RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1 GALLAGHER MAIDEN 2200M

BOLD MARINER (K Smith) was slow to begin.

SHANGHAI SLOW (R Myers) shifted out on jumping, tightening JOSEPHINE (E Lloyd) which made contact with NOW WERETALKIN' (A Morgan).

Passing the 2000 metres EVASIVE TRACY (D Walker) shifted in slightly crowding MR IDEAL (K Collins). MR IDEAL then lay out making contact with EVASIVE TRACY which was forced onto the hindquarters of SHANGHI SLOW which in turn made contact with JOSEPHINE which was unbalanced and became awkwardly placed inside the heels of JUST LIKE NO OTHER (L Allpress). As a result of this incident EVASIVE TRACY had to be steadied and lost ground.

MR IDEAL and NOW WERETALKIN' both over-raced for a distance when the pace eased near the 1500 metres with MR IDEAL having to be steadied when awkwardly placed on the heels of JOSEPHINE.

JUST LIKE NO OTHER raced keenly in the lead in the middle stages.

NOW WERETALKIN' lay in under pressure in the final straight.

A post-race veterinary examination of NOW WERETALKIN' found the gelding to be lame in the right hind leg. Trainer J Litt was advised that a veterinary certificate of fitness would be required prior to NOW WERETALKIN' racing next and indicated that the gelding was now likely to be spelled.

Race 2 ECOLAB MAIDEN 3YO 1200M

SUCH A SNEEK (J Parkes) and ALBAKIRKEE (L Whelan) were slow to begin.

SUCH A SNEEK made contact with the running rail and blundered passing the 400 metres.

EPICENTRE (D Bradley) lay out rounding the final turn near the 350 metres making contact with LIGHTNING LUCY (M Cameron).

Race 3 NRM MAIDEN 1400M

The start was delayed by 2 minutes after RAMPANTEXCUSE (S Collett) proved difficult to load. Trainer J Litt was advised that a warning had been placed against RAMPANTEXCUSE with respect to its barrier manners.

DONTUJUSTLUVIT (D Bradley) raced ungenerously in the early stages being inclined to get its head up.

HOLY SMOKE (J Riddell) raced greenly throughout. Rider J Riddell advised that, in his opinion, the gelding would benefit from the experience with today being its race-day debut.

When questioned regarding the improved performance of RAMPANTEXCUSE Trainer J Litt advised that the gelding was having its first run from his stable and to his knowledge had previously been a poor beginner. Mr Litt further advised that the gelding had jumped away well today and had been able to go forward, with the blinkers also having been removed for today's race.

A post-race veterinary examination of PAY DIRT (B Lammas) which raced disappointingly did not reveal any abnormalities. Rider B Lammas was of the opinion that PAY DIRT would benefit from some easing of the ground and would also now be better suited over more distance.

Race 4 RD1 LIVESTOCK MAIDEN 1650M

NIAMH (S Doyle) was slow to begin.

A'GUIN ACE (K Smith) was held up rounding the final turn.

Race 5 BAYER MAIDEN 1650M

JULIANGRAY (S Collett) and BANTENEIGHTY (T Russell) were slow to begin.

SIVOCCI (J Parkes) began awkwardly and was then further hampered when crowded, losing ground.

Going in to the first turn near the 1500 metres LIEUTENANT LINCOLN (J Riddell) was steadied when racing in restricted room.

JULIANGRAY raced three-wide without cover throughout and was a beaten runner prior to entering the final straight. Rider S Collett advised that the gelding had been making abnormal breathing noises. A post-race veterinary examination found JULIANGRAY to be exhibiting a slow respiratory recovery rate. Trainer J Litt confirmed that the gelding was now to have a wind operation.

Race 6 RD1 FARMCOVER/CROMBIE & LOCKWOOD 1650M

BURRA BOY (L Allpress) and RHODAN (J Riddell) were slow away.

LOST WORLD (M Cameron) raced ungenerously in the middle stages.

POETIC LICENCE (K Myers) had difficulty obtaining clear running in the final straight.

Race 7 RD1 WAVERLEY 1200M

SOU'EAST (D Walker) which was slow away was then reluctant to hit out in the early stages, losing contact with the remainder of the field and taking no effective part in the race. Trainer G Nicholson was advised that SOU'EAST is required to trial on multiple occasions to the satisfaction of a Stipendiary Stewards prior to starting in a race again.

PERFECTBLESSING (L Allpress) and DASHING DOTTIE (M Hills) were both slow away.

MARAIN (S Collett) raced three wide without cover throughout.

SPOT THE DOT (A Taylor) had to be steadied off the heels of FLECHES D'AMOUR (D Bradley) over the concluding stages when well back.
