Race 9 - PORT FM 1600 MAIDEN

Stewards spoke with Co-Trainer Mr M Stokes about the performance of favoured runner **CELTIC LASS**. M Stokes reported that **CELTIC LASS** had come through the race well and in his opinion the filly, after being given an economical run, may not have seen out the distance of Friday's race. M Stokes added that **CELTIC LASS** would appear to race best on firmer going. Apprentice rider B Murray reported he was instructed to take cover early in the race. After improving forward from the 800 metres the filly was under pressure early in the home straight and had peaked on its run passing the 200 metres and despite his urgings failed to run on.

Race 2 OAMARU LIQUORLAND R65 2200m

HOLD THE NOTE was slow to begin.

Shortly after the start LORD YARBOROUGH had to be steadied when becoming awkwardly placed on the heels of RIKHO. LADY LINDAUER and MR WIZ raced wide in the early stages.

LORD YARBOROUGH raced wide in the early and middle stages before improving forward to sit outside the leader with 900

metres to run.

RIKHO raced wide throughout.

HOLD THE NOTE and SOUTHERN RAIDER were both obliged to improve wide rounding the final bend.

Passing the 300 metres **EL NAHRA** shifted out to find clear racing room and in doing so made contact with the tiring **THE GROOMSMAN**.

SOUTHERN RAIDER lay in throughout the run home with the rider using the whip in the left hand.

When spoken to regarding the performance of favoured runner **SEEKING REDEMPTION**, rider C Johnson advised that the gelding had travelled well until placed under pressure over the final stages and failed to respond to his urgings, and had disappointed. Stewards ordered a post race veterinary inspection of **SEEKING REDEMPTION** which did not reveal any obvious abnormalities.

UNDER & OUT DRILLING LTD R65 2200m

DESERT GIRL began awkwardly and lost ground.

JIMMY THE ONE blundered at the start and then raced three wide in the early stages.

FALENA was held up for several strides passing the 350 metres and had to shift ground outwards to find clear racing room. When questioned regarding the performance of favoured runner **MESSINES**, apprentice rider B Murray advised that the gelding had battled fairly over the concluding stages and in his opinion had not let down on today's firmer track conditions. Apprentice C Barnes, the rider of **PUDDLE ALLEY**, reported that the gelding had hung inwards throughout the running.

OAMARU NORTHSTAR MOTELS MAIDEN 1200m

BOBBY AL was slow to begin.

KRUGER RAND raced keenly in the early stages.

FLY THE FLAG raced wide throughout.

FLY THE FLAG (L Callaway) had to be severely restrained passing the 500 metres when racing in tight quarters between **CALL ME CLEAVER** (R Cuneen) and **BOBBY AL**. Stewards conducted an investigation into this incident, with apprentice rider R Cuneen and rider L Callaway reporting that their respective mounts had raced greenly throughout the running and at this point in the race **CALL ME CLEAVER** had lay out and placed some pressure on **FLY THE FLAG** which when being restrained had over-reacted and thrown its head in the air and shifted out further on the track. After reviewing the films and taking into account riders' explanations, Stewards deemed no further action necessary.

When questioned regarding the performance of **CALL ME CLEAVER**, apprentice rider R Cuneen advised that the gelding raced greenly throughout but would take natural benefit from today's race.

Race 5

SPORTS CENTRAL BREWHOUSE R65 1200m

PAINTBALL shifted in abruptly at the start dictating **ONTARIO** in onto **GOLD PROMISE** which was crowded and buffeted. **ONTARIO** was then forced inwards resulting in crowding to **GILD THE LILY**, **THE REAL DEAL** and **MISS MACK** with all these runners losing momentum.

PAINTBALL raced wide in the early stages.

GOLD PROMISE raced wide throughout.

HELL RAISER and WHISKEY BOLERO brushed on a number of occasions over the concluding stages.

When questioned regarding the performance of favoured runner **MISS MACK**, apprentice rider A Morgan advised that the filly did not appreciate today's track conditions and would appreciate tracks with more moisture.

When questioned regarding the performance of **THE REAL DEAL** rider S Muniandy reported he had been checked early and got further back than he wanted but had battled on fairly and added the gelding may appreciate more distance.

Race 6

NZB INSURANCE PEARL SERIES F&M MAIDEN RACE 1400m

The start was delayed approximately 4 minutes firstly due to some gear alterations on **STRICTLY LIMITED** and then when several runners proved difficult to load.

STRICTLY LIMITED was crowded and lost ground at the start when runners either side shifted ground.

TAIERI WHISPER was retired from the event passing the 1100 metres, with rider T Direen reporting she believed the mare had broken down. A subsequent veterinary inspection of **TAIERI WHISPER** did not reveal any obvious abnormalities.

D'ELLIS had to be steadied making the bend passing the 900 metres when awkwardly placed on the heels of GALELLA. SPIDER LILY and EMERGENCY CALL both raced wide throughout.

MADAM ROXY and SPIDER LILY made contact passing the 300 metres, with both runners becoming momentarily unbalanced.

EMERGENCY CALL (M Haruki) shifted in under pressure at the 150 metres, dictating **GALELLA** inwards and inconveniencing **STRICTLY LIMITED**. Apprentice M Haruki was shown a replay of this incident and reminded of his obligations to exercise greater care when shifting ground.

BENS LASS which was inclined to lay out in the run home shifted wider on the track in the concluding stages and could not be ridden to full advantage.

Stewards spoke with apprentice rider M Haruki (EMERGENCY CALL) and trainer K Hughes in regard to M Haruki being four wide outside the leader throughout. K Hughes advised he had been disappointed with the decision of M Haruki to race four

wide when he had been instructed to ride with cover where possible. Apprentice M Haruki agreed with Stewards that he had erred in his decision making in that he may have been able to obtain cover in the three wide position at an earlier stage of the race. M Haruki was advised he would be expected to show better judgment in future and that the matter would be referred to the apprentice jockey mentor.
