BRIGHT GLO commenced to hang rounding the turn. Rider L Allpress reported that **BRIGHT GLO** raced greenly throughout.

RIO NUGGET had to be steadied near the 800 metres after **FOR PETESAKE** (B Grylls) shifted in when not fully clear. **RIO NUGGET** then shifted out dictating GUS wider on the track. B Grylls was issued with a warning.

STORM HOME was held up near the 200 metres prior to being angled wider to improve.

Race 5JUFFERMANS SURVEYORS RATING 65JENNY'S OKAY and ROYALE VI were slow to begin.

LES SYLPHIDES raced wide throughout.

JENNY'S OKAY had to be steadied for some distance near the 500 metres when inside the heels of ZEINA ROYALE which was improving into a narrow run to the inside of LES SYLPHIDES which lay in making the final turn.

Shortly after entering the home straight **ROYAL VI** had to steady after **D'TOP** (T Russell) shifted in under pressure. T Russell was reminded of his obligations to be clear when shifting ground.

When questioned into the run of **D'TOP** jockey T Russell reported that the gelding was unsuited to the firm track. **ZEINO ROYALE** returned to the enclosure with a laceration to the near hind leg.

Apprentice Jockey B Grylls the rider of **BALLROOM** was spoken to regarding the tactics she adopted on her mount after continuously challenging for the lead in the early and middle stages, when in the Stewards opinion it would have been preferable for her to take a trail behind the leader (**LOLLY** D Bradley) which commenced to over race when taken on. After being shown footage of her ride in the presence of the Riding Master, Apprentice Grylls acknowledged that she had erred on this occasion and was advised that she is expected to exercise better judgement when placed in similar circumstances.

Race 6 NEW WORLD MERRILANDS RATING 85

JUST A SHOUT over raced throughout.

BROMPTON raced keenly in the middle stages.

FIGHTFIREWITHFIRE raced greenly throughout and was inclined to lay in passing the final 200 metres having to be straightened.

J Shackleton (**JUST A SHOUT**) was reminded of her obligation to ride her mount out fully to the finish when circumstances permit, after she appeared to relax her ride near the post. The Stewards were satisfied Miss Shackleton's actions did not compromise her chances.

Race 7 EKRAAR @ LINWOOD PARK RATING 75

OUR KO KO began awkwardly unbalancing the rider for a short distance.

DELECTA DREAMS and ALL IN CLOVER were slow to begin.

SURF PATROL made the turn near the 1400 metres awkwardly when over racing and continued to over race and had to be steadied for some distance in the back straight.

ANNA KARENINA raced wide in the early and middle stages.

NUKUMAI had difficulty obtaining clear running in the early part of the final straight.

ALL IN CLOVER had difficulty obtaining a clear run in the early part of the home straight and had to be taken wide to improve.

When questioned into the run of **OUR KO KO** apprentice rider D Turner advised that in his opinion the mare travelled on the wrong leg rounding the final turn but when balanced in the home straight finished the race off fairly.

Race 8 PUKEKURA MOTOR LODGE RATING 65

AGNOPAK was slow to begin.

JILTED over raced for a short distance in the early stages.

BETTER KEEPER raced keenly in the run through the back straight and had to be continually steadied.

MARAIN was obliged to race wide without cover throughout.

HIS PET commenced to hang out passing the 500 metres and shortly after shifted out on to the heels of **BETTER KEEPER** with **HIS PET** having to be steadied losing ground.
