RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	RAY COLES MEMORIAL 2200			
CORRAL (J Jago) shifted out leaving the barrier making contact with MISS NANCHO BELLE (R Smyth).				
JUD STRUNK (R Hutchings) and BELLEZA IRLANDESA (P Turner) were both crowded losing ground on jumping away				
between ALL OKAY (B R Jones) and DIAMOND THORN (M Cameron) when both runners shifted ground.				
PINK DIAMOND (M Du Plessis) raced ungenerously when being restrained for a distance passing the 1700 metres.				
Approaching the 1200 metres DIAMOND THORN was restrained when awkwardly placed on heels.				
CORRAL raced three wide without cover for the majority of the race.				
SPEEDY JAX (B Grylls) had some difficulty obtaining clear running early in the final straight.				
J Jago (CORRAL) was reminded of his obligation that he must ride his horses fully to the line when circumstances permit				
him to do so.				
BELLEZA IRLANDESA returned to the enclosure with blood present in one nostril which was found to be consistent with a				
laceration after undergoing a veterinary examination. BELLEZA IRLANDESA lost the near fore plate during the running.				
Race 2	AUTOBAHN CAFÉ 1600			
PANAMBA (K Myers) began a little awkwardly.				
Shortly after the start ASTARDIA (M Cameron) and PANAMBA were crowded to the inside of SUGGESTIVE SMILE (D				
Johnson) which shifted in and away from READY TO RUMBLE (R Smyth).				

Approaching the 1200 metres **ASTARDIA** had to steady and shift out when awkwardly placed on the heels of **READY TO**

RUMBLE.

Passing the 1100 metres READY TO RUMBLE was crowded to the inside of PANNO ROSSA (R Hutchings) which shifted in with READY TO RUMBLE then having to steady. As a result FIVEUNDRED (P Turner) which was following READY TO RUMBLE had to shift out off that runner's heels when becoming awkwardly placed forcing PANAMBA then to race three wide without cover for the remainder of the race. R Hutchings was issued with a warning. Race 3 **ALF COLE MEMORIAL 1600** CAJERO (M Dee) commenced to over-race shortly after leaving the barriers and approaching the 1400 metres had to be steadied when crowded to the inside of A PERTE DE VUE (C Dell) which had improved to be inside the heels of DOMANAE (R Hutchings) which shifted in with PERTE DE VUE and CAJERO having to be steadied. Also inconvenienced in this incident was ZAH OFF (L Magorrian). R Hutchings was advised to exercise greater care when shifting ground. A PERTE DE VUE returned to the enclosure with blood present in both nostrils and after undergoing a veterinary examination was deemed a bleeder and as such is subject to the mandatory three month stand down. Race 4 **TICKETWEAR 1200** IN STYLE (M Coleman) shifted in abruptly leaving the barriers crowding AFRICAN STAR (M Dee), BLACKWOOD (D Hain) and MY WORD (R Hutchings) with AFRICAN STAR and BLACKWOOD both having to steady losing ground. Passing the 1000 metres **PRINCESS MICHELLA** (D Johnson) became awkwardly placed inside the heels of **ELUSIVE KITTY** (S Spratt) which shifted in. PRINCESS MICHELLA then commenced to race ungenerously shifting out across the heels of ELUSIVE KITTY and making the bend awkwardly passing the 900 metres. SHESGOTIT (B Grylls) which was following PRINCESS MICHELLA then became awkwardly placed inside PRINCESS MICHELLA'S heels for a distance. MISS BROOKE (R Smyth) raced wide without cover for the majority of the race. **ARNET LAW 1400** Race 5 **HIDDEN KEY** (D Johnson) underwent a veterinary inspection at the start after being kicked and was passed fit to race. HIDDEN KEY began awkwardly losing ground. **INA JAM** (R Hutchings) began awkwardly. SHAPE SHIFTER (S Spratt) raced keenly in the early and middle stages and shifted out approaching the 1000 metres inconveniencing WRECKING BALL (K Myers). DREIMS OF GOLD (P Turner) raced wide for the majority of the race. WRECKING BALL shifted out abruptly when struck with the whip passing the 350 metres inconveniencing FRENCH (M Cameron) and HIDDEN KEY (D Johnson). HIDDEN KEY returned to the enclosure with a minor laceration inside the near hind leg. Race 6 **TASMAN CARGO AIRLINES 1400** MARQUILLA (M Dee) began awkwardly making contact with the hind quarters of BLUE IVY (D Johnson) with MARQUILLA losing ground as a result. **POSTNTHYME** (M Coleman) was a little slow to begin. SMITTEN (S Spratt) and CHINA TEA (K Myers) came together leaving the barriers with CHINA TEA then shifting away from that runner losing ground. **SMITTEN** raced three wide without cover throughout. **CHINA TEA** had some difficulty obtaining clear running early in the final straight. Race 7 **BROKERWEB RISK SERVICES LTD 1600** TILDA (R Hutchings) began very awkwardly shifting in and hampering OUR SERAFINA (T Thornton) which lost ground. Also inconvenienced was LUCY BEE (M Cameron). TILDA which raced well back in the early and middle stages was not persevered with in the final straight. When questioned R Hutchings reported the mare felt indifferent in its action. A post-race veterinary examination of TILDA did not reveal any obvious abnormality. Co-trainer J McVean undertook to advise of any abnormalities that may arise in the coming days. LUCY BEE settled back in the early and middle stages, but when placed under pressure failed to respond and was not persevered with in the final straight. Jockey M Cameron advised the mare raced disappointingly in its first run back after a spell, and he felt the mare would benefit from the race. A post-race veterinary examination of LUCY BEE revealed a slower than normal recovery rate.
