## RACE COMMENTS:

<b>Race 1</b>	<b>FRUITFED SUPPLIES IRRIGATION SYSTEMS HURDLE</b>
<b>BRER</b> began awkwardly. <b>BRER</b> misjudged the second fence. <b>BRER</b> then raced wide without cover. <b>BRER</b> put in a poor jump at the fence approaching the 1000 metres. Near the 800 metres mark <b>HERMAN MUNSTER</b> shifted out and tightened <b>COMTE DE JEU, BRER</b> and <b>YORKIE</b> . <b>CURRENCY SPIKE</b> was retired from the race prior to the second last fence when out of contention. <b>HERMAN MUNSTER</b> put in a poor jump and hit the second last fence hard.	
<b>Race 2</b>	<b>PGG WRIGHTSON HURDLE</b>
<b>BINKLEBONK</b> was hampered jumping the first fence. <b>BENEDETTO</b> and <b>ERIC THE VIKING</b> both misjudged the third fence. <b>HAERE MAI</b> raced three wide without cover. <b>ERIC THE VIKING</b> continued to jump indifferently at the rear in the middle stages. <b>BENEDETTO</b> put in a poor jump at the fence approaching the 1000 metres.	

<p><b>WILBUR</b> raced wide when attempting to improve forward from the 1000 metres.</p> <p><b>P Ormsby</b> reported that his mount <b>HAERE MAI</b> had pulled up sore. A post-race veterinary inspection revealed the gelding to be lame in the right foreleg. Co-trainer <b>W Hillis</b> was advised that a veterinary clearance is required before <b>HAERE MAI</b> next races.</p> <p>Following this event the track conditions were upgraded to <b>SLOW9</b>.</p>	
<b>Race 3</b>	<b>FRUITFED SUPPLIES TECHNICAL SERVICES HURDLE</b>
Nothing to report.	
<b>Race 4</b>	<b>AGRONICA MAIDEN 1200</b>
<p><b>TAKEMEHOMEBABE</b> began awkwardly, getting its head up and losing ground.</p> <p>Shortly after the start <b>ACTION MAN</b> lay out forcing <b>MAHORA GOLD</b> across the heels of <b>HEIGH UP KEEP</b>.</p> <p><b>STRICTLY LIMITED</b> ran wide when being steadied off heels going into the 800 metre bend.</p> <p><b>ITSAGEM</b> made the 800 metre bend awkwardly.</p> <p><b>ACTION MAN</b> raced wide without cover and ran wide rounding the final turn.</p> <p><b>ITSAGEM</b> shifted in under pressure and had to be steadied when becoming awkwardly placed on the heels of <b>PINS 'N' ARROW</b> near the 100 metres.</p> <p>When questioned into the run of <b>LITTLE DUMMER BOY</b> rider M Dee said the gelding was not entirely comfortable in the going.</p>	
<b>Race 5</b>	<b>BALLANCE AGRI-NUTRIENTS LTD STEEPLECHASE</b>
<p><b>MR ALIGN</b> and <b>KHAPTION</b> both jumped the first fence poorly.</p> <p><b>TALLENTIRE</b> misjudged the second fence.</p> <p><b>BELINUS</b> put in a poor jump at the 800 metres on the first occasion.</p> <p><b>BORRACK</b> ran down the first of the stand double on the second occasion.</p> <p><b>WAIANAKARUA</b> knuckled after jumping the fence near the 1400 metres and shortly after lost his footing.</p> <p><b>BORRACK</b> misjudged the fence near the 1200 metres. <b>BELINUS</b> also put in a poor jump at the same fence and lost ground.</p> <p><b>KHAPTION</b> landed awkwardly at the fence near the 1000 metres.</p> <p><b>K Veenendaal (BELINUS)</b> dropped her whip shortly after jumping the last fence.</p> <p><b>BORRACK</b> ran down the last fence.</p> <p><b>WAIANAKARUA</b> knuckled after jumping the last fence.</p>	
<b>Race 6</b>	<b>FRUITFED SUPPLIES AMATEUR RIDERS 2000</b>
<p><b>SNOWDROPTWINKLETOES</b> began awkwardly getting its head up and racing very ungenerously in the early stages, losing a considerable amount of ground (8L).</p> <p><b>KING OF ROCK</b> began awkwardly, losing ground.</p> <p><b>I CHIANTI</b> over-raced in the lead in the early stages.</p> <p><b>KING OF ROCK</b> raced wide throughout.</p> <p>When questioned into the run of <b>CAST IRON JACK</b>, which finished last, rider <b>L Wheeler</b> was of the opinion that the gelding's weight of 70kg combined with being in the worst of the going near the rail told over the final stages.</p> <p><b>W Hillis</b>, the trainer of <b>ARMADIO ESTRADA</b> defended a charge under Rule 616(2) after he presented the gelding in the enclosure without notified gear (blinkers). After deliberations the charge was upheld and a fine of \$50 was imposed.</p> <p><b>I CHIANTI</b> returned to the enclosure with blood present in a nostril. A subsequent veterinary inspection revealed a cut to a nostril.</p>	
<b>Race 7</b>	<b>DOW AGROSCIENCES MAIDEN 2100</b>
<p><b>BLACK DRAGON</b> began awkwardly.</p> <p><b>TAIPA TIGER</b> raced wide without cover around the first bend.</p>	
<b>Race 8</b>	<b>ROOTS, SHOOTS &amp; FRUITS METRIC MILE</b>
<p><b>SERGEANT LINCOLN</b> and <b>BEAUTIFUL MAN</b> were slow to begin.</p> <p><b>M Dravitzki</b> admitted a charge of careless riding in that she permitted her mount <b>ANDALOU</b> to shift inwards near the 1450 metres when not sufficiently clear of <b>ASSASSIN</b>, which was forced inwards crowding <b>SAVAROSE</b>, which clipped a heel and blundered. Hampered as a result of this incident was <b>JUST LIKE NO OTHER</b>. After hearing submissions M Dravitzki was suspended by the Judicial Committee from the conclusion of racing on Saturday, 1 June until the conclusion of racing on Monday, 10 June (5 riding days).</p> <p><b>HE KIN BE FAMOUS</b> broke down when racing free of interference near the 1300 metres. After being attended to by the veterinarian <b>HE KIN BE FAMOUS</b> was found to have suffered a fractured cannon bone and was humanely euthanased.</p> <p><b>ASSASSIN</b>, which was attempting to obtain clear running near the 300 metres, had to be steadied when <b>BOOSTING ELEANOR</b> was taken in by <b>REDLAHA (M Cheung)</b>, which shifted in under pressure. <b>REDLAHA</b> again shifted in under</p>	

pressure over the concluding stages, making contact with **ANDALOU** just short of the finish. M Cheung was issued with a warning.

**Race 9**

**BAYER CROPSCIENCE 1400**

**PEARLS (S Pashai)** and **JAMAA** both began awkwardly, losing ground. **PEARLS** continued to drift in the early stages and lost contact with the field in the run along the back straight. **Apprentice Jockey S Pashai**, who was having her first race-day rides in New Zealand after previously being licensed and riding race-day in the UK, was shown video footage of her ride in the presence of her employer Mr Lowry. Mr Lowry agreed with stewards that **Ms Pashai** be required to undertake further tuition, particularly with regard to her jumping her mounts away from the barriers, prior to her riding race-day again.

**R Hutchings**, the rider of **SONATA**, was suspended from the conclusion of racing on Saturday, 1 June until the conclusion of racing on Friday, 7 June (5 riding days) after admitting a charge of careless riding in that he permitted his mount to shift outwards when not sufficiently clear of **GOLD ROCK (K Leung)**, which was checked near the 75 metres.
