## RACE COMMENTS:

<b>Race 1</b>	<b>TRADERACKS 2YO</b>
B Lammas advised stewards that he had transport difficulties and was unable to fulfill his engagements in Race 1 & 2. <b>QUINTETTE</b> (H Tinsley) jumped awkwardly hampering MISS RHYTHMIC. <b>IRISH STRINGS</b> (D Walsh) bounded as the gates opened. <b>MINSTREL FLYER</b> (J Parkes) raced erratically in the early stages when being restrained behind the leaders. <b>IRISH STRINGS</b> raced three wide without cover throughout. <b>QUINTETTE</b> was inclined to lay inwards in the home straight and could not be ridden out to full advantage.	
<b>Race 2</b>	<b>DHL GLOBAL SPRINT</b>
<b>ROCKWEILLER</b> (R Hannam) was caught three wide early so was taken forward to lead near the 700 metres. <b>TURQUOISE</b> (M Dee) was held up when attempting a marginal run near the 250 metres and could not be extended at any stage and went to the line untested. <b>'ER INDOORS</b> (D Walsh) was held up for some distance in the home straight and could not be ridden out to full advantage. Rider J Parkes reported YOUTOOFAS would appreciate any easing of the existing firm conditions.	

<b>Race 3</b>	<b>HASTINGS, HEART OF HAWKES BAY 2200</b>
<p>A request for a Ruling was placed before the JCA regarding the eligibility of RE DEEL to start after a Stipendiary Steward observed the Trainer administering a liquid substance into the geldings mouth via a syringe in the tie up stall area immediately prior to the horse entering the enclosure. After considering the information placed before them the JCA declared RE DEEL to be a late scratching. Further investigation will follow.</p> <p>When questioned into the run of <b>LASSWADE</b> apprentice T Baker stated the mare raced keenly throughout and finished only fairly in the home straight.</p> <p><b>ADIDAZLER</b> (V Johnston) had to be eased over the final stages when in restricted room when well back.</p>	
<b>Race 4</b>	<b>TUMU ITM METRIC MILE</b>
<p>M McNab advised stewards that he was unable to fulfill his engagements due to injury.</p> <p><b>FORGIVE NO FORGET</b> (R Hannam) began slowly and settled back.</p> <p><b>JERRICO</b> (D Bradley) skied its head and over-raced when being eased into a trailing position entering the back straight.</p> <p><b>CAJUN</b> (J Parkes) raced three wide without cover from the 800 metres to the home straight.</p>	
<b>Race 5</b>	<b>STELLA ARTOIS 1400</b>
<p><b>GOLD MOET</b> (B Lammas) was slow away and settled back.</p> <p><b>WATCH KING</b> (B Hutton) jumped outwards at the start and hampered <b>FRANKIE VAN HATT</b> (V Johnston) which lost ground and got back.</p> <p><b>GOLD MOET</b> over-raced near the 800 metres and was angled out to clear running to avoid the heels of runners ahead.</p> <p><b>LIVE LIFE</b> (C Grylls) raced three wide without cover from the 1000 metres to the 600 metres.</p> <p><b>WATCH KING</b> raced in a reasonably handy position until entering the home the straight but failed to hit out fully over the final stages. When questioned apprentice B Hutton advised stewards <b>WATCH KING</b> hung rounding the turn and was of the opinion there maybe something amiss with the gelding. A post-race veterinary inspection revealed a slight soreness in its left fore.</p> <p>A post-race veterinary inspection of <b>LIVE LIFE</b> failed to reveal any abnormality.</p>	
<b>Race 6</b>	<b>NEW ZEALAND BLOODSTOCK INSURANCE 1400</b>
<p>L Calloway was unable to attend the meeting due to injury and was replaced on <b>ROYAL QUEEN</b> by J Parkes.</p> <p><b>ROYAL QUEEN</b> reared when the gates opened then took no further part in the race. Stewards requested a ruling from the JCA as to whether <b>ROYAL QUEEN</b> received a fair start under Rule 632. After interviewing rider J Parkes, starter G Phillips and viewing video footage of the start, the JCA ruled <b>ROYAL QUEEN</b> did receive a fair start and was declared a runner. Connections were advised that the mare must trial to the steward's satisfaction prior to her next start.</p> <p><b>CAPITAL DIAMOND</b> (D Bradley) jumped our abruptly at the start and dictated <b>OURBACK GIRL</b> ( R Hannam) into the line of <b>ENUFFISENUFF</b> (B Lammas) and <b>DELECTA DREIMS</b> (C Grylls) which both got back.</p> <p><b>DOUBLE O SEVEN</b> (M Sweeney) was slow away.</p> <p><b>DUBHDARA</b> ( M Dravitzki) raced three wide throughout</p> <p><b>OUTBACK GIRL</b> over-raced in the trail rounding the turn and had to be restrained for some distance.</p> <p>When questioned into the run of <b>DELECTA DREIMS</b> rider C Grylls advised that the mare had got a lot further back than anticipated after being tightened at the start and this proved detrimental to its chance of finishing in a higher placing.</p> <p><b>OUTBACK GIRL</b> had to be angled out to improve near the 200 metres.</p>	
<b>Race 7</b>	<b>AGRAFORUM NZ COMCAT 2100</b>
<p>When questioned into the improved performance of the winner <b>WYBAN ANGEL</b> trainer S Gillies advised that he had instructed rider B Lammas to ride the mare forward in a more positive manner than had been the case at its most recent starts and he considered this to be a contributing factor in its improvement.</p> <p>When questioned into the run of <b>C'EST MAGNIQUE</b> rider R Myers was of the opinion her mount was unsuited to the slow early pace and was unable to quicken when the pace increased near the 800 metres.</p>	
<b>Race 8</b>	<b>BRUCE PERRY BLOODSTOCK LOWLAND STAKES</b>
<p>Trainer S Ritchie admitted a breach of Rule 616 (2) in that he presented <b>SET ME FREE</b> in gear that had not been approved (blinkers)</p> <p><b>SWORNTOPERFECTION</b> (V Johnston) began awkwardly and got back.</p> <p><b>JIMATO</b> (R Myers) was caught wide without cover passing the winning post on the first occasion.</p> <p><b>NORTH OF SUNSET</b> (B Lammas) commenced to over-race passing the winning post on the first occasion and when being angled out to avoid heels entering the back straight dictated <b>LUCKY COUNTRY</b> outwards to race four wide until near the 800 metres. When questioned the rider J Parkes considered this a factor in his mount failing to finish on to any extent in the home straight.</p> <p><b>EMERALD QUEEN</b> (J Bullard) was unable to improve his position in the back straight and jostled with <b>FIFTYSHADESOFGREY</b> (C Grylls) near the 800 metres prior to gaining clear running near the 600 metres. When questioned into the run of <b>FIFTYSHADESOFGREY</b> rider C Grylls was of the opinion that the filly may be better suited to any easing of the ground.</p> <p><b>CHANDELIER</b> (M Sweeney) was held up early in the home straight prior to angling out to improve.</p>	

**Race 9****PLATINUM HOMES 1400**

A representative of the stable of Trainer J Bary admitted a breach of Rule 614 (2) in that he presented **MAKEBA** with an incorrect saddle cloth number and was fined \$100.

**AMBITIOUS PRINCE** (H Tinsley) raced keenly in the early and middle stages and was taken wide to avoid heels near the 800 metres.

When questioned into his ride on **SEE THRU** which finished well back rider D Bradley said that the mare over-raced in the run along the back straight and had to be steadied off heels near the 800 metres but failed to respond when placed under pressure near the 400 metres so he did not persevere in the home straight. D Bradley was of the opinion his mount may be feeling the effects of recent racing. A post race veterinary inspection of **SEE THRU** failed to reveal any abnormality.
