## RACE COMMENTS:

<b>Race 1</b>	<b>WENHAM GRAIN &amp; SEED 3YO MAIDEN</b>
<b>BLAME DE ANGELS</b> was fractious behind the barrier, proving difficult to load. Trainer G Innes was advised a warning had been placed on the barrier manners of <b>BLAME DE ANGELS</b> . <b>HIPPIE</b> shifted in on jumping away bumping with <b>BLAME THE ANGELS</b> . <b>OROHET</b> began awkwardly. <b>KARMAZYN</b> was slow to begin. <b>TINKA TINKA</b> was inclined to over-race in the lead in the early and middle stages. <b>CHEYENNE PRINCESS</b> raced greenly throughout the final straight. <b>PERSIAN DANCER</b> was held up rounding the turn so was taken inward near the 200 metres to obtain clear running. <b>BAY DANCER</b> returned to the enclosure with the off side front plate missing.	
<b>Race 2</b>	<b>POWER FARMING MAIDEN</b>
<b>MY MAGICIAN</b> began awkwardly, losing several lengths. <b>RECESS</b> began awkwardly, losing ground. <b>ARIA PRINCE</b> was obliged to improve its position wide rounding the turn. <b>OUGHT TO BE BAD</b> shifted ground under pressure in the final straight. <b>NO ENEMY</b> shifted ground outwards near the post.	

When questioned regarding the run of <b>TAIPA TIGER</b> , rider R Hannam advised that the gelding had sweated up prior to the start, travelled well in the running but failed to finish the race off as expected and was disappointing. R Hannam had no tangible excuse but was of the opinion that the gelding would improve with the run.	
<b>Race 3</b>	<b>TURKINGTON FORESTRY HANDICAP</b>
<b>MR MOR, HOT LIPS</b> and <b>NO CREDIT</b> all over-raced in the early stages. <b>WILBUR</b> raced three wide without cover round the first turn. <b>KOOL RETURN</b> raced wide throughout. J Riddell had no excuse for the disappointing performance of <b>DESI GIRL</b> which finished well back. A post-race veterinary inspection of <b>DESI GIRL</b> failed to reveal any abnormality. . Trainer J Bary undertook to monitor the mare's progress and report any anomaly to the stewards, should this become apparent.	
<b>Race 4</b>	<b>WANGANUI WELL DRILLERS HANDICAP</b>
<b>WANNABE QUEEN</b> was slow to begin. When questioned into the disappointing run of <b>THE FILLY</b> , apprentice rider J Shackleton reported the mare was not entirely comfortable in the going and in her opinion would improve with the run. A post-race veterinary inspection failed to reveal any abnormality.	
<b>Race 5</b>	<b>ERNIES HAY &amp; FENCING CONTRACTING HANDICAP</b>
<b>BRAXY'S IMAGE</b> and <b>THE MAILMAN</b> began awkwardly and lost ground. <b>SEDUCER</b> was slow to begin. <b>LIBERATOR</b> was obliged to improve wide rounding the turn. Near the 200 metres <b>HAMMER</b> and <b>ELUSIVE LAW</b> were both checked when racing inside <b>TOMSK</b> (J Shackleton) which was attempting to improve into a marginal gap. After questioning riders concerned, it was established that <b>EVEREADY</b> , when taken into clear running, shifted in, bumping with <b>ANTOWNOV</b> which was further taken inward, dictating <b>TOMSK</b> which had become established inside that runner's heels, inward on to <b>ELUSIVE LAW</b> and <b>HAMMER</b> . No rider was considered at fault; however J Shackleton was shown video footage and reminded of her obligation with respect to improving into a run which had not fully developed.	
<b>Race 6</b>	<b>TOD SEEDS/TURFSTAR HANDICAP.</b>
<b>BRECON GROSVE</b> was a late scratching at 8.20am on veterinary advice. Trainer T Keegan was advised that a veterinary clearance is required for the gelding prior to its next race start. <b>EXCEEDING A DREAM</b> was slow to begin. <b>FALZANO</b> began awkwardly. <b>ON THE HILL</b> shifted out on jumping, bumping with <b>COATOFMANYCOLOURS</b> . <b>SEA EAGLE</b> was slow to begin. <b>ON THE HILL</b> and <b>COUNTESSOFDELGATIE</b> over-raced early. <b>CIRON</b> raced three wide without cover throughout. <b>COUNTESSOFDELGATIE</b> shifted in shortly after straightening and momentarily hampered <b>ON THE HILL</b> . When questioned into the run of <b>COUNTESSOFDELGATIE</b> rider J Parkes advised that the filly had little left at the finish after racing keenly early. Trainer F Auret advised <b>COUNTESSOFDELGATIE</b> would be spelled.	
<b>Race 7</b>	<b>BAYER SEEDGROWTH HANDICAP</b>
<b>LADY PLATINUM</b> and <b>DOUBLE O SEVEN</b> were slow away. <b>CALIFORNIA</b> shifted out on jumping, hampering <b>SADLERS ROCK</b> . <b>RIGHT ROYAL ROSE</b> shifted in on jumping, bumping with <b>SADLERS ROCK</b> . <b>FIGURE AGAIN</b> raced keenly in the run along the back straight forcing the rider to steady of heels for some distance near the 1000 metres. <b>COSABELLA</b> had to steady off the heels of the tiring <b>THATZ DAVID</b> near the 700 metres and lost ground. <b>LADY PLATINUM</b> gave ground and lost contact with the field passing the 800 metres being distanced at the finish. When questioned, rider J Parkes was of the opinion something was amiss with the mare's breathing. Stewards ordered a veterinary examination of <b>LADY PLATINUM</b> , which failed to reveal any immediate abnormality. Trainer L Latta advised that <b>LADY PLATINUM</b> would undergo a full veterinary check including an endoscopic examination with the results to be advised to the stewards.	
<b>Race 8</b>	<b>NEW ZEALAND BLOODSTOCK INSURANCE MANAWATU BREEDERS' STAKES</b>
<b>IRISH DREAM</b> bounded at the start, losing several lengths. <b>DENLEE</b> was slow away. <b>DENLEE</b> raced wide rounding the first turn so was taken forward to lead near the 1400 metres. When questioned regarding the run of <b>JOY'S CHOICE</b> apprentice R Hutchings said the mare faltered stride near the 300 metres and was of the opinion that something was amiss, so eased the mare down over the concluding stages. A post-race veterinary examination of <b>JOY'S CHOICE</b> which aided to reveal any abnormality. <b>DON'T DILLY DALLY</b> required veterinary attention following the event after bowing a tendon. Connections were advised that a veterinary clearance is required before the mare's next race start.	
<b>Race 9</b>	<b>WATERFORCE HANDICAP</b>

**WITZ END** began awkwardly.

**THE MINER'S SON** shifted in abruptly on jumping away and tightened **MARANELLO** and **CANSO**, which were severely buffeted.

**JERRICO** over-raced in the early and middle stages.

**MARANELLO** was inclined to shift inwards in the home straight and had to be straightened on at least two occasions.

When questioned regarding the run of **COOL SPUR**, rider M Cameron reported that the gelding failed to handle today's track conditions.
