## RACE COMMENTS:

<b>Race 1</b>	<b>SHOWCASE JEWELLERS 1150</b>
<p>Due to an administrative error apprentice Bridget Grylls had been listed in many publications as the rider for <b>DYNAMITE GIRL</b> when this was in fact Craig Grylls.</p> <p><b>WATTLE BAY</b> (M Sweeney) was slow to begin and then was further hampered when <b>WAIPIPI LAD</b> (L Satherley) shifted out. <b>EDWARD THE EIGHTH</b> (S Spratt) and <b>KILLA QUESTION</b> (R Hutchings) both raced wide throughout.</p> <p><b>WAIPIPI LAD</b> was held up behind the weakening <b>DYNAMITE GIRL</b> (C Grylls) from the 400 metres until the 200 metres.</p> <p><b>WATTLE BAY</b> lay in under pressure in the final straight making contact with <b>SIR ELMO</b> (M Wenn) on two occasions over the concluding stages.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of <b>KILLA QUESTION</b> rider R Hutchings advised that the colt had been obliged to race four wide from its outside barrier draw with the effort telling.</p> <p>C Grylls (<b>DYNAMITE GIRL</b>) advised that after leading on a strong pace the filly had been unable to quicken in the existing track conditions once placed under pressure.</p> <p><b>SIR ELMO</b> lost the right hind plate during the running.</p>	
<b>Race 2</b>	<b>MARSHALLS PHARMACY 1580</b>
<p><b>POCKET OF ACES</b> (T Thornton) jumped away awkwardly making contact with <b>AYMON</b> (J Collett). <b>POCKET OF ACES</b> and <b>AYMOND</b> were then both further crowded when <b>ST CHALAN</b> (P Turner) lay out away from <b>RAIVAC</b> (M Wenn). Also hampered was <b>DEPUTAINE</b> (R Norvall).</p> <p><b>ZALIV</b> (C Grylls) jumped away awkwardly and then lost ground when <b>SIRREVIE</b> (B R Jones) shifted in.</p> <p><b>ZALIV</b> became unbalanced when attempting to jump the crossing shortly after the start.</p> <p><b>C'MON</b> (S Spratt) raced wide throughout.</p> <p>Approaching the 1200 metres <b>DR BACHELOR</b> (M Sweeney) raced ungenerously when being restrained and shifted in with <b>SIRREVIE</b> then becoming awkwardly placed on that runner's heels and shifting in hampering <b>FALKLANDS</b> (R Hutchings) which lost ground. Contributing to the incident was some outward movement from <b>ST CHALAN</b>.</p> <p>The saddle shifted forward on <b>ARCHETTO</b> (J Oliver) near the 800 metres when that runner was racing keenly.</p>	

<b>Race 3</b>	<b>WINDSOR PARK STALLIONS 1400</b>
<p><b>RAKAUNUI</b> (C Grylls) was buffeted leaving the barriers between <b>WAIMANU ROAD</b> (L Satherley) and <b>ANDRE JOUBERT</b> (M Sweeney) which both shifted ground.</p> <p><b>JUST GORDON</b> (J Collett) began awkwardly and was further hampered when <b>LA TOURNEAU</b> (M Cameron) lay in.</p> <p><b>LET'S BE A STAR</b> (R Hutchings) began awkwardly and was then crowded between runners.</p> <p><b>ROMARIO</b> (T Thornton) got its head up when being steadied off the heels of <b>LA TOURNEAU</b> near the 1100 metres and continued to over-race for a distance.</p> <p><b>HUG A GINGA</b> (R Norvall) had to be steadied off heels near the 600 metres.</p> <p>Also near the 600 metres <b>LET'S BE A STAR</b> had to be steadied when becoming awkwardly placed inside the heels of <b>PROPOSED</b> (N Collett) after being taken out slightly by <b>MONKEY ROCK</b> (M Coleman).</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of <b>POGUE</b> rider S Spratt advised that the gelding had never travelled comfortably in the running.</p> <p>R Hutchings (<b>LET'S BE A STAR</b>) advised that the filly had received a chequered run, but had failed to respond once placed under pressure near the 500 metres being quickly beaten.</p> <p>Post-race veterinary examinations of <b>POGUE</b> and <b>LET'S BE A STAR</b> did not reveal any abnormalities.</p> <p>D Medcalfe the trainer of <b>PAPER LACE</b> (M Wenn) reported that the mare had got its tongue over the bit and he would be looking to apply a tongue-tie for its next start.</p>	
<b>Race 4</b>	<b>VE VETERINARY SERVICES 1150</b>
<p><b>RUSTY DEVIL</b> (R Norvall) and <b>TRAPICHE</b> (N Harris) were both a shade slow to begin.</p> <p><b>BACK IN BLACK</b> (C Lammas) was crowded shortly after jumping away.</p> <p><b>ONE NITE STAND</b> (J Whiteside) had to be steadied off the heels of <b>CRACKER</b> (S Spratt) near the 900 metres when <b>CRACKER</b> shifted in and away from <b>HEYDENTAL TOURIST</b> (A Taylor) which was taken in slightly by <b>DANROSE</b> (S Shirahama). S Shirahama was advised to exercise more care.</p> <p><b>SMOULDER</b> (J Collett) was briefly crowded between <b>TRAPICHE</b> and <b>RUSTY DEVIL</b> near the 400 metres.</p> <p><b>DANROSE</b> hung out around the final turn.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of <b>SMOULDER</b> rider J Collett advised that the mare had found today's track conditions too testing in its first run back from a let-up.</p> <p><b>DANROSE</b> returned to the enclosure with blood present in both nostrils. A veterinary examination found this to be due to lacerations in both nostrils.</p>	
<b>Race 5</b>	<b>CAL ISUZU 2000</b>
<p><b>SIR AMRON</b> (J Jago) was slow to begin.</p> <p><b>DIVINE MISS EM</b> (R Hutchings) and <b>ALL PENT UP</b> (T Thornton) came together leaving the barrier.</p> <p><b>SIR AMRON</b> raced ungenerously getting its heads up approaching the winning post on the first occasion.</p> <p><b>APACHE SKY</b> (B R Jones) over-raced in the early and middle stages.</p> <p>P Taylor (<b>GOLD MESSAGE</b>) dropped his whip near the 250 metres.</p> <p>J Jago (<b>SIR AMRON</b>) droppd his whip near the 80 metres.</p> <p>When questioned regarding his change in riding style over the concluding stages J Jago advised that he had become unbalanced after having his whip knocked out of his hand by the whip of R Hutchings (<b>DIVINE MISS EM</b>). J Jago's explanation was noted on this occasion and he was reminded of his obligation to ride his mounts out fully to the finish whenever circumstances permit.</p> <p><b>VALLEY DIAMOND</b> (J Collett) lost the right front plate during the running.</p>	
<b>Race 6</b>	<b>JOHN F GRYLLS MEMORIAL CLASSIC</b>
<p><b>STAGEHAND</b> (C Grylls) was slow to begin and then was further hampered when <b>COTTONWOOD SKY</b> (T Thornton) shifted out when jumping away.</p> <p><b>THE MUFFIN MAN</b> (T Barnabas) shifted out on jumping away and made contact with <b>LITTLE ALFIE BROWN</b> (L Satherley) which shifted out crowding <b>SAND JEWELL</b> (S Shirahama) and <b>ZLATO</b> (M Cameron) which both had to steady.</p> <p><b>FLAVOUR FLAV</b> (A Collett) had to be steadied when awkwardly placed inside the heels of <b>MONI NUI</b> (R Norvall) near the 1700 metres.</p> <p><b>THE MUFFIN MAN</b> shifted out near the 900 metres inconveniencing <b>MONI NUI</b>. T Barnabas was advised to exercise more care.</p>	
<b>Race 7</b>	<b>FREIGHT LINES TE AWAMUTU CUP</b>
<p><b>TE TORO LASS</b> (M Sweeney) shifted in on jumping away making firm contact with <b>ATOM CAT</b> (M Coleman) which lost ground.</p> <p><b>ART BEAT</b> (N Harris) was slow to begin.</p> <p><b>ENYAAR</b> (M Wenn) was held up behind the weakening <b>DANCING CHIEF</b> (P Taylor) approaching the 400 metres.</p> <p><b>DANCING CHIEF</b> continued to give ground finishing a distant last. A post-race veterinary examination of <b>DANCING</b></p>	

**CHIEF** found the gelding to have a slow rate of recovery and an erratic heart rate. Trainer G Graham was advised that a veterinary certificate of fitness would be required prior to **DANCING CHIEF** racing next.

**ART BEAT** lay in under pressure over the concluding stages. N Harris was reminded of his obligation to ride his mounts out fully to the finish whenever circumstances permit.

**Race 8**

**THE GREYNA HOTEL @ TAIHAPÉ 1580**

**ALFONZE** (S Spratt) had to be steadied to avoid the heels of **CATCHITIFYOUCAN** (R Hutchings) which shifted in passing the 1200 metres. R Hutchings was issued with a warning.

**LETMEBY** (M Coleman) was briefly crowded when racing to the inside of **DE'COLLETAGE** (J Jago) near the 700 metres dropping back on to **BOY** (S Shirahama) which was hampered. Also inconvenienced was **DAN'S BEST** (R Norvall).

**LUNAR ECLIPSE** (M Sweeney) lay in under pressure in the final straight.

**GURUS SPIRIT** (P Turner) shifted out under pressure inconveniencing **BOY** near the 150 metres. P Turner was advised to exercise more care.

**CATCHITIFYOUCAN** returned to the enclosure with blood present in one nostril. An endoscopic examination of the mare found **CATCHITIFYOUCAN** not to be a bleeder.
