## RACE COMMENTS:

<b>Race 1</b>	<b>ASCOT BLOODSTOCK MDN HWT</b>
<p><b>ZEDACE</b> was a late scratching at 8.59am after sustaining an injury en route to the course. Trainer T Bambray was advised that a veterinary clearance will be required prior to <b>ZEDACE</b> next racing.</p> <p><b>MUZICMUZICMUZIC</b> jumped outwards leaving the barriers hampering <b>NITRO TED</b>.</p> <p><b>BLACK ZAMBUKA</b> lay outwards shortly after the start inconveniencing <b>INFOXICATED</b>.</p> <p><b>MUZICMUZICMUZIC</b> commenced to give ground passing the 600 metres and was not persevered with in the final straight. When questioned into the performance of <b>MUZICMUZICMUZIC</b> which finished some distance last, rider M Mitchell had no excuse.</p> <p><b>INFOXICATED</b> shifted in under pressure in the final straight and near the 200 metres momentarily crowded <b>BLACK ZAMBUKA</b>.</p>	
<b>Race 2</b>	<b>REGAL LODGE 'CHOICE' 2000</b>
<p><b>GUS</b> began awkwardly and then got its head up when being restrained in the early stages. When questioned into the performance of <b>GUS</b> which finished some distance last, rider S Collett could offer no excuse.</p>	
<b>Race 3</b>	<b>SALTY DOG BAR &amp; CAFÉ 1800</b>
<p><b>TORRADO</b> (C Perrett) charged its gate immediately prior to the jump resulting in its gate opening fractionally quicker than the other stalls. After viewing footage and questioning rider C Perrett and starter Mr B Clement, Stewards determined that <b>TORRADO</b>, which finished 5<sup>th</sup> was not advantaged or disadvantaged by its awkward beginning.</p> <p><b>SNEDDON</b> and <b>GOOD RISK</b> were crowded leaving the barriers between <b>ZAVAMAR</b> which shifted outwards and</p>	

**RACQUETOR** which shifted inwards abruptly.

**RACQUETOR** improved into a position where there was restricted room near the winning post on the first round and had to be restrained.

**TORRADO** raced keenly in the early and middle stages.

**OUR GIRL KATE** raced three wide without cover throughout.

**Race 4** | **JANELLE MILLAR RACING STABLES MDN**

**ZEDCASE** was slow to begin.

**IDAHO'S CHOICE** over raced in the middle stages.

The riders of **ENCOSTOW** (J Parkes) and **EM KAY POPS** (M Cameron) reported that their respective mounts failed to handle today's heavy track conditions.

**ZEDCASE** had to shift ground inwards near the 450 metres after being tightened between **IDAHO'S CHOICE** which moved out simultaneously as **RAJASTHAN** shifted in and away from **PERFECT PITCH**, which shifted ground inwards.

D Johnson the rider of **HALLOWED** reported that the mare may have choked down during the running and was to recommend to connections that a tongue tie be applied.

**Race 5** | **SHIFTY'S SPORTS BAR MDN**

The tongue tie on **FIFTEENSIXTY** became detached during its preliminary and was unable to be replaced.

**POMPEII TIGER** began awkwardly and was slow away.

**VUI** over raced throughout.

**FIFTEENSIXTY** ducked outwards abruptly under pressure approaching the 200 metres momentarily hampering **POMPEII TIGER**.

**Race 6** | **NZB INSURANCE PEARL SERIES RACE**

**BELLA MOSSA** shifted inwards on jumping crowding **ELUSIVE JANE** and **MISS BONDI**.

**MADAME DEFARGE** began awkwardly after being fractious in its barrier, and was then further tightened when **PUZZLENTE** dictated **CHILLI MILLI** outwards into its line.

L Hemi the rider of **PUZZLENTE** was advised to exercise care after shifting in shortly after the start momentarily hampering **LIPSICSUC**, **BELLA MOSSA**, **ELUSIVE JANE** and **MISS BONDI**. Contributing to the tightening was outwards movement from **CHATEAU MAROUX**.

**MISS BONDI** was inclined to lug inwards in the home straight.

When questioned into the run of **BELLA MOSSA** which was not persevered with in the final straight, rider M McNab could offer no excuse. Stewards ordered a post race veterinary examination which did not reveal any abnormality.

A Clement the trainer of **FIVE TARTS** which had been disappointing at Egmont in its previous start attributed the improved performance to the application of blinkers.

**Race 7** | **STEEFAB 1400**

**POWER TRIP** and **DAL TE EN TEE** were slow away.

When questioned into the run of **ARZAK** rider M Cameron was of the opinion the gelding may be better suited to a longer distance.

D Johnson the rider of **MAGGIE'S SECRET** reported that the filly failed to cope with today's heavy track conditions.

**A Jones** (MR MENDELSSOHN) was issued with a warning for her use of the whip prior to the 200 metres.
