RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	MARSDEN SHEARING HANDICAP
<p>HOT LIPS began awkwardly and lost ground.</p> <p>DONT GLOAT raced keenly in the early stages.</p> <p>DONT GLOAT shifted out passing the 400 metres and dictated JERRICO and FREDRICK WILLIAM over extra ground. When questioned on the performance of DONT GLOAT , rider J Parkes stated that the gelding had travelled well throughout but failed to finish the race off as expected over the final stages.</p>	
Race 2	THE TANK GUY MAIDEN
<p>QUEEN OF THE BLUES and BAILAR RIOVIDA were slow away.</p> <p>CAPTAIN SHAKESPEARE raced keenly in the early and middle stages.</p> <p>MY PENTIRE returned to the enclosure with blood in the nearside nostril. A subsequent veterinary examination revealed a minor laceration consistent with the mare having struck the starting gate.</p>	
Race 3	ASHHURST INN HANDICAP
<p>WE ARE ROYAL and LE BRUN were slow away.</p> <p>ZA PAK had to be restrained off the heels of SURREAL STORM near the 1000 metres when racing keenly.</p>	

When questioned on the performance of WE ARE ROYAL , rider B Lammas advised that the gelding had travelled well in the running but when pressured failed to finish the race off as expected and was disappointing.	
Race 4	ROWDEN ELECTRICAL SERVICES MAIDEN
<p>EDGE OF GLORY was inclined to over-race when being restrained passing the 1000 metres.</p> <p>NO ENEMY raced keenly in the early and middle stages.</p> <p>NO ENEMY was held up rounding the turn and when taken into clear running passing the 150 metres, lay out for the remainder of the race.</p> <p>EXCEEDING A DREAM was held up rounding the turn and was unable to obtain clear running throughout the final straight.</p> <p>When questioned on the performance of DISCO INFERNO rider B Lammas was of the opinion the mare would be better suited by a longer distance.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of COLD HEARTED, rider D Walsh said the gelding was unable to quicken and maintain its position early in the home straight and only made ground over the latter stages. Rider Walsh added that, in his opinion, COLD HEARTED would be better suited at a longer distance.</p>	
Race 5	COMMERCIAL TAVERN ASHHURST HANDICAP
<p>JUMOKE underwent a veterinary examination on arrival at the course and was found to have suffered a minor laceration to the nostril area.</p> <p>KING KAMADA began awkwardly and settled back.</p> <p>SUPERVISOR hung in passing the winning post on the first occasion crowding ALL IN CLOVER which momentarily made contact with the running rail.</p> <p>VIKING ACE baulked and changed stride at the winning post making contact with the running rail.</p>	
Race 6	MACDONALD FAMILY MAIDEN
<p>OROHET was slow to begin.</p> <p>JOE BONANNO blundered on jumping away but did recover quickly.</p> <p>IN FOR FUN began awkwardly and lost ground.</p> <p>Passing the 1300 metres MASTER THOMAS had to steady when inside BEAUTY APPS which, when improving, shifted in when not clear. M Tanaka was issued with a warning. MASTER THOMAS then, when racing wide, over-raced for some distance.</p> <p>FURIO raced keenly in the early and middle stages.</p> <p>When questioned on the run of IN FOR FUN rider M Hills stated after being slowly and getting back the gelding had been unable to make ground until the latter stages, and then was inclined to lay in when pressured. Rider Hills added that in his opinion IN FOR FUN would benefit from the run.</p>	
Race 7	CARTERS ASHHURST POHANGINA CUP
<p>HELL YEAH was slow away.</p> <p>JUSTANEXCUSE raced keenly in the early and middle stages.</p> <p>KAPTAIN KIRKUP raced wide from the 1000 metres.</p> <p>GOLD CARD was unable to obtain clear running until near the 200 metres.</p> <p>When questioned on the performance of KAPTAIN KIRKUP, rider J Parkes said that after racing wide during the event, the gelding was unable to finish off when pressured.</p>	
Race 8	RICHARD ALGAR LTD HANDICAP
<p>THE BACHELOR was a late scratching at the barrier on veterinary advice at 4.30pm after showing signs of lameness in the right foreleg. Trainer G Vile was advised that a veterinary clearance would be required prior to THE BACHELOR next racing.</p> <p>JAKBLAK raced three-wide without cover throughout.</p> <p>THE BEAUT was held up in the early part of the home straight.</p> <p>EARL OF DONCASTER was inclined to lay in over the final 300 metres and near the 250 metres shifted in abruptly making contact with RIGHT ROYAL ROSE which in turn shifted in making contact with THE BEAUT this resulting in RIGHT ROYAL ROSE and THE BEAUT becoming unbalanced. THE BEAUT in consequence then lay out placing RIGHT ROYAL ROSE in restricted room and buffeting that runner for the remainder of the event.</p> <p>THE BEAUT shifted out near the post bumping with ENZEDDA.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of NO CREDIT, which was eased down over the final stages when well back, B Lammas was of the opinion the gelding felt short in its action. A post-race veterinary examination of NO CREDIT revealed no abnormalities.</p>	
Race 9	ASHHURST ENGINEERING HANDICAP

WHATA DELIGHT began awkwardly and lost ground.

ROCKWEILER ran wide making the first turn. **ROCKWEILER** continued to race erratically throughout. Trainer T Wood was advised that a warning would be placed against **ROCKWEILER** for its racing manners.

MISS CENTREFOLD raced keenly in the early stages and made the turn at the 900 metres awkwardly when being restrained.

R Hannam (SAMSI) was reminded of his obligations when shifting ground after he allowed his mount to shift out on the point of the home turn resulting in crowding to **TAKE OFF**.

Race 10

ASHHURST BUSINESS HOUSES HANDICAP

TIGRIS began awkwardly and lost ground.

GWYNETHANNE shifted out at the start bumping with **WORKINGCLASS** which was taken out into the line of **IAMISHWARA** which was tightened.

DRAGON BEAUTY was slow to begin.

RIPPING over-raced in the middle stages.

SLACK THE DIVER raced wide in the middle stages.

IAMISHWARA raced wide from the 1200 metres.

GWYNETHANNE was held up rounding the final turn and failed to obtain clear running throughout the final straight.

DRAGON BEAUTY was held up in the early part of the home straight and was angled wider on the track in order to obtain clear running.

FOOTLOOSE was unable to find clear running for the majority of the home straight.

When questioned regarding the run of **WORKINGCLASS**, rider **M Hills** could offer no tangible excuse.
