RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1 LASER ELECTRICAL 1600

MYMINKCOAT dipped on jumping from the barriers but recovered quickly.

ASHALINI raced keenly in the run down the back straight when in a trailing position behind the leader.

Race 2 SOUTH TARANAKI CLUB 2100

JOKRAAR and DAISY LOUISE were slow to begin.

MR MOR had a tendency to lay in rounding the bend near the 800 metres.

When questioned regarding the run of **FLOAISHA** Jockey D Bradley stated that the mare was a little fresh after not having started for over a month and was unable to let down in the home straight.

Race 3 ELTHAM VETERINARY SERVICES 1400

GLAIZEM jumped out at the start and hampered **BLUE NILE** which was forced onto **CARLOW** which was checked and settled at the rear.

NINE IRON shifted out approximately five horse widths under pressure, in the home straight. A Morgan was shown video footage of her ride and reminded of her obligations when shifting ground.

Race 4 PLACEMAKERS HAWERA MAIDEN 1600

TIZZA SECRET was slow away.

RED SUNSET which was racing keenly in the run along the back straight had to be shifted wide to avoid heels near the 1,000

metres.

FACET raced three wide for a short distance near the 800 metres.

Race 5 PAUL JONES CONSTRUCTION MAIDEN 1200

CHIEF'S HONOUR was slow away and settled back.

TEXAS YELLOW ROSE hung outwards badly in the run around the top bend shifting out several horse widths losing considerable ground and once balanced in the home straight, finished the race off strongly. As this was the second occasion in which the mare has hung and proved erratic, Trainer S Sharrock was advised that **TEXAS YELLOW ROSE** must trial to the satisfaction of Stewards on at least two occasions prior to its next start. S Sharrock stated that the mare would be trialled in blinkers and provided this was successful, would be added to its gear.

Race 6 DR (JACK) GRAY LTD PAINTERS 1200

DESERT STAR jumped outwards and bumped with **OLIVIA MARY** who lost ground and settled back.

SHARMACK hung outwards rounding the turn and proved difficult to ride out in the home straight where it ducked outwards near the 200 metres. Trainer S Sharrock was advised that a warning would be placed against the gelding with regard to its racing manners. Trainer S Sharrock advised that he would monitor the progress of **SHARMACK** over the coming days and report any abnormality.

SAM I AM dropped out rounding the turn and finished the event several lengths last. When questioned jockey S Doyle stated the mare may be feeling the firm track conditions. A post race veterinary inspection failed to reveal any abnormality.

Trainer P Pascoe advised Stewards that **SAM I AM** would be spelled.

LIGHTNING LUCY was held up for several strides on the home turn.

M Dee the rider of **OLIVIA MARY** dropped his whip near the 50 metres.

Race 7 MARK FROST ELECTRICAL LTD MAIDEN 1400

LEATHER N' LACE was tightened and got back at the start.

TACO over raced along the back straight and had to be steadied off heels for several strides near the 1,000 metres.

LEATHER N' LACE hung outwards rounding the turn and lost ground.

When questioned into the run of **TACO** which disappointed jockey M Walker was of the opinion that the mare may be better suited to a more rain affected track and a longer distance.
