LUCKY LOLA (J Shackleton) was slow to begin.

K Myers (THE LAST AL) was reminded of her obligations when shifting ground after she allowed her mount to shift in near the winning post on the first occasion resulting in TINKER BELLE (L Allpress) having to steady for a short distance. LUCKY LOLA which was racing keenly had to be shifted wider on the track to avoid the heels of TINKER BELLE (L Allpress) passing the 1600 metres.

THE FOX (S Phelan) slipped on landing over the first fence but recovered quickly.

SIR HEELAN (S Doyle) ran the third fence down badly and then raced keenly in the early stages.

ZAGATA dipped on landing at the fence near the 600 metres on the first occasion.

LORD CUSTOM hit the wing of the fence near the 900 metres.

SOLID STEAL dipped on landing at the second last fence losing momentum as a result.

ZAGATA dipped on landing at the second last fence.

LORD HEELAN and SAHARA SUNSET (C Singer) were eased out of the contest prior to the second last fence when well beaten.

A post-race veterinary inspection of the winner LORD CUSTOM which was dismounted and walked back to the enclosure, revealed the gelding to have sustained a tendon injury to the near hind hock.

Race 7 SPEIGHT'S ALE HOUSE HANDICAP

SIR FERRARI (D Walsh) was slow to begin and then raced very wide throughout in search of better footing. GOLD WEDDING (R Hannam) shifted out abruptly on jumping away and lost ground.

AWAHURI (D Walker) raced keenly in the early stages.

Passing the 800 JUSTAHULA (E Lloyd) had to steady momentarily when ANOTHERCHANCETAKEN (B Grylls) shifted in slightly.

ANOTHERCHANCETAKEN shifted in under pressure passing the 250 metres momentarily inconveniencing REASONS UNKNOWN (K Myers).

Race 8 HOTEL COACHMAN HANDICAP

SOUTH ROAD (J Riddell) was buffeted between runners at the start, losing ground.

BLAKMANDU (B Lammas) was slow to begin.

LASSWADE (K Smith) was held up early in the home straight and then bumped with MASTER MICHAEL (L Allpress) when attempting a narrow run near the 350 metres. LASSWADE then had to be straightened when shifting in over the final stages.

When questioned on the performance of DISDAIN which disappointed, R Myers said the mare did not handle the track conditions.

When questioned on the performance of GIJIMA which disappointed, K Myers could offer no excuses.
