## RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	RD 1 WAVERLEY 3YO (1650m)
<p><b>IT'S A WONDER</b> (M Dravitzki) shifted out abruptly at the start and lost ground.</p> <p><b>SIR CARLOS</b> over-raced in the early and middle stages and had to be steadied off heels for some distance near the 800 metres.</p> <p><b>SANJARA</b> raced three-wide throughout.</p> <p><b>RUSHIN</b> (R Hutchings) ducked outwards under pressure passing the 200 metres and in doing so hampered <b>SANJARA</b> which had to be steadied and to a lesser extent <b>AMORTI</b> which was improving to its outside. After viewing footage and questioning riders, it was considered the movement was beyond the control of R Hutchings.</p> <p><b>R Stam</b> the rider of <b>OMA ELLE</b> was reminded of his obligation to ride his mount out fully to the finish when circumstances permit after he was observed to relax his ride over the last few strides.</p> <p><b>IT'S A WONDER</b> was held up for some distance between the 800 metres and 600 metres.</p> <p>Apprentice Jockey <b>M Dravitzki</b> (IT'S A WONDER) was questioned regarding her decision not to attempt to improve her mount near the 600 metres, when in the stewards' opinion it would have been more advantageous for her to follow the improving <b>AMORTI</b> at that stage of the race when able to do so. Apprentice Jockey <b>Dravitzki</b> advised that after being slow away her mount got further back than intended but on reflection she acknowledged that the preferred option on this occasion would have been to follow <b>AMORTI</b> and that she may have erred in not doing so. Stewards advised <b>M Dravitzki</b> that she is expected to exercise better judgement in future when in similar circumstances.</p>	

<b>RUSHIN</b> was held up rounding the turn.	
<b>Race 2</b>	<b>NUFARM (2200m)</b>
<p><b>ITSALLBELT</b> ducked outwards abruptly at the start and hampered <b>REYKJAVIK</b> which lost ground.</p> <p><b>POTTER</b> and <b>OH THAT'S NICE</b> were crowded leaving the barrier between <b>CRASH BANDICOOT</b> and <b>SNEDDON</b> which both shifted ground.</p> <p><b>UPPER CUT</b> raced wide in the early stages.</p> <p><b>POTTER</b> raced three-wide without cover over the final 1,400 metres.</p> <p><b>REYKJAVIK</b> had to be steadied near the 500 metres when improving up on to the heels of <b>OH THAT'S NICE</b> then shifted out momentarily hampering <b>UPPER CUT</b>.</p> <p><b>JITZU</b> returned to the enclosure with blood present in the mouth area with a veterinary inspection revealing a minor laceration to the tongue.</p> <p>When questioned in to the run of <b>SNEDDON</b> which got well back and ran on fairly, rider R Hutchings advised that despite his efforts the gelding took a long time to work in to the race.</p>	
<b>Race 3</b>	<b>GENETIC TECHNOLOGIES 3YO (1200m)</b>
<p><b>PACIFIC BELLE</b> was slow away.</p> <p><b>MY MUSTANG MOLLY</b> hung rounding the turn and made the 400 metre corner awkwardly shifting out dictating <b>BLACK BELT</b> outwards which bumped <b>CAUGHT BEHIND</b>. Also affected was <b>SAVBLANC</b> which was dictated wide.</p> <p><b>SHUTHEGATE</b> was held up and unable to improve rounding the final turn.</p> <p><b>D Turner</b> (<b>MY MUSTANG MOLLY</b>) dropped his whip near the 250 metres.</p>	
<b>Race 4</b>	<b>MARLEY (1200m)</b>
<p><b>FALSE EMPATHY</b> and <b>YOUNGSYD</b> were slow to begin.</p> <p>Apprentice Jockey B Murray admitted a charge under Rule 638 (1) (d) in that he allowed his mount <b>ARCHANGEL</b> to shift in near the 1,000 metres dictating <b>TATANIA</b> inwards on to <b>SIR HIKO</b> which received a severe check. <b>SIR HIKO</b> then went back on to <b>HIGH COMMISSIONER</b> which was forced to take evasive action to avoid that runner's heels and shifted out abruptly severely hampering <b>CHECKOUT CHICK</b>, <b>YOUNGSYD</b> and <b>SPEED QUEEN</b>. After deliberations Apprentice Jockey B Murray had his licence to ride in races suspended from the conclusion of racing on 12 July up to and including 31 July (8 days).</p> <p><b>GOLDEN SHELLS</b> raced wide throughout.</p> <p><b>SIR HIKO</b> made the final bend awkwardly.</p>	
<b>Race 5</b>	<b>ECOLAB (1400m)</b>
<p><b>HAMILTONIAN</b> and <b>NED</b> began awkwardly and settled back.</p> <p><b>THE CAPER</b> and <b>NED</b> raced keenly in the early stages.</p> <p><b>BARTHEZ</b> and <b>LUCK AT LAST</b> raced wide throughout.</p> <p><b>THE CAPER</b> hung outwards throughout.</p> <p><b>MONT BLEU</b> shifted out under pressure over the final 100 metres.</p>	
<b>Race 6</b>	<b>R D 1 WAVERLEY (1650m)</b>
<p><b>EKKO BEECHES</b> and <b>GO THUNDER</b> were slow to begin.</p> <p><b>RED RUBY</b> raced three-wide without cover throughout.</p> <p><b>GOLD CARD</b> raced wide throughout.</p> <p><b>MINT</b> was held up and unable to improve rounding the final bend until obtaining clear running near the 300 metres.</p>	
<b>Race 7</b>	<b>TOM ANDREWS CONTRACTING (2200m)</b>
<p><b>LITTLE BENNY</b> began awkwardly then was further hampered when runners either side shifted ground.</p> <p><b>REACHFORTHESTARS</b> was slow to begin.</p> <p><b>PILLAR TO POST</b> shifted out abruptly at the start making contact with the side of its barrier.</p> <p><b>TIME FOR GOLD</b> raced in restricted room rounding the first bend.</p> <p><b>PILLAR TO POST</b> and <b>LITTLE BENNY</b> raced wide when attempting to improve near the 1,000 metres.</p> <p><b>KOORRABYE</b> shifted out under pressure near the 200 metres and had to be straightened.</p> <p><b>BALLROOM</b> had to be angled inward across the heels of <b>JACKABEAN</b> near the 100 metres to continue to improve.</p> <p>D Johnson reported that her mount <b>COLJOY</b> was unsuited to today's slow track conditions.</p>
