RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	FEILDING JC STEWARDS 2YO MAIDEN (1200m)
BEL SORRISO was slow to begin. OUR TAVILIGHT raced three wide without cover over the final 800 metres. OUR TAVILIGHT raced greenly in the home straight. XCUSES XCUSES was held up entering the home straight until near the 250 metres. Rider M Dravitzki reported that her mount, XCUSES XCUSES was unsuited to the heavy track conditions.	
Race 2	HR JONES & CO 3YO MAIDEN (1200m)
CALENDAR HOUSE was crowded leaving the barrier between LINCOLN'S EXCUSE and MORGOLD , which began awkwardly and shifted out. TOOTHPIC shifted out and away from ROADTOPLATINUM at the start and made heavy contact with ENCOSTOW . TOOTHPIC raced greenly throughout and attempted to run off at the 800 metre bend, placing the rider at a disadvantage for the remainder of the race. A subsequent veterinary examination of TOOTHPIC did not reveal any abnormality.	

Race 3	SPRAY SPECIALISTS MAIDEN (1200m)
<p>APLOMB began awkwardly.</p> <p>SUSSED jumped inwards at the start making contact with SIGNORINA. SUSSED continued to race greenly in the early stages.</p> <p>DIAMOND FLUSH was slow away.</p> <p>M Ulucinar (ZEDENUF) was shown footage of his ride in the home straight and reminded of his obligations to be clear when shifting ground, after he allowed his mount to shift inwards over the final stages into the line of SIGNORINA, which was hampered.</p> <p>FOR FASHION was inclined to shift out under pressure over the concluding stages.</p> <p>MISS APPLETON was inclined to shift ground under pressure over the final stages and had to be straightened.</p> <p>ARIBASAN tailed off and proved uncompetitive. Stewards ordered a subsequent veterinary examination which revealed a respiratory abnormality which trainer P Evans will follow-up with his veterinarian.</p>	
Race 4	GARY DYER PAINTERS & DECORATORS MAIDEN (1400m)
<p>ST'RUTH and FURZE LADY were slow to begin.</p> <p>TOP CAT shifted in leaving the barrier, inconveniencing PERFECT MIX, which settled back.</p> <p>TOP CAT over-raced in the early stages and had little left at the finish.</p> <p>LET ME THINK was inclined to shift ground inwards under pressure over the final 150 metres.</p> <p>PERFECT MIX hung inwards in the final straight and had to be straightened on several occasions.</p>	
Race 5	NOEL'S BUILDINGS MAIDEN (1600m)
<p>AND THATZ SCOTTY was slow to begin.</p> <p>OLLIE RED raced keenly in the early stages.</p> <p>PETONE PRINCE lay out over the early stages of the final straight and bumped with ANOTHER BACHELOR.</p> <p>ANOTHER BACHELOR shifted inwards under pressure over the final 200 metres and had to be straightened.</p>	
Race 6	BENCHTOP SURFACES HANDICAP (1200m)
<p>SALUTE ME was slow to begin.</p> <p>SAMSI jumped away awkwardly.</p> <p>VEININSKY shifted out over the early stages of the home straight in search of better going.</p> <p>When questioned into the run of PERSIAN DANCER, rider A Taylor was of the opinion the mare failed to back up from its previous start at Wellington on Saturday 24th May.</p>	
Race 7	CARTERS HANDICAP (1400m)
<p>KING NERO and KENNYS CHANCE began awkwardly.</p> <p>I SUGGEST was slow away.</p> <p>I SUGGEST (A Taylor) tailed off in the early stages and despite the rider's urgings failed to make any discernible ground until the final stages of the home straight.</p>	
Race 8	TUI BACKING A WINNER SINCE 1889 HANDICAP (1600m)
<p>HEIR SUPPLY was a late scratching at 3.55pm after dislodging rider T Kahlon behind the barrier. T Kahlon was attended to by St John paramedics. Paramedics subsequently reported that T Kahlon had suffered bruising.</p> <p>Connections were advised that HEIR SUPPLY must trial to the satisfaction of stewards prior to its next race-day start.</p> <p>As a result the start of this race was delayed 11 minutes.</p> <p>VICKY ANNE was slow to begin.</p> <p>THE GREAT WHITE raced keenly in the early stages, when being restrained.</p> <p>CUTLUSE over-raced through the early and middle stages.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of CUTLUSE, rider D Bradley reported that the filly had over-raced through the early and middle stages and when placed under pressure in the final straight failed to respond. Trainer L Latta advised that CUTLUSE would be spelled.</p>
