After hearing submissions the JCA upheld the protest with final placings now being $1^{\text {st }}-6$ RADINKA, $2^{\text {nd }}-7$ LATIN RULE, 3rd -3 SWEET HABIT and $4^{\text {th }}-2$ SEEKING REDEMPTION (S Collett). L Satherley was issued with a warning and advised she must make a greater attempt to straighten her mounts when shifting ground.
When questioned regarding the performance of C'MON S Spratt advised Stewards that the gelding had failed to handle today's existing track conditions. Trainer N Robinson was asked to report to Stewards if anything should become apparent in days subsequent.
