## RACE COMMENTS:

<b>Race 1</b>	<b>NRM MAIDEN</b>
NAISOSO WARRIOR (H Tinsley) shifted out shortly after leaving the barrier hampering EDENSOR (M McNab) which lost ground. EDENSOR then commenced to over-race in the run along the back straight. EDENSOR was held up in the early part of the home straight so was angled wider to continue to improve. When questioned regarding the run of LIKE JAGGER, J Parkes said that in his opinion the gelding would be better suited to rain affected going.	
<b>Race 2</b>	<b>P &amp; C INSURANCE HANDICAP</b>
O'CONNOR (L Whelan) was obliged to race wide throughout. THE PRINCE OF POP (M McNab) hung out throughout. CONFRONTATIONAL (L Cropp) and OUR PRETTY WOMAN (M Cameron) brushed near the 200m. When questioned regarding the disappointing performance of SUPERVISOR, H Tinsley could offer no excuse.	
<b>Race 3</b>	<b>PGG WRIGHTSON MAIDEN</b>
CAPTAIN FRANCIS (M Cameron) and IRA BEAN (M McNab) were slow to begin. STICKEMUP (D Bradley) was obliged to race wide without cover throughout. SIVOCCHI (J Parkes) was held up rounding the turn until near the 200m and when in clear running brushed with HIGGS BOSON (L Allpress). HIGGS BOSON raced in restricted quarters over the final stages. IRA BEAN (M McNab) was inclined to lay inwards over the final 300m and had to be straightened. A post-race veterinary examination of CAPTAIN FRANCIS found the horse to be slightly sore in the left foreleg.	
<b>Race 4</b>	<b>UNITED TRAVEL &amp; FRANCIS TRAVEL MARKETING HANDICAP</b>
NEW ORDER was late scratched on veterinary advice after being injured prior to the meeting. SCARLET O'HARA (L Allpress) began awkwardly.	

<p>SCARLET O'HARA was held up rounding the home turn until near the 200m and when in clear running was inclined to hang outwards and had to be straightened.</p> <p>When questioned into the run of GUESSING which raced wide throughout and finished last, H Tinsley said the mare would be better suited by any easing of the ground.</p> <p>MISS CENTREFOLD disappointed finishing back. Connections advised that the mare would be spelled.</p>	
<b>Race 5</b>	<b>CHEAL MANAWATU HANDICAP</b>
<p>HEMINGWAY (L Whelan) raced wide rounding the first turn.</p> <p>BALLYBIT (M Cameron) was inclined to race wide in the early stages.</p> <p>Near the 1000m, SAN PEDRO (L Cropp) had to steady when HEMINGWAY (L Whelan) crossed to the lead. L Whelan was advised to exercise care.</p> <p>When questioned into the performance of SAN PEDRO, L Cropp said the gelding did not feel comfortable in the good going, was inclined to change legs at various stages throughout the race and failed to respond when placed under pressure. A post-race veterinary examination of SAN PEDRO revealed no abnormalities.</p>	
<b>Race 6</b>	<b>ELDERS LIVESTOCK HANDICAP</b>
<p>GOFONZE (B Lammass) was crowded and lost ground when crowded by runners on either side shifting ground.</p> <p>TAURUS (J Parkes) had to ease off the heels of TEMPLE VIEW (K Smith) near the 1200 when the pace slackened.</p> <p>DON'T DILLY DALLY (L Allpress) also had to steady in this incident.</p> <p>CAUGHT OUT (J Shackleton) raced wide without cover throughout.</p> <p>DON'T DILLY DALLY when attempting a run to the inside of TEMPLE VIEW near the 200m, had to be steadied when TEMPLE VIEW shifted in under pressure.</p> <p>GOFONZE could not be ridden out fully over the final stages when in restricted room.</p>	
<b>Race 7</b>	<b>MANAWATU ITM ANZAC 1600 - Listed</b>
<p>Due to a lack of riders, J Parkes was given permission to ride RUMOUR HAS IT NOW .75kg over the carded weight.</p> <p>HELL YEAH (L Cropp); BOOMING (H Tinsley) and NEVERSAYNEVER (M Hills) were slow to begin.</p> <p>Passing the 1400m LADY CHAPARRAL clipped a heel of CAPONE and blundered when improving into a narrow gap, dislodging V Johnston who sustained an injury to her right ankle. After reviewing video footage and questioning riders concerned the incident was deemed to be accidental and no fault was attributable to any rider.</p> <p>Near the 1000m the riderless LADY CHAPARRAL struck the running rail, blundered badly and severely hampered HELL YEAH. Also affected was JUSTANEXCUSE (K Myers), BOOMING; NICOLE AMY (R Myers) and NEVERSAYNEVER which had to take evasive action.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of SADIST, L Allpress was of the view that the gelding may have been feeling the effects of a Good3 track and may be better suited with easing of the ground.</p>	
<b>Race 8</b>	<b>FEILDING BUSINESS HOUSES HANDICAP</b>
<p>RHODAN (M Hills) and MINT (R Myers) was slow to begin.</p> <p>TANGOLINI (D Bradley) was obliged to race wide throughout.</p> <p>COOL SPUR (H Tinsley) was held up rounding the home turn until passing the 200m.</p> <p>RHODAN was held up rounding the home turn until near the 150m.</p> <p>When questioned on the performance of MINT, R Myers was of the opinion the filly would appreciate any easing in the ground.</p>
