## RACE COMMENTS:

<b>Race 1</b>	<b>REDPATH PACIFIC F&amp;M MAIDEN</b>
<p><b>DANCE IN THE PARK</b> was slow away.</p> <p><b>MION JAY</b> was tightened at the start and settled back after there was movement from runners either side.</p> <p><b>RED RUBY</b> over-raced in the early stages.</p> <p><b>PAIGE ME</b> raced three-wide without cover throughout.</p> <p><b>DRAGON BEAUTY</b> was inclined to lug inwards in the early part of the home straight and was denied a narrow run near the 200 metres so was angled inwards to improve.</p> <p><b>MION JAY</b> was held up momentarily early in the home straight.</p> <p>When questioned into the performance of <b>BEST IN SHOW</b>, <b>M Dravitzki</b> reported that the filly travelled well in the running but when placed under pressure turning for home, failed to respond. A post-race veterinary inspection of the filly revealed a slower than expected recovery rate.</p>	
<b>Race 2</b>	<b>SILVESTER / CLARK HANDICAP</b>
<b>EDENSONG</b> fell in the birdcage and underwent a veterinary examination at the barrier before being declared fit to race.	

**STORMY LASS** was held up near the 100 metres  
**H Tinsley** admitted a charge of careless riding under Rule 638 (1) (d) in that he allowed his mount **MANU** to shift in over the final stages dictating **DONT GLOAT** inwards causing crowding to **STORMY LASS, EDENSONG and SHARMACK**. After considering all relevant submissions, the JCA imposed a suspension of his jockey's license from the close of racing on Saturday 22 December until the close of racing on Friday 28 December 2012. (3 days)  
**D Walsh** reported that **LA SOMMELIERE** hung out throughout the race proving a difficult ride.

<b>Race 3</b>	<b>TRUBSHOE ROOFING MAIDEN</b>
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**WOLVERHAMPTON** was slow away.  
Nearing the home turn, **THE BOUNCER** was checked when racing adjacent to the rail. When questioned, C Grylls said his mount raced greenly throughout and over-reacted when pressured from the outside.  
**THE NANCHO EXPRESS** returned to the enclosure with blood in the nasal area. A subsequent veterinary examination confirmed the gelding to be a bleeder and trainer A Sharrock was advised that the gelding would be subject to the mandatory stand-down period of three months and be subject to a veterinary examination before next racing.  
**OUR GREAT EMPIRE** returned to the enclosure with blood in the nasal area. A subsequent veterinary examination confirmed the gelding to be a bleeder. Trainer J Taylor was advised that the gelding would be subject to the mandatory stand-down period of three months and be subject to a veterinary examination before next racing.

<b>Race 4</b>	<b>MACDOUGALLS HANDICAP</b>
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**JUSTAGEM** became fractious in its gate, was unloaded and cleared to race following a veterinary examination. A veterinary examination of **JUSTAGEM** following the race revealed no abnormalities.  
**SHARKI BRAHMA** began awkwardly.  
**JERRICO** raced keenly throughout.  
**GOLD CARD** raced wide throughout.

<b>Race 5</b>	<b>DUNSTAN FEEDS CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFIER</b>
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**THE BEAUT** was cleared to start after becoming fractious in its barrier stall and undergoing a veterinary examination.  
**OURBLACKISLE** began awkwardly and was further hampered when **LA DANSEUR** shifted in.  
**THE BEAUT** was crowded leaving the barriers when runners either side shifted ground.  
**JOKRAAR** had to be steadied rounding the first bend when awkwardly placed on heels.  
**VRONSKII** raced keenly in the early stages.  
**OURBLACKISLE** improved up onto heels at the crossing near the 1600 metres, shifting out and hampering **VRONSKII**.  
**TIGRIS** was also hampered in this incident.  
When questioned regarding the performance of **CHOCOLATE CAKE**, L Allpress could offer no excuses. A post-race veterinary examination of the mare revealed no abnormalities. Connections were requested to monitor the progress of **CHOCOLATE CAKE** over the coming days and report any finding to the Stewards  
When questioned on the performance of **VRONSKII**, D Walsh advised that the gelding had little left when asked to produce after racing three-wide throughout.

<b>Race 6</b>	<b>MCDONALD'S MANAWATU CUP PRELUDE</b>
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**ZARA DANCER** began awkwardly and then over-raced in the early and middle stages.  
**SANTOS** was disappointed for a run near the 150 metres and shifted in across heels to obtain a run.

<b>Race 7</b>	<b>EZIBUY EULOGY STAKES – Group III</b>
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**R Liefting** the trainer of **RAY'S GIRL** reported that the filly had not travelled well the previous day to the race meeting but had eaten and settled by race morning. A veterinary examination was undertaken which found the filly to be in normal pre-race condition.  
**CALYPSO** and **LA VITESSE** raced wide without cover throughout.  
**MISSTRUM** was held up rounding the home bend.  
**LOVETESSA** had to be angled inwards in order to improve near the 200 metres after being held up briefly.  
**CALYPSO** commenced to give ground rapidly rounding the home turn and shifted out under pressure hampering **HI YO SOO**. A short distance further **CALYPSO** shifted out further when weakening into the line of **HIGH FASHION** which clipped a heel and blundered.  
Over the final stages **RAY'S GIRL**, **LA VITESSE** and **SULTRY ASSASSIN** were tightened after **EMERALD QUEEN** shifted out in search of a run. Rider K Myers was advised to exercise in similar circumstances.  
When questioned on the performance of **MISS ENDERS**, J Parkes was of the opinion that the filly prefers the ground with more give than was the case today.

<b>Race 8</b>	<b>CAPTURE SIGNS HANDICAP</b>
<p><b>VIVA ROMA</b> began awkwardly and made contact with <b>MI PAYDAY</b>.  <b>FAIRWAY WISH</b> shifted out leaving the barriers crowding <b>KAAP KRUIS</b>.  <b>ISLINGTON BAY</b> got its head up when being restrained passing the 1000 metres.  <b>GALAXY STAR</b> raced keenly going into the bend near the 900 metres.  Over the final stages <b>AUNT DAISY</b> and <b>KAPTAIN KIRKUP</b> were tightened when both <b>VIVA ROMA</b> on the outside and <b>ISLINGTON BAY</b> on the inside, shifted ground.  Following consultation with riders the track condition was upgraded to Good 3</p>	
<b>Race 9</b>	<b>THE HAIR COMPANY NOEL EALES HANDICAP</b>
<p><b>PINNAFERO</b> shifted out abruptly leaving the barriers making solid contact with <b>LIV'N PARADISE</b>.  <b>DANCING DEE</b> raced fiercely in the early stages when being restrained.  Near the 200 metres <b>ENUFFISENUFF</b>, when being angled for a run, made contact with <b>BRACKENWOOD</b> causing that runner to become momentarily unbalanced. K Myers was advised to exercise care.  <b>PINNAFERO</b> raced in restricted quarters near the 100 metres.  <b>ENUFFISENUFF</b> returned to the enclosure with blood present in one nostril and after undergoing a veterinary examination, was deemed to be a small laceration.  <b>M Hills</b> advised that <b>LIV'N PARADISE</b> which finished well back would be better suited to an easing of the track surface.</p>	
<b>Race 10</b>	<b>PLUMBING WORLD DOCTOR PROCTER CUP</b>
<p><b>SLOSHED</b> began awkwardly and stumbled shortly after.  <b>GOLDIE CANTRIDE</b> and <b>LORD OF THE STARS</b> were both slow to begin.  <b>THE AFTERSHOCK</b> over-raced in the early stages and had to be angled out to avoid heels passing the 1400.  Near the 1200 <b>AIN'T NO LOLLYGAGGA</b> stumbled when racing keenly and was then steadied off heels near the 1000 when racing keenly.  <b>AIN'T NO LOLLYGAGGA</b> over-reacted when bumping with <b>KITCH</b> near the 350. <b>CITY CHIC</b>, <b>SLOSHED</b> and <b>THE BACHELOR</b> were all forced out over extra ground as a result.  <b>MINNALEO</b> had to be steadied off heels near the 300 metres and a short distance further was checked when <b>LUCKY SPUR</b> (M Dravitzki) shifted out and away from <b>CASINO</b> which was improving to its inside. <b>M Dravitzki</b> was advised to exercise care.  <b>DRIFT</b> was held up for some distance prior to the 250.  D Turner (<b>THE BACHELOR</b>) lost his whip near the 200 metres</p>
