## RACE COMMENTS:

<b>Race 1</b>	<b>RAY WHITE REAL ESTATE RATING 75 (1400m)</b>
<p>COUP OVERBAKED blundered at the start and lost ground.</p> <p>SAW HER WALKIN BY was slow in the early stages.</p> <p>SANDIE raced keenly in the early and middle stages.</p> <p>NO CHOICE raced wide throughout.</p> <p>SANDIE was held up passing the 500m and was continuously restrained off heels.</p> <p>DR DEE BEE lugged out rounding the final bend and continued to lug out through the final straight, and passing the 150m was straightened when making contact with SANDFLY..</p> <p>Following this event the connections of 4<sup>th</sup> placed SANDFLY lodged an objection against 3<sup>rd</sup> placed DR DEE BEE in respect of being forced over extra ground in the home straight. On hearing relevant submissions the JCA upheld the protest and reversed the placings which now read 1<sup>st</sup> 3, 2<sup>nd</sup> 13, 3<sup>rd</sup> 5, 4<sup>th</sup> 1.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of LORD CAVENDISH, rider K Williams stated that the gelding was slow into stride, got further back than intended and had disappointed. A post race veterinary examination of LORD CAVENDISH did not reveal any obvious abnormalities.</p>	
<b>Race 2</b>	<b>SILVERFERN ACCOMMODATION MAIDEN (1400m)</b>
<p>CATALEA raced ungenerously in the early stages.</p> <p>Passing the 1200m MARY BURKE (T Moseley) which was assuming the lead shifted in and inconvenienced GLOBAL PARTNER which had to check, with the trailing SANDY'S GIRL also hampered in this incident and losing ground. T Moseley admitted a charge under Rule 638(1)(d). After hearing evidence the JCA upheld the charge and suspended T Moseley's licence to ride in races for 2 days effective 8 to 12 April 2012 inclusive.</p> <p>ZENYATTA raced wide throughout.</p> <p>SAVANNAH AL JAMAL raced ungenerously throughout.</p> <p>Passing the 500m BERNADETTE commenced to hang out.</p> <p>GLOBAL PARTNER raced in restricted room over the final 40m and went to the line under a hold.</p>	

When questioned regarding the performance of BERNADETTE, rider K Williams stated that the mare had begun to lay outwards from the 800m and passing the 500m had failed to make the final bend and continued to run wide for the remainder of the straight. She added she was reluctant to urge the mare forward as she was of the opinion it would continue to lay out. Trainer J Parsons reported that BERNADETTE may not have appreciated the quick backup from racing last Thursday and it was his intention to experiment with gear prior to the filly's next start.

A post race veterinary examination of BERNADETTE did not reveal any obvious abnormalities. BERNADETTE was issued with a racing manners warning.

<b>Race 3</b>	<b>RAY WHITE CASHMERE RATING 65 (1400m)</b>
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TE RUANUKU and GROOVER began awkwardly and were slow to begin.

CLASSY FASHION shifted in on jumping and made contact with HANNAH KAN which in turn made contact with PEACE which was hampered.

CLASSY FASHION raced wide throughout.

GANACHE was held up passing the 500m.

Inside the 350m ALTHELEAVESRBROWNE made contact with the tiring CLASSY FASHION which was laying away from EDDIE MONSOON.

When questioned regarding the performance of CLASSY FASHION, rider M Cameron could offer no excuse other than being caught wide throughout. A post race veterinary examination of CLASSY FASHION did not reveal any obvious abnormalities. Trainer's representative N Ridley advised the Stewards that the filly was likely to be retired. Trainer M McCann reported that TE RUANUKU had reacted adversely to the tongue tie and it was his intention to make the appropriate gear change prior to racing next.

<b>Race 4</b>	<b>RAY WHITE REAL ESTATE RATING 65 (2200m)</b>
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MONACHEE was slow to begin.

Shortly after the start BACCO, CONTROL and PRINCE FLIGHT all came together and jostled for some distance.

BACCO and CONTROL over raced in the early stages.

OVERTHELIGN raced wide through the middle stages.

BACCO raced wide from the 1000m.

When spoken to regarding the performance of MONACHEE, rider K Walters stated that after being slow to begin and getting further back than anticipated the mare had become unbalanced when he momentarily dropped his whip passing the 400m and had battled on well in the run home.

<b>Race 5</b>	<b>RAY WHITE REAL ESTATE MAIDEN (2200m)</b>
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REIN OFF was obliged to race wide in the early stages.

REDONYX raced three wide without cover throughout.

Passing the 1200m NOELINE began to over race and was continually steadied off heels for some distance.

A post race veterinary examination of REDONYX which gave ground from the 800m and trailed the field home revealed a rapid heart rate. . Trainer I Lee advised it was her intention to retire the mare. A post race veterinary examination of AVID RULER did not reveal any obvious abnormalities.

Trainer M Stokes advised it was his intention to spell AVID RULER.

<b>Race 6</b>	<b>RAY WHITE REAL ESTATE MAIDEN (1200m)</b>
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QUANTUM DAF and ONE HIPPI CHICK were slow to begin.

SHOWBRERA raced wide in the early stages.

JAZZ AFTER DARK over raced in the early stages when being restrained off heels of the runner in front.

DHAULAGIRI lay out rounding the home turn, shifting out and making contact with SHOWBRERA.

Rider L Robinson reported that DHAULAGIRI had lay out rounding the final bend under pressure and had battled well in the run home, L Robinson further stated that in his opinion DHAULAGIRI was not entirely happy in today's prevailing track conditions.

JAZZ AFTER DARK had difficulty obtaining clear running in the early stages of the run home.

ONE HIPPI CHICK was reported to have blood present in one nostril on return to the birdcage, and after inspection from the club's veterinary surgeon, found the injury to be consistent with hitting its head on the starting gates.

Rider A McKay (QUANTUM DAF) reported she had dropped her whip passing the 200m.

<b>Race 7</b>	<b>RAY WHITE REAL ESTATE RATING 75 (1200m)</b>
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PINZEE bounded as the start was made and began awkwardly.

NATKINGCOLE shifted out on jumping and made contact with ARIETTA which in turn hampered ANZAC STAR.

Passing the 1100m NATKINGCOLE skyed its head when being restrained off the heels of runners in front. ANITA PEA and PREMIER LADY raced wide throughout.

Passing the 400m TRADEMARK which was having to be steadied away from the runners in front blundered and became unbalanced for a short time.

ARIETTA lay in through the final straight.

A post race veterinary examination of TRADEMARK which appeared to be lame following the running did not reveal any obvious abnormalities.

When questioned regarding the performance of ANITA PEA, rider T Direen stated that the mare had felt flat for the entire journey and although racing wide early had failed to respond when placed under pressure in the straight.

Trainer P Rudkin advised the Stewards it was his intention to now spell the mare. A post race veterinary examination of ANITA PEA did not reveal any obvious abnormalities.

When questioned regarding the performance of ARIETTA, rider K Williams stated that the mare had lay in throughout and had proved difficult to ride over the concluding stages. Trainer J Parsons will be spoken to.

A post race veterinary examination of ARIETTA did not reveal any obvious abnormalities.

Rider S Yusoff advised that ANZAC STAR was inclined to hang out rounding the turn and he did not feel comfortable in the prevailing track conditions. A post race veterinary examination of ANZAC STAR did not reveal any obvious abnormalities.
