#### **RACE COMMENTS:**

Race 1	<ul> <li>HOUNDSCRY was slow in the early stages.</li> <li>ONE HIP CHICK got its head up and made the turn awkwardly.</li> <li>BLACKBERRY NIP hung out under pressure throughout the final straight making contact with A BOB SHORT on several occasions.</li> <li>R Hannam the rider of A BOB SHORT lost his whip passing the 100 metres.</li> <li>Following the event R Hannam the rider of A BOB SHORT lodged a protest against the winner BLACKBERRY NIP alleging interference over the final 250 metres. After consideration the Judicial Committee dismissed the protest.</li> </ul>
Race 2	ITSABOUTIME lay out shortly after leaving the barriers crowding TREAT which had to steady. TSINGANA was inclined to lay out over the final 300 metres and had to be continually straightened. When questioned regarding the run of ITSABOUTIME rider L Allpress could

	offer no excuses other than in her opinion the mare would benefit from the outing.
Race 3	JAYAR which was fractious in the barriers then began awkwardly losing several lengths. BETTYS BOY dipped shortly after leaving the barriers however recovered quickly. MARSHALL DILLON was slow to begin. SHORT BLACK commenced to fiercely in the lead over the early stages and was allowed to run freely passing the 1400 metres. OUR ALCHEMIST was held up rounding the turn and early part of the final straight, and when in clear running shifted out dictating ROSSENDALE ROAD wider. When questioned regarding the run of NOELINE, rider L Allpress could offer no excuses other than that in her opinion the mare was not entirely suited to the heavy track. JAYAR was inclined to over race in the middle stages and at the 1300 metres
	had to be restrained off heels for a distance.
Race 4	<ul> <li>KEEP AHEAD and WINNIPEG were slow to begin</li> <li>TONNERRE shifted out on jumping crowding HESALAN .</li> <li>Passing the 1800 metres ALPINE PEARL had to steady when inside</li> <li>MOONLIGHTING (C Johnson) which shifted in when not clear. C Johnson was issued with a warning.</li> <li>Shortly after straightening CATALEA was crowded for some distance when inside ALPINE PEARL (M Cameron) which shifted in under hard riding . M</li> <li>Cameron was issued with a warning and advised that when in similar circumstances he would be expected to stop riding and straighten his mounts earlier than he did on this occasion.</li> <li>BENJY HOOLA had difficulty in obtaining clear running in the early part of the final straight.</li> <li>When questioned regarding the running of BELINUS rider R Hannam could offer no excuses.</li> </ul>
Race 5	<ul> <li>WINNING GENES raced keenly in the early and middle stages and near the 1200 metres had to be restrained off heels for some distance.</li> <li>SILK N SATIN lay in approaching the turn near the 600 metres which resulted in MISTER DEEJAY being crowded for a short distance.</li> <li>LIMBERLOST was held up passing the 500 metres until near the 300 metres.</li> <li>EKSTRA SPECIAL shifted in abruptly under pressure near the 100 metres and had to be straightened.</li> <li>LIMBERLOST and EKSTRA SPECIAL came together and bumped near the post when both runners shifted ground, this resulting in C Johnson being unable to apply the whip over the final stages.</li> </ul>
Race 6	CISKAY, MEDIEVAL and DENISES TOY BOY were all slow to begin. CHAR KAYLA raced fiercely in the early stages. GALLIANO got its head up when being steadied approaching the first turn. CISKAY was held up passing the 500 metres until near the 300 metres. CISKAY was further held up momentarily passing the 200 metres when attempting a run between WHY WAIT and EMM GEE.

	<ul> <li>HAILES ABBEY dislodged rider C Spittles on pulling up. C Spittles was uninjured.</li> <li>When questioned regarding the run of DIRTY LIL SECRET apprentice KC Walters advised that the mare had been outpaced throughout.</li> <li>When questioned regarding the run of REUBEN apprentice B Grylls advised the gelding had not been entirely suited to the heavy going.</li> </ul>
Race 7	FONEELEVEN commenced the race fiercely shortly after leaving the barriers and near the 1200 metres when being restrained off heels shifted out and bumped with NIGHTLIFE. FONEELEVEN was held up for a short distance passing the 600 metres.
	R Hannam the rider of FAALTLESS advised that the gelding had been breathing abnormally throughout the event. A subsequent veterinary examination of FAALTLESS revealed excessive repertory noise. Connections were advised that prior to next racing a veterinary clearance, including a satisfactory endoscopic examination, would be required.
Race 8	<ul> <li>J Morris became unwell prior to the event and was unable to fulfil her obligation on SARTORIAL. Due to there being no senior rider available Apprentice C Lunn was engaged for SARTORIAL.</li> <li>SUMMERS PRIDE commenced to over race shortly after leaving the barriers and near the 1200 metres, when being restrained, got its head up and raced ungenerously for a short distance.</li> <li>Passing the 500 metres SUMMERS PRIDE when awkwardly placed on the heels</li> </ul>
	of OUR BELLA ROSE shifted out to improve and in doing so dictated RAPID KASH wider on the track. L Callaway was issued with a warning. CINNAMON lay out under pressure in the final straight.
	TOTAL CONFUSION returned to the enclosure showing lameness. A subsequent veterinary examination revealed the mare to be lame in right hind. Trainer D Green was advised that a veterinary clearance was required prior to TOTAL
	CONFUSION next racing.
