A post race veterinary inspection of LINCOLNS LEGACY which finished <br> last, did not reveal any abnormality. <br> R Hutchings reported that MISS BONDI was unsuited to the heavy 10. <br> Race $\mathbf{2}$$\quad$ NZB INSURANCE PEARL SERIES RACE 1200M |  |
| DREAM DANCER began awkwardly and settled back. <br> The saddle on SECRET SPIRIT shifted back on jumping away placing rider M Sweeney at a disadvantage for the remainder of |  |

the race.
SUNSET GIRL commenced to over race in the run along the back straight and had to be shifted off heels near the 800 metres and in doing so forced MENDIP over a little extra ground.
SPEEDY ACHIEVER raced wide throughout.
MISS FI was bumped near the 250 metres when DREAM DANCER shifted in abruptly under pressure.

## Race 3 DENIS WHEELER EARTHMOVING 1200M

AWESOME DIVA began awkwardly and settled back.
COPPER REIGN jumped outwards abruptly at the start hampering PRINCE BRUNO which became slow away.
SILVER NANCHO was inclined to over race in the early stages.
OLIVIA MARY raced wide without cover throughout.
PRINCE BRUNO hung outwards in the home straight and had to be straightened for some distance when well back in the field.
R Hutchings reported that KANALI hung throughout and was unsuited to the existing track conditions.

## Race $4 \quad$ LANDMARK HOMES SUB CONTRACTOR 1600M

OHIO GIRL shifted in making firm contact with AVATRIX which settled back.
PERFECTLYENCHANTED and HEZANAKILAD were slow away.
COOL WONDER raced wide without cover throughout.
LUAS shifted in and bumped TIME BOMB near the 1400 metres. M Singh was shown footage of his ride and reminded of his obligations when shifting ground.
R Hannam reported that AVATRIX failed to cope with the existing track conditions when finishing last.

## Race 5 SEATON PARK 1600M

IT'S A WONDER, ONE KAY and DIXIE EXPRESS were all tightened at the start when runners either side shifted ground.
DE KENSINGTON OVAL was eased down in the home straight and finished a distance last. Rider R Hutchings reported that
he considered that there may have been something amiss with the filly. DE KENSINGTON OVAL underwent a subsequent veterinary examination which did not reveal any abnormality. Connections were advised by the veterinary surgeon that a follow-up examination would be advisable.
When questioned into the run of ONE KAY rider L Hemi had no excuse. Trainer K Zimmerman was of the opinion the mare was not comfortable in the heavy 10. A subsequent veterinary inspection was ordered which did not reveal any abnormality.

## Race 6 TARANAKI DISTRICT TURF CLUB 3 1400M

FIGURAC received buffeting between SILK BELT, ELLIES EMPRESS and DARCI MAC shortly after the start.
FIGURAC continued to over race for some distance until the pace quickened passing the 800 metres.

## Race 7 HIREPOOL 1400M

SHARBEELA shifted out abruptly at the start simultaneously as ZORRALI shifted in, this resulted in AMADEUS and HOSTAGE being tightened with both runners getting back.
AMADEUS had to be steadied near the 200 metres when TWOZNOTENOUGH shifted in simultaneously as KAYZED shifted out. TWOZNOTENOUGH continued to shift ground inwards and when alongside ZORRALI was accidently struck over the head by the whip of that runner inside the last 50 metres.
The saddle on HIGH SOCIETY slipped back on jumping away, placing the rider J Parkes in difficulty for the remainder and was not persevered with from near the 800 metres.
FORBIDDEN was not persevered with in the home straight after rider $R$ Hutchings considered something amiss with the mare. A subsequent veterinary examination revealed abrasions on the back right hock consistent with having been galloped on.
When questioned into the run of PASHA SUMORE which finished well back, rider M Dravitzki could offer no tangible excuse.

## Race $8 \quad$ ENERGY CITY FORD OPEN 1800M

At the request of barrier staff, Stewards reduced the distance of this event by 20 metres to approximately 1780 metres to allow the starting stalls to be successfully removed from the track immediately after the start.
SOU'EAST and LOVES THE SHOW were slow to begin and settled back.

## Race $9 \quad 1$ PLATINUM HOMES 2000M

KATIE MCKEEN (D Mo) shifted in at the start severely tightening NANCYLEE and JIMMY MAC resulting in both those
runners settling back. Rider D Mo was reminded of his obligations when shifting ground.
When questioned into the run of SHEZASTUNNA rider T Thornton reported that the mare failed to handle the heavy track. When questioned into his ride on JIMMY MAC which was not persevered with in the home straight, rider R Hannam said the gelding struggled in the going from the outset after getting back at the start so he attempted to obtain better footing by racing wide throughout, which told over the final stages.
