Race 1	NEW WORLD OTAKI 3YO
<p>MADONNA MIA was slow into stride.</p> <p>MELS EVIE raced keenly throughout.</p> <p>K Myers the rider of LADY DE CHINE was reminded of her obligation to ride her mounts out fully to the finish when circumstances permit.</p> <p>Following this event the track was upgraded to Good 3</p>	
Race 2	NEW WORLD PORIRUA MAIDEN
<p>The start was delayed 3 mins due to several runners proving difficult to load.</p> <p>CANYON and PRAISEWORTHY began awkwardly.</p> <p>XIBIT was slow away then over-raced.</p> <p>RACEY RED over-raced in the middle stages and had to be steadied off heels for some distance approaching the 800 metres.</p> <p>GOLDEN JUBILEE and PRECEDE raced keenly in the early and middle stages.</p> <p>RACEY RED was held up for some distance in the home straight prior to gaining clear running near the 100 metres.</p> <p>GOLDEN JUBILEE had to change ground near the 100 metres.</p> <p>Stable representation A Peard requested that KING PANAMERA undergo an endoscopic examination after the race which revealed no abnormalities. Connections advised that the gelding will be re-scoped at a later time with any findings to be reported to Stewards.</p> <p>LAST TO DANCE underwent a post-race veterinary examination which revealed a severe respiratory infection for which a clearance will be required prior to next racing.</p>	

Race 3	NEW WORLD RAILWAY METRO HANDICAP
<p>ROHAISE underwent and passed a veterinary inspection behind the barrier after making contact with a railing in the enclosure.</p> <p>CHERYL MOANA MARIE reared at the start losing considerable ground.</p> <p>RED QUEST over-raced throughout. D Johnson advised Stewards on weighing in she believed RED QUEST felt sore on pulling up. Stewards ordered a veterinary examination of RED QUEST which revealed soreness in the near foreleg for which a veterinary clearance will be required prior to next starting.</p> <p>DALTORAY raced keenly in the early stages.</p> <p>DR PAUL was held up in the early part of the straight before gaining clear running passing the 200 metres.</p> <p>SHARMACK (O Bosson) shifted out over the final stages dictating BAMBOO over extra ground. O Bosson was reminded of his obligations when shifting ground.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of LA VIE ONZE, L Allpress could offer no excuse.</p>	
Race 4	EL CHEAPO CARS WELLINGTON CUP PRELUDE
<p>ASAVANT was slow away.</p> <p>MONACHEE was held up in the early part of the home straight.</p> <p>ASAVANT was inclined to shift out under pressure over the final stages.</p>	
Race 5	NEW WORLD CHURTON PARK MAIDEN
<p>CYNOSURE jumped out at the start bumping with SHINING PEARL.</p> <p>SHINING PEARL and MY PENTIRE came together shortly after the start with MY PENTIRE losing ground and settling back as a result.</p> <p>SHEHAD was slow to begin.</p> <p>D Turner the rider of JUSTASUGGESTION was advised to exercise care after he allowed his mount to shift inwards towards the end of the back straight dictating LUCY LINCOLN inwards onto LUCIE CAN DANSKE which resulted in LITTLE DRAGON GIRL which was racing to the inside of LUCIE CAN DANSKE being tightened.</p> <p>LAJUCA raced three-wide without cover throughout.</p> <p>B Grylls the rider of LINCOLN'S GIRL was issued with a warning after she angled her mount out near the 300 metres and in doing so hampered QUEEN OF THE BLUES.</p> <p>GWYNETHANNE had to shift ground outwards near the 200 metres in order to continue to improve</p> <p>The rider of SUNLOVER L Allpress expressed concern with her mounts action on pulling up. A subsequent veterinary examination revealed no abnormalities.</p>	
Race 6	NEW WORLD WILLIS STREET METRO HANDICAP
<p>MATAATUA and STOPOVER made contact on jumping away.</p> <p>FOOTLOOSE raced three-wide without cover throughout.</p> <p>MATAATUA was eased abruptly near the 900 metres and retired from the event. Rider O Bosson stated that he considered something amiss with the colt's action. A post race veterinary inspection of MATAATUA revealed a significantly elevated heart rate consistent with having fibrillated. Connections were advised that a veterinary clearance including the results of an ECG is required as well as having to trial to the satisfaction of stewards, prior to its next start. DAUFINO was hampered and lost several lengths when unable to avoid the easing MATAATUA.</p> <p>IAMISHWARA was held up in the early part of the home straight.</p> <p>MISS LINCOLN was held up until near the 150 metres.</p> <p>LADY SHANNON was held up rounding the turn and was held up for the majority of the final straight and went to the line without being fully tested.</p>	
Race 7	NEW WORLD WELLINGTON CITY HANDICAP
<p>MINNALEO began awkwardly and was further hampered when SADLERS ROCK shifted out. MINNALEO then commenced to race keenly in the early stages.</p> <p>CITY CHIC raced wide around the first turn.</p> <p>DAL DANTRIX ran wide when racing keenly round the first turn.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the run of BAR KEEPER which gave ground over the final stages, rider J Riddell was of the view the gelding was feeling the effects of the Good 3 track. Trainer L Latta advised that BAR KEEPER would now be spelled.</p> <p>A post-race veterinary examination of NGARIO revealed no abnormalities.</p>
