recovered to lead	recovered to lead. KAPUA JOCK and DECEPTIVE made contact on landing after jumping the fence at the 1000 metres. KEEP		
IT TIGHT made a poor leap at the final fence. UNCLE JIM hit the last fence and fell dislodging rider G Walsh. UNCLE JIM was			
examined by the	examined by the on course veterinarian and found to have a laceration to the near fore leg which required attention. Rider		
G Walsh was exa	G Walsh was examined by St John Ambulance paramedics and was cleared to fulfill his remaining riding engagement.

ARN'T I CHOICE began awkwardly. SPIC N SPAN raced wide throughout. GUNNA FLY lay in throughout the final straight			
with the rider sv	with the rider swapping whip hands. HALO DOLLY dipped momentarily passing the 350 metres. RICCIOLI was held up		
passing the 200 r	passing the 200 metres and had to change ground outwards to obtain clear racing room. GUNNA FLY which was observed		
to have blood pr	to have blood present in its mouth on return to the birdcage area underwent a post-race veterinary examination which		
revealed the geld	revealed the gelding to have suffered a minor laceration to the mouth area.

TO THE MAX which began to race keenly passing the 600 metres threw its head in the air when being steadied at this point.			
ROTAR made contact with the running rail passing the 300 metres when taking a marginal run to the inside of KATIE'S			
DIAMOND. SWEET BUT NEAT and FOUR GEES made contact passing the 250 metres. When questioned regarding the			

performance of favoured runner **FOUR GEES** rider T Moseley was of the opinion the mare had failed to handle the sticky nature of today's track.

	the performance of favoured runner <b>LAUTENSCHLAGER</b> rider C Studd advised the gelding had never travelled comfortably		
	during the running and was disappointing. Stewards requested a post-race veterinary examination of LAUTENSCHLAGER		
	which revealed n	o obvious abnormalities.

BELLE D'OR race	BELLE D'OR raced wide over the early stages. WINNING GENES raced in restricted room early in the run home.		
Race 6	6 RIVERTON HARDWARE & NIND ELECTRICAL HANDICAP (1400M)		
THE HAMMER HEAD began awkwardly losing ground.			
Race 7	N.A & M.A EVANS & BAY ROAD SERVICE CENTRE HANDICAP (1400M)		
GANNICUS began awkwardly. HOWLONGDOWEWAIT was crowded on jumping away losing ground. Passing the 1200			
metres DOUBLE TAP which was racing keenly shifted out off the heels of KRISSIES CHOICE simultaneously as JUST FRANK			
shifted out and away from <b>DOUBLE TAP</b> taking <b>I'M INQUISITIVE</b> wider on the track and inconveniencing <b>MOTORBOAT</b>			
MIKE and TUFFINUP which were also obliged to shift wider on the track. MOTORBOAT MIKE then raced wide throughout.			
HEART OF HEARTS lay out on the final bend. When questioned regarding the performance of favoured runner SINS OF THE			
<b>FATHER</b> rider S Muniandy advised that after working to the lead shortly after the start <b>SINS OF THE FATHER</b> had over raced.			
Mr Muniandy further added he believed the gelding did not appreciate todays prevailing track conditions. Apprentice R			
Black (HEART OF HEARTS) in the presence of her employer Mr K Tyler admitted a breach of Rule 638(3)(b) in that she struck			
her mount in an	her mount in an excessive manner prior to the 200 metres. After viewing the replays and hearing evidence and submissions		
from apprentice R Black, K Tyler and the Stewards the JCA imposed a fine of \$450.
