### **RACE COMMENTS:**

Race 1	HB RACING INC SUPPORTING RIDING FOR THE DISABLED
A Forbes replaced M McNab on `ER INDOORS.	
MAKE IT HAPPEN shifted out at the start bumping with ALDONNA	
GRATEFUL shifted out abruptly shortly after leaving the barriers hampering KIPKEINO which	
lost ground. GRATEFUL then commenced to race ungenerously when being steadied	
passing the 1200m and got its head up making the first turn awkwardly.	
CAJUN over-raced in the early and middle stages.	
OLD GOLD was crowded for several strides near the post when inside CAJUN (S Collett)	
which shifted in. S Collett was advised to exercise care when in similar circumstances.	
ER INDOORS was inclined to lay out under pressure throughout the final straight.	
Race 2	WASP NZ LTD 1400
COATOFMANYCOLOURS and ELLIE`O were slow to begin.	
BLACK ASH got its head up for a short distance when being restrained passing the 1100m.	
A post-race veterinary examination of BLACK ASH, which compounded over the final	
stages, revealed the mare to be displaying a poor post recovery. Trainer K Zimmerman	
advised that she would be affecting a gear change on BLACK ASH before its next races. Mrs	

Zimmerman added that BLACK ASH would be better suited to an easing in track conditions. Race 3 THANKS JIMMY CHOUX 2YO MAIDEN

JOE COOL began awkwardly and lost ground.

LITTLE DRAGON GIRL was slow to begin.

PARK PRINCESS (M Hills) began awkwardly and shifted out making contact with DESERT STAR.

Passing the 1000m MIUCCIA was buffeted for several strides when inside GRACE THE POWER which shifted in and away from CATALAN KING. A little further on GRACE WITH POWER had to ease when racing tight to the inside of AURORA LIGHTS which was dictated inwards for several strides by KARMAZYN (J Riddell), which when improving to the lead shifted in marginally. After considering the circumstances and taking into consideration the greenness of several of the runners it was determined that no further acting was necessary other than to remind J Riddell of his obligations when shifting ground.

PARK PRINCESS raced three wide in the middle stages.

## Race 4 TRINITY HILL OPEN SPRINT

SIEM REAP and BASES LOADED were slow to begin.

STARGURU raced wide in the early stages.

Passing the 250m, STARGURU was crowded and had to steady when inside QUEEN OF THE CASTLE which shifted in marginally, and outside PRINCESS KATIE which shifted out and away from DOUBLE BARREL (M Cropp) which was laying out under pressure. Apprentice M Cropp was advised that when in similar circumstances he would be expected to stop riding and straighten his mounts earlier than he did on this occasion.

SIEM REAP lost it's left front plate during the running.

## Race 5 OFF THE TRACK RESTAURANT & LICENSED CAFÉ 1600

BEYOND BELIEF raced wide rounding the first turn. When questioned regarding the run of MACKADOO rider R Myers advised that after travelling well during the running the gelding failed to respond when pressured and was disappointing. A post-race veterinary examination of MACKADOO revealed no obvious abnormalities.

#### Race 6 MORE FM STAYERS

PENUMBRA hung out shortly after the barriers hampering TIGRIS which lost ground.

ALL IN CLOVER was slow away.

BELLE RAINE compounded passing the 800m and was not persevered with over the final stages being distanced at the finish. Trainer W Chittick advised that BELLE RAINE would not be persevered with as a racing proposition.

PENUMBRA had difficulty obtaining clear running throughout the final straight.

When questioned regarding the run of LE NUAGE rider M Cameron could offer no excuses other than that, in his opinion, the mare would be better suited to rain affected going. A post-race veterinary examination of LE NUAGE revealed on obvious abnormalities.

## Race 7 NAPIER RIDING FOR THE DISABLED 2100

P Turner replaced M McNab on THE DIAMOND DUKE.

SPEEDUP was slow to begin.

METTERNICH raced three wide without cover until passing 1000m.

ENCOSTA LARROCHA was held up rounding the final turn and only obtained clear running passing the 200m.

REBEL'S RANSOM was held up rounding the turn and the early part of the final straight.

DEFIANT was held up for several strides near the 300m when awkwardly placed on the heels of the tiring METTERNICH.

When questioned regarding the improved performance of LANGDOM Trainer K Zimmerman contributed the improvement to racing over a longer distance.

#### Race 8 LAND ROVER 1400

L Whelan replaced M McNab on JAKOB GAMBINO.

HAN SOLO was slow to begin.

JERRICO over-raced in the early stages.

Passing the 1300m RUN TO THE BANK had to be steadied when inside VIRGINIA WADE (R Myers) which shifted in when not fully clear. Apprentice R .Myers was issued with a warning.

RUN TO THE BANK was inclined to over-race in the middle stages.

PASSILENTE was held up rounding the home turn and only obtained clear running inside the final 150m.

HAN SOLO gave ground rapidly passing the 500m and was no preserved with over the concluding stages. A subsequent veterinary examination revealed the gelding to have sustained an injury to the right front tendon. Co-Trainer D Olson was advised that a veterinary clearance would be required prior to HAN SOLO next racing.
