RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	PORT FM SPRINT MAIDEN (1200m)
<p>SEDUISANTE jumped awkwardly and made firm contact with PFORPERFECT with both runners becoming unbalanced for a short distance and getting back.</p> <p>EMPTY POCKETS jumped awkwardly and was slow in the early stages.</p> <p>Shortly after the start rider R Hannam (RED RIPPER) lost the use of his left side iron for a short distance. YOU'RE IN LUCK was hampered as a result.</p> <p>Passing the 1000 metres TRAPTHEBOYZ commenced to over race and got its head up on a number of occasions.</p> <p>Passing the 400 metres MON ROI was held up for a short distance.</p>	
Race 2	WASHDYKE WONDERS MAIDEN 1200 (1200m)
<p>Passing the 800 metres BARBERRY ROZE was held up for a short distance.</p> <p>Near the 650 metres EMA SOPHIA which was racing tight to the inside of BARBERRY ROZE was checked and lost ground. Apprentice jockey T Direen reported to the Stewards that in her opinion EMA SOPHIA was field shy and had contributed to this incident by failing to take up the running available directly in front on the rail.</p> <p>The trailing CHAPELLE D'OR was checked in consequence.</p> <p>NATIONAL VELVET lay out from the 600 metres and proved difficult to ride over the concluding stages. A post race veterinary inspection of NATIONAL VELVET did not reveal any apparent abnormalities.</p> <p>When questioned regarding her ride on HALOBETHYNAME, rider A Edmeads reported to the Stewards she had been instructed to ride off the rail and the mare had lay out under pressure over the concluding stages finishing wide on the</p>	

track.	
Race 3	D'CASH RATING 65 DASH (1200m)
<p>SPARK IT UP was slow over the initial stages.</p> <p>I'M MAVERIC and ORAKA PRINCE made firm contact on jumping.</p> <p>LA VIE ONZE began awkwardly.</p> <p>ORAKA PRINCE was obliged to race wide throughout.</p> <p>Passing the 800 metres LA VIE ONZE raced keenly and made contact with LICKWISH which in turn shifted outwards and unbalanced ORAKA PRINCE for a short distance.</p> <p>LA VIE ONZE was inclined to lay out rounding the final turn.</p> <p>LICKWISH was inclined to lay inwards rounding the final turn with the rider swapping whip hands passing the 300 metres. A post race veterinary inspection of LICKWISH revealed no apparent abnormalities. Rider R Doherty reported that LICKWISH failed to handle today's prevailing track conditions. Trainer D Champion advised the Stewards it was his intention to spell LICKWISH.</p> <p>Inside the final 150 metres COMMANDER CODY shifted inwards to obtain clear running .</p> <p>A post race veterinary inspection of ORAKA PRINCE revealed a minor laceration to the left hind leg.</p>	
Race 4	EQUINE VETERINARY SERVICES RATING 75 MILE (1600m)
<p>FLYING LEGEND was hampered on jumping and got back as a result.</p> <p>KOHI ROAD and ASHBURN LANE raced keenly through the early stages.</p> <p>ASHBURN LANE had difficulty obtaining clear running early in the home straight.</p>	
Race 5	HARDGRAVE DECORATING LTD RATING 65 1600 (1600m)
<p>Approaching the 1400 metres HAMILTON COUP commenced to race fiercely, running up on heels as the tempo of the race eased and in doing so made firm contact with KERRYTOWN LADY which was buffeted and lost ground.</p> <p>HAMILTON COUP continued to over race throughout.</p> <p>PERFECTION over raced in the early stages.</p> <p>SLICK NICKEL raced ungenerously throughout tending to get its head up on numerous occasions.</p> <p>HAPPY DAYS raced wide from the 1000 metres.</p> <p>Passing the 400 metres HAMILTON COUP had to steady when runners either side shifted ground.</p> <p>PAMINA was held up for clear running rounding the home turn until passing the 200 metres and again raced in restricted room approaching the winning post.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of PERFECTION, rider J Bullard stated the filly did not appreciate the stop start nature of the event and in his opinion was not entirely comfortable in today's prevailing track conditions.</p>	
Race 6	CENTRAL SI OWNERS & TRAINERS MAIDEN (1600m)
<p>HARDEN UP SON was slow to begin.</p> <p>SPINALIN raced wide through the early stages.</p> <p>CONTADOR raced keenly in the early stages.</p> <p>Passing the 500 metres ASLAK raced in restricted room to the inside of MONTE CAIRO.</p>	
Race 7	SPEIGHT'S MAIDEN (2100m)
<p>Trainer B Gliddon advised the Stewards that EVIDENCE was lame prior to departing for today's meeting and was subsequently late scratched on veterinary advice at 10.58 am.</p> <p>ASTRAVI was slow to begin.</p> <p>ASTRAVI raced wide when improving from the 1000 metres.</p> <p>FLYING SPORTSMAN was momentarily held up rounding the home turn.</p>	
Race 8	ROBBIES WASHDYKE STAYERS RATING 65 (2100m)
<p>ADDITUP and SHEEZARULER over raced in the early stages due to the lack of pace.</p> <p>OLD GOLD made the first turn awkwardly and lay out across heels passing the 1700 metres.</p> <p>RED MAGIC raced keenly in the early and middle stages.</p> <p>OLD GOLD raced wide from the 1000 metres.</p>
