THE FOX returned to the enclosure with blood present on the near side foreleg as the result of a minor laceration above				
the knee.

GOLD CARD jumped in at the start hampering TESTA SECRET and KARLA BRUNI.

<b>KING VICTOR</b> shifted in under hard riding near the 400 metres dictating <b>KARLA BRUNI</b> inward for a short distance.				
When questioned into the run of <b>TESTA SECRET, H Tinsley</b> advised that the mare was agitated prior to the start which in his				
opinion proved detrimental to its chances. Trainer K Gray advised that he would monitor the progress of the mare and				
report any findings to the Stewards.
