GENERAL:

The connections of COURT IN THE PARK which was the subject of a veterinary inspection after finishing well back at Wellington on 17/3/2012 reported the horse subsequently to be sore and is to be spelled.

Trainer S Brown reported that DON'T DILLY DALLY underwent a veterinary examination following its unplaced run at Woodville on 15/3/2012 which revealed a blood disorder. DON'T DILLY DALLY has been given the necessary treatment.

RACE COMMENTS:

PURE ELEGANCE dislodged rider J McDonald when leaving the enclosure but was quick recaptured. PURE ELEGANCE underwent a veterinary examination behind the barrier ar was cleared to run.

POWERADE was slow to begin.
Race 2 FARMLANDS/SIMPSON CONTRACTING LTD 1200
PINKY PROMISE was a late scratching at 12.15pm after being found to have filling in the le
foreleg when arriving on course. Trainer K Lawrence was advised that a veterina
clearance would be required prior to PINKY PROMISE next racing.
OSCAR began awkwardly and was then slow over the early stages.
GINGERBREAD MAN was slow away then raced wide throughout.
RHYTHM GURU got its head up when being steadied approaching the first turn.

DANELIZEE was held up for a short distance near the 300m.

J McDonald the rider of DEVILLAINE reported that in his opinion, the gelding would improve with further experience.

Race 3 PETER BARRY MEMORIAL

ALDEBARAN STAR was buffeted for some distance shortly after leaving the barriers.

LIKEAPINS got its head up passing the 1000m when being steadied off the heels of ALDEBARAN STAR. LIKEAPINS then over-raced for some distance in the back straight. ALDEBARAN STAR raced keenly in the early stages.

When questioned into the run of VANDENNE rider J McDonald reported that the mare was comfortable in the going however was unsuited to the slow tempo over the early stages.

Race 4 FERGUSSONS MOTOR LODGE/THORNTON LODGE MOTEL MAIDEN 3YO

TSAR REFORMER raced ungenerously in the early and middle stages and got is head up for some distance passing the 1200m. THE BACHELOR hung inwards entering the home straight and a short distance further on was taken wider when GOLD WEDDING shifted out. TSAR PERFORMER raced greenly over the final 400m and had to be straightened.

Race 5 DANNEVIRKE HUNT MAIDEN 1600

SADLERS ROCK and BAT PAD were slow to begin. SADLERS ROCK had to steady momentarily entering the back straight when in restricted room. V Johnson (TOP OF THE STRETCH) was advised to exercise care when shifting ground after dictating A'GUIN ACE inwards near the 1200m

Race 6 AON NZ INSURANCE BROKERS 1600

DANCING DEE and MAUDE were slow to begin. JUST AS WELL raced wide rounding the first turn.

DANCING DEE had to be steadied off heels passing the 1200m when racing keenly. HEMINGWAY over-raced in the middle stages.

Race 7 MILLS HONDA/RUAHINE FORD WAIPUKURAU CUP

SPEEDUP was slow to begin.

SHOW THE BEEL raced keenly in the early and middle stages.

HOWBADAMI was held up in the early part of the home straight prior to being angled outwards to improve. HOWBADAMI lugged inwards throughout the home straight necessitating rider K Myers to change her whip to the left hand in an endeavour to keep the gelding straight.

When questioned regarding the improved performance of the winner SHOW THE BEEL, trainer M Cartwright attributed the improved performance to the step up in distance from 1600m to 2200m.

Trainer K Gray advised that subsequent to the event TANQUERAY had displayed soreness in the off-hind and would be spelled. K Gray was advised that a veterinary clearance would be required prior to TANQUERY next racing.

Race 8 FOLEY AGRI/FARMERS AIR 1600

DRIFT was steadied rounding the first turn when in restricted room.

LADY BELLE was inclined to lay in over the final 300m and had to be continually straightened.

When questioned regarding the run of BON GENIE rider J McDonald could offer no excuses. Apprentice J Shackleton (MARIE'S BOY) was reminded of her obligations to ride her mount out fully to the finish where circumstances permit.
