RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	FAGAN MOTORS MAIDEN DASH
CAPTAIN ZIPPO began very awkwardly and lost considerable ground. LUCASAURUS was obliged to race wide throughout. EL KAYO raced greenly throughout. CAPTAIN ZIPPO was inclined to lug in down the home straight.	
Race 2	THE MARQUIS HOTEL CARTERTON TWO YEAR OLD SPRINT
DUMONT dwelt at the start then was tightened shortly after. Shortly after the start ASCOMANNI hung outwards and tightened MAGGIE'S SECRET Near the 200 metres SILK BELT shifted in momentarily hampering ASCOMANNI and WERTHER .	
Race 3	BULL4U HANDICAP SPRINT
PLATINUM LINCOLN was slow away. PRIDE AND PASSION shifted out at the start dictating PURE BLONDE outwards onto WORKINGCLASS which was hampered. J Parkes the rider of WORKINGCLASS was reminded of his obligations to keep his mount straight under hard riding after PINOCCHIO BOY was tightened near the 150 metres. Also contributing to the tightening was outward movement by PRIDE AND PASSION .	

Race 4	MASTERTON RC RACING AT TAUHERENIKAU SUNDAY 9TH MARCH
<p>BLATHWAYT dwelt at the start and got back. ANUTHA HULA was slow away. ZEDBEE was obliged to race wide throughout. When questioned regarding the improved performance of the winner CENTRE CROSS, trainer G Humphries said the better track conditions in conjunction with a favorable barrier draw today suited the filly. When questioned regarding the run of GOLDEN EMPORER, H Tinsley was of the opinion the gelding would be better suited by an easing in the track. When questioned into the run of BLATHWAYT, D Walker said the gelding would be better suited by an easing of the track.</p>	
Race 5	TUI BACKING A WINNER SINCE 1889 MILE
<p>CHRYSOLITE and CAJUN got back at the start. JILTED raced keenly in the early stages and had to be steadied off heels near the 1200 metres.</p>	
Race 6	PIONEER FINANCE WAIRARAPA THOROUGHBRED BREEDERS STAKES - Listed
<p>COLOURFUL LADY knuckled for several strides when the barrier opened causing rider J Riddell to lose the use of his outside iron for a short distance. COLOURFUL LADY was then parked three-wide without cover throughout. ARIETTA was slow away and was then crowded when BEYOND DESIRE shifted out into its line of running after being bumped by HIGH FASHION. SORIANO was also affected and lost ground. MRS NEAT raced keenly in the early stages and had to be steadied off heels for some distance approaching the 1200 metres. ARIETTA over-raced early. HIGH FASHION was held up rounding the turn and then bumped with PRECIOUS TIME near the 250 metres. BEYOND DESIRE was held up and unable to improve rounding the final turn and had some difficulty finding racing room in the home straight. When questioned regarding the performance of PRECIOUS TIME, M Cameron was of the opinion the mare was not suited to racing on the pace, did run a little keenly with the addition of blinkers and was therefore unable to produce when required. R Hannam (MRS NEAT) was issued with a warning with regard to the use of his whip on a horse out of contention. A post-race veterinary examination of COLOURFUL LADY revealed no abnormalities.</p>	
Race 7	FARMAN TURKINGTON FORESTRY WAIRARAPA CUP
<p>NO FEAR was slow away. SLAH knuckled at the start and when regaining its balance, bumped with ZANKURO. FREDRICK WILLIAM shifted out into the line of LANGDON at the start and settled back. KEEPHER CLOSE raced wide early until crossing to the rail and lead near the 1600 metres. PHANTOM STORM had to be shifted wide abruptly to avoid the heels of the tiring NO FEAR passing the 400 metres. LANGDON shifted out abruptly to avoid NO FEAR and in doing so dictated SLAH, BRAD THORN and FREDRICK WILLIAM wider on the track. LADY PLATINUM was held up until near the 200 metres in the home straight When questioned regarding the performance of NO FEAR which compounded quickly when placed under pressure prior to the home turn, S Collett had no excuse. A post-race veterinary examination of SLAH which rider M Dee reported felt sore on pulling up, revealed a slight abrasion on the near hind leg and some swelling to the near foreleg.</p>	
Race 8	WAIRARAPA TIMES AGE MAIDEN STAYERS
<p>PADDY OWEN and ADRIENNE bumped at the start with ADRIENNE settling back. POTTER was slow away after bumping with PRINCESS SIENNA. LADY JESSICA was obliged to race wide throughout. LORD CASANOVA and STAR EMERALD both shifted ground outwards in the home straight and near the finish LORD CASANOVA dictated STAR EMERALD wider on the track. S Doyle was advised that he is expected to straighten his mount sooner than he did on this occasion. PERONI which was racing to the outside of this pair was also dictated over extra ground. Prior to the authorisation of dividends connections of the 2nd placed EMERALD STAR viewed film coverage of the home straight with regard to lodging an objection against the winner, LORD CASANOVA but elected not to proceed. R Hutchings reported that ALEZAN hung from 800 metres and was of the opinion the filly would appreciate any easing of the track.</p>
