## RACE COMMENTS:

<b>Race 1</b>	<b>CENTRAL GROUP FORKLIFTS &amp; TRUCKS HURDLE</b>
<p><b>CRACKA CROWN (M Gillies)</b> was slow to begin and was then inclined to lay in and run down its fences throughout. <b>CRACKA CROWN</b> was retired from the event after the final fence in the back straight on the last occasion. Rider <b>M Gillies</b> reported that there may be something amiss with the gelding. Stewards ordered a post-race veterinary inspection of <b>CRACKA CROWN</b> which did not reveal any abnormalities.</p> <p><b>GET FLASH (L Kennedy)</b> landed awkwardly after jumping the first fence resulting in the rider becoming severely unbalanced.</p> <p><b>EXWHYWHAT (D Jensen)</b> jumped the fence near the 2200 metres awkwardly.</p> <p><b>EXWHYWHAT; CRACKA CROWN</b> and <b>IN FOR FUN (T Harris)</b> were all withdrawn from the event prior to the fence near the 900 metres when well back and out of contention. Rider <b>T Harris</b> reported that the favourite <b>IN FOR FUN</b> was unsuited by the heavy track conditions.</p> <p><b>GET FLASH</b> raced up onto the heels of <b>VENERATE (S Fannin)</b> after jumping the second last fence and had to shift ground inwards in order to improve.</p> <p><b>ZARDETTO (A Kuru)</b> was retired from the event prior to the last fence when well back and out of contention.</p>	
<b>Race 2</b>	<b>GRANT PLUMBING STEEPLECHASE</b>
<p>The start of this event was delayed 2mins 30secs due to runners requiring additional time to line up at the open barrier.</p> <p><b>HARD SHOT (D Jensen)</b> jumped indifferently throughout.</p> <p><b>THE FOX (E Farr)</b> fell on landing after jumping the 5<sup>th</sup> fence hampering <b>GOOSEBUMPS (T Harris)</b> which had to take evasive action. Rider E Farr was attended to by St John's paramedics and was uninjured. <b>THE FOX</b> underwent a post-race veterinary examination and was cleared of injury.</p>	

<p><b>GOOSEBUMPS</b> jumped both fences at the double awkwardly, and then ran off taking no further part in the event.  <b>MR MOR (C Studd)</b> put in a poor jump at the fence near the 700 metres, losing momentum.</p>	
<b>Race 3</b>	<b>WOODRIDGE DEVELOPMENTS AMATEUR</b>
<p><b>TIME FOR GOLD (D Hirini); ALL IN BLUFF (J Lupton)</b> and <b>SIR MANAWA (L Kennedy)</b> were all slow to begin.  <b>SNODROPTWINKLETOES (S MacNab)</b> got its head up when being restrained rounding the first bend.  <b>A McIntyre</b> the rider of <b>SANJARA</b> lost the use of both stirrup irons near the 1600 metres placing her at a disadvantage for the remainder of the event.  <b>TIME FOR GOLD</b> raced keenly in the early and middle stages.  <b>J Lupton (ALL IN BLUFF)</b> was issued with a warning with regard to her use of her whip prior to the 200 metres.  <b>S MacNab (PERFECTLY RED)</b> was issued with a warning with regard to his whip use prior to the 200 metres.</p>	
<b>Race 4</b>	<b>TUI-BACKING A WINNER SINCE 1889 2YO MAIDEN</b>
<p><b>K Myers</b> replaced <b>J Riddell</b> on <b>MASTER PLATINUM</b> after <b>J Riddell</b> incurred an injury to his lower leg in the enclosure. <b>J Riddell</b> was transferred to hospital for observation. The start of this race was delayed 7mins and 34 seconds owing to the injury to <b>J Riddell</b> and <b>THE AXE</b> and <b>HE'S RESOLUTE</b> having to be re-saddled.  <b>M Bentley</b> the trainer of <b>THE AXE</b> and <b>HE'S RESOLUTE</b> was fined \$100 under Rule 614 (2) when he presented his runners with the wrong saddlecloths.  <b>MACAKIZI (J Parkes)</b> and <b>GLENGOYNE (H Tinsley)</b> came together leaving the barriers.  <b>MASTER PLATINUM (K Myers)</b> began awkwardly.  <b>KNIGHT FEVER (R Myers)</b> shifted out under pressure near the 200 metres having to be straightened.  <b>J Parkes</b> reported that the saddle on <b>MACAKIZI</b> had slipped back during the running.  <b>J Parkes (MACAKIZI)</b> defended a charge under Rule 636 (1) (d) which alleged that he failed to ride his mount out fully to the finish when there was a reasonable chance of finishing fourth. After hearing all evidence and submissions the JCA found the charge not proven.  A post-race veterinary examination of <b>MACAKIZI</b> did not reveal any abnormality.</p>	
<b>Race 5</b>	<b>THE OAKS STUD HANDICAP</b>
<p><b>NORTH AND SOUTH (R Hannam)</b> reared leaving the barriers losing ground.  <b>DAIELLO (K Myers)</b> over-raced in the early stages.  <b>NORTH AND SOUTH (R Hannam)</b> was angled outwards near the crossing when not clear of <b>MR DARCEE'S GOLD (D Walsh)</b> which had to steady. Rider <b>R Hannam</b> was advised to exercise care.  <b>NORTH AND SOUTH</b> was held up near the 400 metres then had to shift ground inwards to obtain clear running.</p>	
<b>Race 6</b>	<b>GREEN MAN PUB MAIDEN</b>
<p><b>OX (J Parkes)</b> jumped outwards leaving the barriers crowding <b>RED THUNDER (D Walsh)</b> which was then further hampered when <b>LA MALACARA (N Teeluck)</b> lay inwards.  <b>ROSSINI GIRL (K Chiong)</b> was held up for a short distance near the 400 metres  <b>R Hannam</b> reported that <b>FOR FASHION</b> had failed to handle the Heavy 11 track conditions.</p>	
<b>Race 7</b>	<b>TOMMY'S REAL ESTATE HANDICAP</b>
<p><b>PEWTER (C Johnson)</b> was crowded leaving the barriers between <b>THE GRADUATE (K Chiong)</b> which shifted in and <b>WIGGLE (R Cuneen)</b> which shifted out.  <b>KENNYS CHANCE (R Harris)</b> began awkwardly and then raced ungenerously for a short distance.  <b>PEWTER</b> raced keenly in the early and middle stages.  <b>KENNYS CHANCE</b> had to switch off the heels of <b>BACK ON SONG (J Parkes)</b> near the 400 metres to continue to improve.  <b>J Parkes</b> reported that <b>BACK ON SONG</b> did not handle the heavy track conditions.</p>	
<b>Race 8</b>	<b>BLUE STAR GROUP HANDICAP</b>
<p><b>BISHOPBRIGGS</b> was a late scratching at 2.34pm due to no suitable rider being available to replace the injured <b>J Riddell</b>.  <b>LORD ERNESTO (J Parkes)</b> and <b>BY THE POWER (K Chiong)</b> were slow away  <b>TALK THE TORQUE (M Dravitzki)</b> and <b>ARCHANGEL (K Smith)</b> began awkwardly.  <b>DON'T BLAME BUSTER (R Cuneen)</b> made contact with the running rail passing the 400 metres.  <b>MR INK (C Johnson)</b> had to shift ground inwards inside the final 50 metres after improving onto the heels of <b>TALK THE TORQUE</b>.  <b>R Myers</b> could offer no excuses for the run of <b>HENI</b>.</p>
