RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	WAIRARAPA TIMES AGE MAIDEN STAYERS
<p>PESCATORE was a late scratching at the barrier on veterinary advice at 1.09pm being lame in the near side rear leg. Trainer P McKenzie was advised that PESCATORE would need a veterinary clearance before next racing.</p> <p>NO ESCAPE began awkwardly.</p> <p>BOSS JONES was slow to begin.</p> <p>CYNOSURE hung out and ran wide when over-racing passing the winning post on the first occasion losing considerable ground. CYNOSURE then continued to hang out and gave ground passing the 600 metres, finishing a distant last. A post-race veterinary examination of CYNOSURE revealed an elevated heart rate. Trainer G Haigh was advised that CYNOSURE must trial to the satisfaction of the Stewards prior to next racing. Mr Haigh that the mare would now be retired.</p> <p>REVOLUTIONARY was inclined to lay-out in the run through the home straight.</p>	
Race 2	SCOTTY'S MEATS MAIDEN 1000
<p>PIT A PAT was a late scratching on veterinary advice at 1.44pm after refusing to load into the barriers. Trainer K Burne was advised that the filly must barrier trial to the satisfaction of the Stewards before next starting.</p> <p>WEBE JACK was slow to begin and was outpaced throughout the event.</p>	

ELUSIVE LAW got its head up for a short distance passing the 600 metres when being restrained.	
Race 3	HAIGHT ASHBURY HAIRDRESSING 1100
<p>R Hannam replaced B Lammas on MINSTREL FLYER due to a misunderstanding.</p> <p>SILVER SHADOW was slow to begin.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the run of OPTIMISTIC, rider L Allpress was of the opinion that the filly may be better suited to a firmer footing and she was further of the opinion that the filly would benefit from the race day experience.</p> <p>HOT ROD slipped and blundered after the winning post.</p> <p>D Johnson reported that her mount MISS RHYTHMIC had lost its footing rounding the turn.</p>	
Race 4	BULL4U 1400
<p>THE AFTERSHOCK began awkwardly.</p> <p>L Innes (MARANELLO) was reminded of his obligations with regard to his whip use prior to the 200 metres.</p>	
Race 5	FARMAN TURKINGTON WAIRARAPA CUP
JACK'S BOY over-raced in middle stages when the pace steadied.	
Race 6	TUI BREWERIES 1600
<p>Passing the 50 metres SAVARHYS shifted in abruptly bumping with PLATINUM DANCER which in turn shifted in bumping with JAKOB GAMBINO. H Tinsley (SAVARHYS) was reminded of his obligations.</p> <p>L Innes reported that KINGS COURT travelled indifferently throughout and may have pulled up sore. A post-race veterinary examination of KINGS COURT revealed no abnormalities.</p> <p>Apprentice rider A Morgan (AINTREE) was reminded of her obligation to ride her mount out fully to the line after it was observed she relaxed her ride immediately prior to the winning post. However, Stewards were satisfied that the finishing position of AINTREE was not compromised on this occasion.</p>	
Race 7	PIONEER FINANCE WAIRARAPA THOROUGHBRED BREEDERS STAKES - Listed
<p>POETIC LICENCE jumped out abruptly at the start hampering L'AMOUR.</p> <p>OUTBACK GIRL was slow to begin.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the run of POETIC LICENCE which finished well back, rider V Johnston advised the mare travelled only fairly throughout and was of the view it was feeling the effects of recent racing.</p>	
Race 8	THE MARQUIS HOTEL CARTERTON 1300
<p>ALL GINGA was slow to begin.</p> <p>MEO blundered at the start and was then further hampered when TART OF GOLD shifted out abruptly upon leaving the barriers. Also affected in this incident were CORSICANA and SIR DOUGLAS which were buffeted for a short distance.</p> <p>SKUPINA jumped out at the start hampering CANYON which lost ground.</p> <p>SIR DOUGLAS and ALL GINGA were outpaced in the early stages.</p> <p>LITTLE DRUMMER BOY raced four-wide without cover throughout.</p> <p>Te Baker (ALL GINGA) in the presence of his employer Ms R Frost was issued with a warning with respect to the use of his whip on a runner out of contention.</p>
