RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	94.4 THE SOUND 1340
LETSGETITON reared at the start unbalancing rider R Myers and as a result settled back. Shortly after the start MAKO shifted out when racing greenly and dictated EDENBRAE outwards on to MY SISTERS KEEPER. GINGERBREAD MAN shifted outwards at the start and then raced greenly for a short distance. DONTUJUSTLUVIT over-raced in the back straight. DEFENCITI was held up rounding the turn until near the 200 metres. Passing the 250 metres DONTUJUSTLUVIT shifted out and away from CAPADA resulting in CRUZIN being taken wider for a short distance. Following this event the track was upgraded to Dead 4.	
Race 2	LOWE SCHOLLUM & JONES 1340
BEAU ZED began awkwardly and was slow away. WARKING TALKING was slow away. STORMY LASS was inclined to lay out rounding the turn. When questioned into the run of GO BEAUTY which failed to run on, rider J Parkes said that	

despite its tendency to hang outwards rounding the turn he had no real excuse.	
Race 3	STEVE CRUTCHLEY RACING 1200
<p>CASTLETON KING hung out throughout and passing the 800 metres ran wide losing considerable ground and was not being persevered with over the final stages. Trainer R Cook was advised that CASTLETON KING must trial to the satisfaction of the stewards prior to next racing.</p> <p>KURODA FIELD was held up for some distance passing the 800 metres when awkwardly placed inside the heels of KILFLYNN.</p> <p>GOSPEL was held up rounding the turn until near the 250m</p> <p>When questioned regarding the improved performance of SHESALLJAZZ, which was subject to a Stewards' investigation and veterinary inspection at Awapuni on 13 April after finishing last, rider D Bradley reiterated the mare had never performed satisfactorily on the Awapuni course and was better suited to today's track conditions.</p> <p>Stewards questioned M Hills with respect to his apparent lack of vigour on USTIBECASUAL between the 800 metres and 500 metres. M Hills advised that after missing the jump and being trapped wide early, he elected to improve his mount forward into a trailing position some distance behind the leader SHESALLJAZZ. M Hills was of the opinion that to unduly try the mare after being pressured earlier in the back straight would have been detrimental to its chances.</p>	
Race 4	PAUL BELSHAM RACING 1200
<p>THE MINERS SON underwent a veterinary examination at the barriers and passed fit to run after dislodging rider S Doyle during its preliminary.</p> <p>NO TOLERANCE and NOTTOOBAD came together and bumped at the start.</p> <p>THE MINERS SON jumped out abruptly at the start bumping with BABY GEE which was taken out in to the line of DRESSTOEMPRESSNOW and THE GREAT WHITE which both hampered and lost ground.</p> <p>THAT SNOW ATHLETE was slow to begin.</p> <p>DRESSTOEMPRESSNOW hung out throughout and near the 700 metres lay out on to the heels of THE GREAT WHITE having to be steadied. DRESSTOEMPRESSNOW continued to hang out for the remainder. Also affected in this incident was THAT SNOW ATHLETE.</p> <p>THE GREAT WHITE raced greenly throughout.</p> <p>Passing the 800 metres PHOENIX TYCOON, when being restrained off heels, shifted out marginally resulting in crowding to NO TOLERANCE which had to be steadied and came back on to THE GREAT WHITE. After questioning riders no further action was deemed appropriate.</p>	
Race 5	KEVIN MYERS STABLES 2040
<p>JOSEPHINE and AIYANA bumped at the start.</p> <p>DEVIL KEEPER raced wide without cover in the early and middle stages.</p> <p>Rider D Bradley reported that TUTU TANGO had raced greenly throughout.</p>	
Race 6	LETHAM THOROUGHBREDS 2040
<p>AT THE TOP and SEDUCER were slow away.</p> <p>BLISSFILLY raced wide rounding the first turn.</p> <p>SEDUCER raced wide from the 1,000 metres.</p> <p>EL TENAZ was buffeted for several strides near the 200 metres when in restricted room.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of the winner METTERNICH which had finished well back at its previous start at Awapuni, trainer F Auret attributed the improved run today to the gelding racing unchallenged in the lead, whereas at its previous start it had been taken on in the early and middle stages and had commenced to over-race.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of HIGH VOLTAGE Rider D Bradley stated that after travelling well during the running, the gelding had failed to respond when pressured passing the 600 metres and was beaten prior to entering the final straight. The stewards</p>	

ordered a veterinary examination of HIGH VOLTAGE which revealed no obvious abnormalities. Connections undertook to monitor the progress of HIGH VOLTAGE in coming days and report any matter to the Stewards.

Race 7	LISA LATTA RACING STABLES 1600
