<b>Canterbury Jockey Club – Wednesday, 7<sup>th</sup> August 2013</b>
<b><u>Race 7 – McMillan Equine Feeds Rating 65 1250m</u></b>
B Lammas the rider of <b>HAILES ABBEY</b> defended a charge under Rule 649(1)(a) in that he did a wrongful act with respect to weighing by changing from a light pair of boots, in which he weighed out, in to a heavy pair of boots after weighing out. The JCA found the charge proved and after submissions on penalty suspended B Lammas's licence to ride in races for a period of two weeks effective 13 August to 26 August 2013 (inclusive) and in addition imposed a fine of \$300.

## RACE COMMENTS:

<b>Race 1</b>	<b>SPEIGHT'S PREMIER HURDLE (3100m)</b>
	<b>RIPDIDDLER</b> and <b>FAITES VOS JEUX</b> both put in a poor leap over the 2900 metre hurdle. <b>RIPDIDDLER</b> made contact with the jump passing the 800 metres.
<b>Race 2</b>	<b>ECHOES OF HEAVEN @ LINWOOD PARK STUD PREMIER (2000m)</b>
	<b>RED MAGIC</b> was held up for a short distance passing the 500 metres. Passing the 150 metres <b>GAGARIN</b> and <b>OUR ALCHEMIST</b> bumped.
<b>Race 3</b>	<b>GLADSOME LODGE PREMIER (1400m)</b>

<p><b>TERELLE</b> raced keenly in the early stages.</p> <p><b>THAT'SOUREXCUSE</b> hung outwards badly from the 600 metres, raced very wide in the straight and was eased down. Trainer L Latta was advised the gelding will be required to trial before racing again. A post-race veterinary inspection of <b>THAT'SOUREXCUSE</b> did not reveal any obvious abnormalities.</p> <p>D Walsh, the rider of <b>BLACK BERRY PUNCH</b>, reported that his mount hung outwards in the straight and proved difficult to ride out.</p>	
<b>Race 4</b>	<b>ZILCO PREMIER (1250m)</b>
<p><b>REDFERN</b> and <b>HEZA KOOL KAT</b> were slow to begin.</p> <p><b>REGALIA</b> raced wide throughout.</p> <p><b>FIDDLER'S GREEN</b> raced in restricted room rounding the turn and passing the 250 metres was held up for a short distance. Rider H Tinsley stated that <b>FIDDLER'S GREEN</b> had been reluctant to run on when in tight quarters early in the final straight however when presented with clear racing room passing the 200 metres had run on well.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the run of <b>UNBELIEVEABELLE</b>, rider K Myers was unable to offer any tangible excuse for the performance and stated that the mare was disappointing.</p>	
<b>Race 5</b>	<b>BRACKENFIELD HUNT PREMIER OPEN (1400m)</b>
<p>B Lammas was replaced on <b>TICK TOCK TURBO</b> by D Bradley after B Lammas was unable to lose the required weight due to being required in a judicial hearing. In the circumstances the Stewards determined that no action would be taken against Mr Lammas on this occasion.</p> <p><b>KHEMOSABI</b> was inclined to lay out under pressure over the final 250 metres.</p> <p><b>ELUSIVE TRACY</b> compounded over the concluding stages being distanced at the finish. A veterinary examination revealed <b>ELUSIVE TRACY</b> to have suffered an arterial fibrillation. Trainer A Bidlake was advised that a veterinary clearance, including a satisfactory ECG examination, would be required prior to the mare next racing.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the improved performance of <b>KHEMOSABI</b>, trainer P Gordon advised in his opinion the gelding had benefited from the shorter distance of today's event and the back-up from racing last Saturday.</p>	
<b>Race 6</b>	<b>RACECOURSE HOTEL &amp; MOTOR LODGE 139<sup>TH</sup> GRAND NATIONAL STEEPLECHASE (5600m)</b>
<p><b>SNODROPTWINKLETOES</b> commenced to race fiercely after jumping the first fence proving difficult to settle for some distance.</p> <p><b>KIDUNOT</b> lost ground at the fence near the 4500 metres.</p> <p><b>HONEY</b> landed awkwardly at the jump near the 2000 metres.</p> <p><b>WAITAHA TOA</b> was inclined to over race in the middle stages.</p> <p><b>KIDUNOT</b> got in close and misjudged the second of the double near the 1200 metres, unbalancing the rider for a short distance.</p> <p><b>HONEY</b> dipped on landing at the fence near the 1000 metres and lost ground.</p> <p><b>EL PATRON</b> landed awkwardly after jumping the fence near the 800 metres, unbalancing the rider.</p> <p><b>THE ROSE</b> hung out under pressure rounding the final bend and in the final straight.</p> <p><b>KARLOS</b> suffered an injury to the right front cannon bone and was attended to by the course veterinarian.</p> <p>M Mitchell (<b>CAPE KINAVERAL</b>) admitted a breach of Rule 638(3)(b) in that he used his whip excessively prior to the final 200 metres. After consideration the Judicial Committee imposed a fine of \$250.</p> <p>Stewards filed an information with the Judicial Committee in regard to rider I Lupton's use of the whip on <b>BRUSHMAN</b> prior to the 200 metres, however due to I Lupton leaving the course without permission the matter has been adjourned to a time and date to be fixed.</p> <p>A Kuru (<b>KARLOS</b>) was issued with a warning in respect of use of the whip prior to the 200 metres.</p>	
<b>Race 7</b>	<b>HeatStore PREMIER (1600m)</b>
<p><b>SUPERTURF</b> shifted out on jumping crowding <b>WILLY DUGGAN</b> out onto <b>PENCURI</b> which was hampered.</p> <p><b>AL ASKAN</b> began awkwardly and was slow away.</p> <p><b>COAT OF ARMS</b> raced keenly in the early stages.</p> <p><b>WILLY DUGGAN</b> hung out under pressure in the final straight and near the 100 metres shifted out crowding <b>SUPERTURF</b>.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the run of <b>GOLDEN MISS</b>, rider K Myers could offer no tangible reason for the performance.</p>	
<b>Race 8</b>	<b>CHRISTCHURCH CASINO WINTER CLASSIC (1800m)</b>
<p><b>NEGOTIATE</b> was slow to begin.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the run of <b>INTRANSIGENT</b>, rider D Walsh reported that, in his view, the impost of 59 kgs had been disadvantageous to the gelding's chances.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the run of <b>THRIVE</b>, rider K Myers could offer no tangible excuse for the performance.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the run of <b>RISING TIDE</b>, rider J Riddell advised that the gelding was unsuited to the holding nature of the track and in his opinion would appreciate greater distance.</p>	
<b>Race 9</b>	<b>VERNON &amp; VAZEY PREMIER (1800m)</b>
<p><b>AMIGO</b> was crowded shortly after leaving the barriers when <b>KERRYTOWN LADY</b> shifted in.</p> <p><b>GOSSIP GIRL</b> was crowded and buffeted for several strides passing the 450 metres between <b>KERRYTOWN LADY</b> and <b>GOOD</b></p>	

**ONE GLADY.**

**BELLE D'OR** raced in restricted room for the majority of the final straight and only obtained clear running passing the 100 metres.

When questioned regarding the run of **CISKAY**, rider D Walker advised that his mount was under pressure a long way out and failed to respond in the straight. A post-race veterinary inspection of CISKAY revealed no obvious abnormalities.
