RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1 94	4.4 THE SOUND 800M			
Approaching the 400 metres FRANCES was checked when racing to the inside of LUCKY FEATHER and TERSE. After				
questioning riders it was established that LUCKY FEATHER shifted in and away from TERSE which was on an inward				
movement which placed pressure on FRANCES.				
A short distance further THE ALCIPPE shifted out when racing greenly and forced DANCER'S TALE across the heels of				
PRECIOUS SOPHIA which resulted in tightening to PRECIOUS SOPHIA and DANCER'S TALE.				
MIDNIGHT REIGN ran wide on the corner.				
TERSE was inclined to lug in rounding the turn and had to be continuously straightened.				
LUCKY FEATHER had to steady off heels near the 350 metres when held up for a short distance.				
PRECIOUS SOPHIA raced greenly in the home straight.				
FRANCES lay out under pressure in the home straight.				
Over the final stages DANCER'S TALE shifted in abruptly and bumped PRECIOUS SOPHIA near the post.				
Race 2 W	VANGANUI STEELFORMERS 1200M			
SIR COSWORTH underwent and passed a veterinary inspection behind the barrier after receiving a kick.				
Going in to the first bend PRINCESS LINCOLN was checked between TAURUS which was on an inward movement and				
CONRWIN which was racing to its inside. After questioning riders and viewing video footage it was established that				
COASTAL MIST which was racing keenly to the inside of CONRWIN failed to make the bend and shifted out dictating				
CONRWIN outwards in to the line of PRINCESS LINCOLN. PRINCESS LINCOLN then commenced to over-race rounding the				
turn and shifted out near the 600m forcing DI'S BOY over extra ground.				
A post-race veterinary examination of COASTAL MIST revealed a cut to the right nostril.				
A post-race veterinary examination of PRINCESS LINCOLN failed to reveal any abnormality.				
K Myers reported that PRINCESS LINCOLN may be better suited to a more rain-affected track.				
The track was upgraded to Slow 9 following the running of this race.				
Race 3 C	ORO ANGEL SYNDICATE 1340M			

FINE SILVER was slow away. MI COMPANERO was tightened at the start when there was movement from runners either side. SOOGNILLANA and WEBBY bumped at the start. RIVER MOY shifted out on jumping away and hampered MR KEENINSKY which lost ground. Also affected was D'CHAPARRAL. MI COMPANERO had to improve wide rounding the turn. Race 4 WANGANUI CHRONICLE 1600M TEMPLE VIEW was slow away. FIGURE AGAIN shifted out under pressure and momentarily hampered BRAGATO near the 200 metres. When questioned in to the run of SHAMTAARI which disappointed finishing last, Rider R Hannam was of the opinion the mare may be better suited to a more rain-affected track. TUI 'BREWING THE LEGENDS SINCE 1889' 2040M Race 5 L Rose advised that she was unable to claim her full 4kg allowance on SEA EAGLE. L Rose was issued with a warning. SEA EAGLE began awkwardly and got back. Apprentice Rider L Rose was unable to restrain the mare which made a sharp forward move leaving the straight on the first occasion. SEA EAGLE raced wide throughout. Near the wining post on the first occasion NGARIO and PALM ISLAND bumped for several strides after WERIO shifted in. P Turner the rider of WERIO was advised to exercise care when in similar circumstances. FORDELL O'LEARY FILLIES STAKES 1200M Race 6 DECORAH shifted in abruptly on jumping away. HOLLYWOOD ANGEL was slow away and then was further hampered when LACROIX shifted out. RAY'S GIRL began awkwardly losing ground. COMICAL LASS had to steady off the heels of SNOW LINE near the 800 metres when racing keenly. D Bradley the rider of KISSES reported that the filly hung throughout and near the 600 metres rolled in to the line of LACROIX who had to steady and went back on to HAZEL which was hampered for a short distance. HAZEL and BELLA'S DELIGHT bumped near the 400 metres. When questioned in to the run of HOLLYWOOD ANGEL rider M McNab said the filly was lost for speed over the early stages despite being ridden with vigour, but finished on well over the final stages. Following a downpour the track conditions were downgraded back to Heavy 10 after consultation with riders. **IDEAL ELECTRICAL SUPPLIERS 1200M** Race 7 DAIELLO reared at the start and lost ground. STARGURU shifted in on jumping away and tightened GOLDSCHATZ. ALDERBARAN STAR and FRITZY BOY bumped prior to entering the home straight and again near the 200 metres when FRITZY BOY shifted out under pressure. OUR WHITE KNIGHT when running on over the final stages, had to be angled outwards passing the 100 metres to continue to improve. D Bradley the rider of DAIELLO could offer no excuse for the gelding's performance. A Calder reported that STARGURU was not entirely suited to the Heavy 10 track. Race 8 **HS DYKE WANGANUI GUINEAS 1340M** TALK THE TORQUE was crowded at the start when WAIPIPI LAD shifted out. BATMAN raced wide throughout. Rider M Cameron advised Stewards that after racing keenly in the early stages WARHORSE could not quicken in the Heavy 10 track over the final stages. MOVE FASTER and BATMAN shifted ground under pressure over the final stages. **'THANO FIRST CROP SET TO EXCITE' 1600M** Race 9 MADANSKE was tightened at the start and got back and then was obliged to improve its position wide on the track in the run down the back straight. CAMEO LASS shifted out near the 500 metres, and dictated SENNA and BURGER over a little extra ground. When questioned in to the run of AWESOME DESTINY, Rider B Lammas said the gelding pulled up in a normal postrace condition and he had no excuse for its poor run. Trainer H Johnson agreed to monitor its progress over the coming days.
