held up for a short distance passing the 400 metres.

Race 5 D&G AUTOSPRAY METRIC MILE

DUCATI and SUPERVISOR came together and bumped at the start and got back.

NO SPURS NEEDED was slow away.

VICTOR ALBERTO raced keenly rounding the first turn.

CELLMATE had to steady near the 500m when on the heels of the tiring VALLEY GOLD.

NINE IRON (J Shackleton) lay out throughout the final straight dictating DEE DEE SMASH wider. Connections of DEE DEE SMASH viewed video coverage of the incident but elected not to proceed with an objection. Apprentice J Shackleton was advised that she is expected to make more of an effort to keep her mount straight when in similar circumstances.

Approaching the winning post DEE DEE SMASH shifted out and away from NINE IRON and into the line of VICTOR ALBERTO, which was improving to its outside. VICTOR ALBERTO had to steady off the heels of DEE DEE SMASH and in doing so shifted into the line of DRIFT, which was hampered.

DRIFT hung inwards throughout the home straight placing the rider at a disadvantage.

When questioned into the run of PINOT DAVONE, rider R Myers was of the opinion that the filly would prefer any easing of the track.

Race 6 RJ & CM McRAE DASH

OLEG was slow over the early stages.

COLJOY raced keenly in the early stages and near the 1000 metres raced greenly for a short distance.

Race 7 NEW CENTRAL HOTEL DASH

RIO NUGGET was a late scratching at the barriers at 4.21pm on veterinary advice after the mare was found to be lame in the right hind leg. Connections were advised that a veterinary clearance would be required before RIO NUGGET next starts.

SAMSI, ORMOND ROAD and MISS ANNALIESE were slow.

SANRIBA raced three wide without cover throughout.

SHERBORNE was held up rounding the turn until near the 150 metres.

TAKE OFF was held up for several strides near the 200 metres.

SAMSI was held up for a short distance in the early part of the final straight.

Race 8 BISSET HONDA SPRINT

A warning was placed on CANSO after it proved reluctant to parade to the start.

SNAX was crowded shortly after leaving the barriers and got back.

ZA BRUTE raced three wide without cover throughout.

SHINING PEARL was held up in the early part of the final straight before being taken wider to improve near the 250 metres then bumped with THE AFTERSHOCK.

STICKEMUP raced greenly in the home straight.
