### **RACE COMMENTS:**

Race 1CANTERBURY EQUINE CLINIC BENCHMARK 75 (2000m)The start of this race was delayed due to PLEASE RELEASE ME requiring an adjustment to its bridle.MIGHTY RULER raced wide in the initial stages.PARAKETO got its head up passing the 1800 metres and continued to race ungenerously whilst being restrained.PLEASE RELEASE ME raced wide rounding the home turn.Rider J Bullard reported that ISHIPAL hung out for the majority of the race and proved disappointing when placed underpressure. Stable representative M Frith advised it is their intention to drop the gelding back in distance and apply blinkers.Rider C Johnson explained that PRINCE RANSOM raced keenly in the early stages and in his opinion failed to run out thedistance of the race. Trainer M Pitman concurred with C Johnson's comments and advised that the gelding will be sent for abrief spell.

# Race 2THE BULLERITES & PIRATES ISLAND MINI GOLF MAIDEN (1200m)The start of this race was delayed due to KEEP THE QUEST having to be re-saddled.

**TROOPER** jumped awkwardly and lost ground.

MEDIADOR jumped awkwardly, shifted out and bumped HARDEN UP SON.

**ROCKAHOY** jumped awkwardly and shifted out abruptly losing ground. **ROCKAHOY** then raced wide for the majority of the race.

PERFECTION which raced keenly in the middle stages had to be steadied near the 700 metres away from the heels of HARDEN UP SON which shifted out slightly. PERFECTION then and raced wide for the remainder of the race.

NICMAJAC had difficulty obtaining a clear run from shortly after straightening until near the 250 metres.

R Bishop, rider of **PROVEN FACT**, reported he had concerns with the gelding's action on pulling up. A veterinary inspection revealed the gelding to have fractured its right hind fetlock and was subsequently euthanized.

D Bradley, rider of SYKES, reported that the gelding was under pressure throughout and in his opinion would be better suited over more ground.

### PETERSENS JEWELLERS LADIES BRACELET (1000m) Race 3

LICKWISH and SPURS ARE ON were slow to begin.

**ROYALE CRYSTAL** raced keenly in the early stages.

Passing the 300 metres HARPER ROSE raced in restricted room on the outside of NAPATAP which shifted outwards momentarily.

When questioned regarding the performance of ROYALE CRYSTAL, rider R Hannam stated that the gelding travelled keenly in the early and middle stages however weakened when placed under pressure. He added it was the gelding's first start in nearly five months and in his opinion should benefit from the run.

A post race veterinary inspection of **ROYALE CRYSTAL** did not reveal any obvious abnormalities.

### CRT McMILLAN EQUINE FEEDS & YALDHURST HOTEL BENCHMARK 75 (1400m)

**CONFEDERATE** slipped behind on jumping and was then crowded shortly after losing more ground. Consequently **CONFEDERATE** raced further back than anticipated and raced keenly with its head up for some distance.

**PLATINUM DANCER** got its head up on several occasions when racing keenly in the early stages.

**SHE'S ASSERTIVE** was obliged to race wide throughout.

**BALAQ** and **CONFEDERATE** raced wide rounding the home turn.

**ISHIMINE** and **IRISH BAY** bumped on a number of occasions shortly after straightening.

When questioned regarding the poor performance of STANICA STAR, rider R Myers explained that in her opinion the gelding seemed to resent racing in tight quarters towards the tail of the field.

Apprentice R Doherty, rider of **GHOSTINTHEMACHINE**, explained that although the gelding appeared to perform below expectations after its last start win, he was of the opinion the gelding was not comfortable racing in amongst runners and the rise in weight and class all attributed to the gelding's performance.

#### Race 5 YALDHURST WOOLS & NZWTA LTD BENCHMARK 65 (1400m)

WISEGUY was a little slow to begin.

WILLOW PARK jumped awkwardly, shifted inwards and hampered FINE SILVER which in turn crowded SORLEY BOY which lost ground.

FINE LINE had difficulty obtaining clear running just prior to straightening.

**YAZOOM** raced wide rounding the home turn and in the straight.

Approaching the 350 metres HIT THE BIT had to be checked when disappointed for a run behind FINE LINE.

LA MUSIQUE which led for the majority of the race weakened noticeably passing the 300 metres.

Stewards questioned apprentice B Pitman in the presence of her employer Mr M Pitman regarding her tactics between the 600 metres and 400 metres when riding WISEGUY. B Pitman explained that the gelding had been racing on tight turning tracks and she was instructed not go wide rounding the turn and to save as much ground as possible to ensure the gelding finished the race off. Mr Pitman confirmed these were the instructions given. B Pitman said that near the 600 metres she shifted out four deep to follow WAITING, however when WAITING shifted out further passing the 450 metres she elected not to follow. She conceded that thereafter she had difficulty obtaining complete clear running and went to the line without being fully tested. Mr Pitman agreed that in hindsight it would have been a better option to shift out near the 450 metres when the opportunity presented itself, however considering his instructions he understood B Pitman's decision. After considering all the evidence Stewards issued B Pitman with a warning and advised her that in future she must ride in a manner that does not leave her open to query.

A post race veterinary inspection of WISEGUY did not reveal any obvious abnormalities.
