RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	THE OCEAN PARK 1800
<p>MANGAROA MISS dislodged rider M Du Plessis on the way to the barriers, but was quickly recaptured. The mare underwent a pre-race veterinary examination and was passed fit to race.</p> <p>COLOMBIAN PRAISE (R Hutchings) was slow to begin.</p> <p>VERDASCO (S Collett) was inclined to lay out under pressure in the final straight.</p> <p>LADY LINDAUER (C Lammas) was held up for a short distance early in the final straight.</p> <p>MONTES (V Colgan) was held up for clear running until passing the 200 metres.</p>	
Race 2	TAUPO COSMOPOLITAN CLUB 1000
<p>MAN WITH THE PLAN (T Thornton) was slow away.</p> <p>EVEREADY (V Gatu) jumped inwards making contact with JUST JULIET (N Harris).</p> <p>DEVILLAINE (J Waddell) began awkwardly and shifted out taking JERSEY GIRL (P Turner) outwards crowding JUST JULIET on to the hind quarters of EVEREADY (V Gatu) with JUST JULIET losing ground.</p> <p>AMARLIA (C Lammas) commenced to buck shortly after the start being retired from the race. Trainer K Grant was advised that AMARLIA must barrier trial on multiple occasions until the Stipendiary Stewards are satisfied with its racing manners.</p> <p>MYHINKIN (M Du Plessis) raced wide without cover.</p> <p>EVEREADY lay in under pressure in the final straight.</p> <p>GOING PLACES (S Collett) lay out under pressure early in the final straight.</p> <p>MAN WITH THE PLAN shifted out to obtain clear running near the 100 metres and ducked outwards sharply when struck</p>	

with the whip hampering JERSEY GIRL and GOING PLACES .	
Race 3	TAUPO TIMES 3YO
<p>OUTSIDE CENTRE (C Lammass) jumped away awkwardly losing several lengths.</p> <p>BRAVADO (M Du Plessis) was slow away.</p> <p>LILLY'S RANSOM (N Harris) lay in leaving the barriers making contact with LADY GRANGELEA (M Sweeney).</p> <p>Shortly after jumping away THE SUCCESSOR (M Wenn) lay in making contact with the hind quarters of MILAN MISS (M Cameron).</p> <p>NORTH OF SUNSET (S Collett) was inclined to get its head up when racing keenly in the back straight.</p> <p>TORETTO (D Walsh) raced wide without cover around the bend.</p> <p>BRAVADO was observed to have blood present in one nostril which was found to be due to a small laceration.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the poor performance of MILAN MISS rider M Cameron stated that once placed under pressure the filly had been inclined to lay in and had felt indifferent in its action. A post-race veterinary examination did not reveal any obvious abnormalities with trainer J Bridgman undertaking to report if anything becomes apparent on return to its stable.</p>	
Race 4	BEAMISH BLOODSTOCK 3YO
<p>RIO ROSE (M Coleman) began awkwardly and shifted in hampering JIMATO (S Doyle) which lost ground.</p> <p>SUBRIDEO (M Du Plessis) shifted outwards when leaving the barriers hampering ARCHIE (L Allpress) and CENTAVADA (T Thornton) which were both forced wider on the track.</p> <p>SARTEAGWEN (J Waddell) shifted outwards abruptly near the 900 metres.</p> <p>MASAMBULA (A Forbes) raced three wide without cover throughout.</p> <p>ARCHIE made the bend passing the 800 metres awkwardly.</p> <p>RIO ROSE made the bend awkwardly and ducked outwards near the 600 metres.</p> <p>CATWOMANDU (M Cameron) lay out rounding the final turn.</p> <p>CENTAVADA was held up for a short distance passing the 200 metres, and when shifting out to obtain clear running passing the 150 metres was inclined to lay out. RIO ROSE then shifted away from that runner hampering CATWOMANDU which made contact with the hind quarters of SARTEAGWEN near the 100 metres.</p>	
Race 5	DPA MAIDEN 1200
<p>ZULU BOY was a late scratching at 1.26 pm on veterinary advice as it was running a high temperature.</p> <p>IRISH BEAUTY (J Waddell) was slow to begin.</p> <p>OVER AND ABOVE (D Turner) began awkwardly.</p> <p>PARK PRINCESS (L Allpress) was crowded leaving the barriers between NINETEEN FORTY (V Colgan) and ANOTHER FIND (R Hutchings) which both shifted ground.</p> <p>PARK PRINCESS had to be steadied when racing keenly going into the bend passing the 800 metres.</p> <p>ANOTHER FIND raced wide without cover.</p> <p>ANOTHER FIND ducked in when weakening making contact with SOLSAR (M Wenn) near the 350 metres.</p>	
Race 6	EBBETT TAUPO YOUR MARQUE OF EXCELLENCE 1400
<p>STAR BOUND (M Du Plessis) began awkwardly making contact with SAVOUR THE MOMENT (J Waddell), then shifted back in on to the hind quarters of VANDENNE (L Allpress) which had been taken out by PARNELL PRINCE (P Turner) which began awkwardly.</p> <p>PARNELL PRINCE was steadied when racing in restricted room going into the bend passing the 800 metres.</p> <p>GENDARME (M Cameron) was steadied when awkwardly placed on heels rounding the final turn near the 300 metres.</p>	
Race 7	NOBLE BLOODSTOCK MANAGEMENT 1400
<p>SILVER MINX (M McNab) jumped in the air at the start and was very slow to begin losing a considerable amount of ground. Trainer B Foote will be advised that a warning will be placed against the mare.</p> <p>BRAVE BUCCANEER (M Hills) was slow to begin.</p> <p>KUWAIT (M Du Plessis) shifted out abruptly when jumping away making solid contact with IVENOIDA (R Norvall).</p> <p>IVENOIDA raced three wide without cover.</p> <p>HIDDEN SECRET (C Grylls) raced greenly in the early stages.</p> <p>SILVER MINX hung outwards around the bend.</p> <p>KARAKA JACK (V Colgan) and FIFTYSHADESOFGREY (P Turner) both shifted inwards under pressure in the final straight.</p>	
Race 8	AMBITIOUS DRAGON 1200
<p>MY BLOSSOM LADY (M Du Plessis) dislodged its rider during the preliminaries. After being recaptured MY BLOSSOM LADY underwent a veterinary examination at the start and was passed fit to run.</p> <p>O'RIGHT ZEN (M McNab) and POURI CHIMES (A Forbes) both became fractious in the barriers then began awkwardly losing ground.</p>	

LUNAR ECLIPSE (M Sweeney) shifted out on jumping away making contact with **VIRGINIA WADE** (V Colgan) forcing that runner out on to **SPRING FEVER** (C Grylls).

VIRGINIA WADE and **ARMY GIRL** (M Coleman) both raced wide throughout.

Passing the 200 metres **CLASSCOROC** (J Waddell) had to be firmly restrained when crowded between **VIRGINIA WADE** which shifted out, and contributing was inward movement from **ARMY GIRL**.

SPRING FEVER returned to the enclosure with blood present in both nostrils, and after being examined by the veterinarian was deemed to be a bleeder and as such is subject to the mandatory three month stand down period. The connections indicated that the mare was now likely to be retired.

Passing the 100 metres **ARMY GIRL** shifted in and away from **LUNAR ECLIPSE** making contact with **VIRGINIA WADE**.

Race 9	STARLIGHT CINEMA CENTRE 1800

GO SAKURAMACHI (M McNab) began awkwardly and shifted in badly hampering **FIREKEEPER** (J Waddell) which lost ground.

NOAH JON (C Lammas) lay in when jumping away, then raced wide around the first bend.

OVERTHROW (S Collett) over-raced in the middle stages.

GO SAKURAMACHI which was under heavy pressure prior to entering the final straight was not persevered with over the final 200 metres dropping out to finish a distant last. When questioned M McNab stated that he had to work hard to go forward in the early stages which he believed had told on the mare later in the race, further adding that in his opinion **GO SAKURAMACHI** may be feeling the effects of recent racing. A post-race veterinary examination did not reveal any abnormalities with trainer S Marsh indicating that **GO SAKURAMACHI** was now likely to be spelled.

EH WANDA (T Thornton) was held up behind the weakening **GO SAKURAMACHI** passing the 400 metres.

COMMANDING OAK (L Satherley) had to be checked passing the 250 metres when awkwardly placed on the heels of **MARGARITA TIME** (V Gatu).
