RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	WANGANUI STEELFORMERS MDN 1360
<p>DONLEE (M Singh) jumped outwards abruptly leaving the barrier simultaneously as OKAY JACK (D Bradley) shifted in, resulting in RED REBEL (N Teeluck) bumping heavily with DONLEE. Also affected was HIP HOORAY (M Dravitzki) which bumped with DONLEE and settled back. Rider M Singh (DONLEE) lost his iron for a short distance during the incident.</p> <p>CAFÉ NOIR (S McKay) was slow away.</p> <p>DAL AMORE (K Chiong) raced three-wide without cover throughout.</p> <p>JUSTA DUCHESS (R Hannam) had to be steadied going into the first turn when racing in restricted room to the inside of DONLEE (M Singh) which shifted in when over-racing. M Singh was shown footage of his ride and advised to exercise care.</p> <p>HIP HOORAY and CAFÉ NOIR came together and bumped entering the final straight.</p> <p>OKAY JACK shifted in under pressure passing the 100 metres bumping RED REBEL.</p> <p>JUDITH KATE (R Goldsbury) raced in restricted room over the final stages.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of LAPSAGLO, Rider K Smith reported that in his opinion the mare may appreciate a further distance at this stage of its preparation.</p>	
Race 2	NZB INSURANCE PEARL SERIES MDN F&M 1200
<p>ALAMBER (S McKay) shifted out leaving the barrier forcing HONEY QUEEN (D Bradley) into the line of TUI BABE (J Riddell) which was hampered, losing ground.</p> <p>CLEMENTINE (K Smith) began awkwardly.</p> <p>MARE MIA (N Teeluck) over-raced in the early and middle stages when leading.</p>	
Race 3	SPOONERS DRYCLEANING R75 1200

<p>DANNY BOY (S McKay) was slow to begin.</p> <p>WATCH YOUR MAN (N Teeluck) over-raced in the early and middle stages.</p> <p>PASS IT ON (R Goldsbury) hung outwards rounding the final bend and through the early of the final straight.</p> <p>DANNY BOY shifted out under pressure over the final 100 metres.</p>	
Race 4	HELLO SEPTEMBER THE DIAL A PRAYERS ARE HERE R75 2060
<p>CARLTON PRINCESS (N Teeluck) jumped inwards leaving the barrier hampering FLIPPANT (K Smith) and DON'STOPGIRL (R Hannam) which lost ground.</p> <p>CARLTON PRINCESS commenced to over-race near the winning post on the first occasion and had to be steadied when becoming awkwardly placed near the heels of CLAPATHUNDA (M Dravitzki).</p> <p>DUCATI (M Singh) over-raced in the early stages when wide.</p> <p>DON'STOPGIRL (R Hannam) commenced to give ground near the 500 metres and was not persevered with in the final straight. When questioned, rider R Hannam could offer no tangible excuse. Stewards ordered a post-race veterinary examination of DON'STOP GIRL which did not reveal any abnormalities. Stable representative A Rennie undertook to monitor the mare's progress in the coming days and advise the findings to the Stewards.</p>	
Race 5	RACEWAY MOTEL MDN HWT 2060
<p>MOUNTAIN ROCK (D Jensen) and HAMILTONIAN (T Harris) were crowded leaving the barrier between PERFECTLY RED (S Fannin) and GOONDIWINDI (D Millar), both of which shifted ground.</p> <p>Shortly after the start HAMILTONIAN which was over-racing had to be steadied off the heels of GOONDIWINDI (D Miller) which was improving to its inside. After questioning riders the incident was considered beyond the control of Rider D Miller.</p> <p>ZEDBEE (B Lammas) over-raced in the early stages, and then raced wide without cover from near the 1300 metres.</p> <p>ZEDACE (E Farr) raced wide without cover throughout.</p> <p>PLATINUM SONG (J Riddell) was briefly held up near the 250 metres and had to shift outwards to obtain clear running.</p>	
Race 6	LOWE SCHOLLUM & JONES R85 1600
<p>ZEDEEDUDADEEKO (N Teeluck) was slow to begin.</p> <p>SHE'S ALL CLANG (L Hemi) hung outwards rounding the first bend.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the disappointing performance of SHE'S ALL CLANG, Rider L Hemi advised that in her opinion the filly may not have been suited to the left-handed way of going. Stewards ordered a post-race veterinary examination of SHE'S ALL CLANG which did not reveal any abnormalities.</p>	
Race 7	SEWELL & WILSON MDN HWT 1600
<p>JUSTA TOMBOY (G Walsh) was tightened leaving the barrier and settled back.</p> <p>ASH PALACE (T Harris) was checked entering the first bend when tightened for room between VUI (S Karnicnik), SHIRLEY'S SECRET (J Riddell) and NED (D Millar). After reviewing films and questioning riders, blame could not be attributed to any individual rider.</p> <p>VUI got its head up and raced ungenerously for a short distance near the 1300 metres.</p> <p>Rider M Gillies reported that EVADIR LA BALA had over-raced in the early and middle stages, which in his opinion told on the gelding when placed under pressure in the final straight.</p>
