## SUPPLEMENTARY:

<b>WELLINGTON RACING CLUB 25 OCTOBER 2014 – TBS THOMPSON HANDICAP</b> Connections advised that further tests on <b>TYNE COT</b> by South Rangitikei Veterinary Services LTD revealed the gelding to be lame in the right hind with a wrenched fetlock joint requiring a lengthy spell.
<b>WELLINGTON RACING CLUB 25 OCTOBER 2014 – TBS THOMPSON HANDICAP</b> Connections advised that <b>AMBERIO</b> had jarred up following the mares run.

## RACE COMMENTS:

<b>Race 1</b>	<b>IVS REBRAND LAUNCH MDN (2000 metres)</b>
<p><b>LAST TRUMP</b> began awkwardly losing ground.</p> <p><b>SZYSLAK</b> and <b>FINKBIG</b> came together and bumped on jumping away.</p> <p><b>KINGIESSTAR</b> was slow to begin then over raced early.</p> <p><b>L Macgorrian (CHECKOUT CHICK )</b> was advised to exercise care after shifting in shortly after the start tightening <b>HEZANAKILAD</b> and <b>TALLEMOSA</b>.</p> <p><b>PICADDILLY</b> raced three wide without cover until near the 800 metres.</p> <p><b>SZYSLAK</b> raced wide throughout.</p> <p><b>FINKBIG</b> over raced early and when being steadied shifted in hampering <b>LAST TRUMP</b> which was also over-racing near the post on the first round.</p> <p><b>HEZANAKILAD</b> was denied a run near the 200 metres and had to be angled inwards to improve, momentarily hampering <b>LIKAROC</b>.</p> <p><b>THE DUKE'S SECRET</b> was held up and had to be angled wide to improve near the 150 metres.</p> <p><b>REYKJAVIK</b> which was under pressure some distance out was eventually pulled up in the home straight by rider M Dee. When questioned regarding the performance, M Dee reported despite getting further back than intended the gelding was disappointing. A subsequent veterinary examination of <b>REYKJAVIK</b> failed to reveal any abnormalities. The connections</p>	

were advised to monitor <b>REYKJAVIK</b> over the coming days and report any change to the Stewards.	
<b>Race 2</b>	<b>RETURN TO EARTH SUPPORTING LIFE EDUCATION TRUST MDN (1200 metres)</b>
<p><b>MASSEY DASH</b> jumped away awkwardly losing ground (3 lengths).</p> <p><b>ALY'S BELT</b> and <b>WILLBEOKAY</b> came together and bumped leaving the barriers.</p> <p><b>STELLA VEGA</b> got its head up when being restrained near the 800 metres.</p> <p><b>BORNTHISWAY</b> over raced in the early stages and had to be restrained off the heels of <b>STELLA VEGA</b> going into the bend near the 800 metres.</p> <p><b>K Chiong</b> (KAMAR SPLASH) was reminded of her obligation to be clear of other runners when shifting ground after she allowed her mount to shift in near the 800 metres resulting in <b>FIFTEENSIXTY</b> having to be steadied when improving to its inside.</p> <p><b>T Baker</b> (CUPCAKE) was shown footage of his ride and advised to exercise care after shifting out on the home turn hampering <b>BORNTHISWAY</b>.</p>	
<b>Race 3</b>	<b>HOOKEER PACIFIC SUPPORTING LIFE EDUCATION TRUST MDN 3YO (1200 metres)</b>
<p><b>SAKURA</b> jumped away awkwardly and lost ground.</p> <p><b>TIDDLY</b> was tightened at the start and got back.</p> <p><b>SMOKED</b> raced greenly throughout and ran wide losing ground at the 800 metre bend.</p> <p><b>SAKURA</b> raced in restricted room early in the home straight and then had to change ground attempting a narrow run near the 100 metres.</p> <p><b>POROTENE DIVA</b> hung throughout and had to be straightened over the final stages when shifting ground under pressure. The connections attributed the improved performance of the winner <b>CURRY UP</b> to the addition of blinkers and being better suited to the slow 7 going.</p>	
<b>Race 4</b>	<b>EKRAAR &amp; ECHOES OF HEAVEN @ LINWOOD PARK (1200 metres)</b>
<p><b>ZETOW</b> and <b>BUSTA</b> came together and bumped heavily on jumping away.</p> <p><b>BRECON BELLE</b> jumped inwards abruptly leaving the barriers hampering <b>TINKA TINKA</b> which lost ground and settled back.</p> <p><b>EQUANIMITY</b> bumped in the initial stages with <b>ROYAL HAZE</b>.</p> <p><b>EQUANIMITY</b> over raced in the early stages but failed to quicken when the pace increased nearing the 600 metres and despite being well tried failed to run on. Rider M Dee advised that although the mare was initially disappointing he would have preferred to have taken a more handy position in the early stages but was unable to do so after being bumped. M Dee advised that he expected <b>EQUANIMITY</b> to take natural improvement with the run. Stewards ordered a subsequent veterinary examination which did not reveal any abnormality.</p>	
<b>Race 5</b>	<b>TRADE SAFETY SUPPORTING LIFE EDUCATION TRUST MDN (1400 metres)</b>
<p><b>ALARINDA</b> began awkwardly and shifted in abruptly tightening <b>SINGAPORE GIRL</b> which lost ground.</p> <p><b>WINTHORPE</b> was slow away.</p> <p><b>CRAFTY LAD</b> hung in the home straight and finished wide out.</p> <p><b>KEEP HER SECRET</b> returned to the enclosure with a small amount of blood present in a nostril consistent with having cut itself on the gate prior to the start which was confirmed by the veterinary surgeon.</p> <p><b>FIVE TARTS</b> lost its near-hind plate during the running.</p>	
<b>Race 6</b>	<b>LANDMARK HOMES SUPPORTING LIFE EDUCATION TRUST (1400 metres)</b>
<p><b>A BRIDGE TO FAR</b> jumped away very awkwardly resulting in rider M Dravitzki losing the use of both stirrup irons for some distance, losing ground.</p> <p><b>FAITH IN RAE</b> over raced near the 900 metres having to be restrained off the heels of <b>RIVERMAN JACK</b>.</p> <p><b>TEXAS YELLOW ROSE</b> raced three wide without cover throughout.</p> <p><b>LADY HUNTINGDON</b> as unable to take advantage of a narrow run which closed near the 250 metres so was then angled outwards to improve and was further hampered when <b>RIVERMAN JACK</b> shifted in.</p> <p><b>REGAL RANGER</b> was held up early in the home straight prior to gaining a run near the 180 metres.</p>	
<b>Race 7</b>	<b>OUR PLACE MDN (1600 metres)</b>
<p><b>FERNLIN</b> stood flat-footed and lost several lengths at the start.</p> <p><b>CLYDE</b> was slow away.</p> <p>Approaching the first bend near the 1400 metres <b>BRIGANTINE</b> and <b>IT'S YOUR CALL</b> had to be steadied when in restricted room.</p> <p><b>EYEFUL TOWER</b> raced three wide without cover throughout.</p> <p><b>DANASONIC</b> raced keenly and near the 800 metres had to be steadied off the heels of <b>EYEFUL TOWER</b> and angled into</p>	

clear running which necessitated racing four wide from the 800 metres.

**CLYDE** had to steady off heels at the 800 metre bend.

**V Ravikumar** (THEATRICS) was shown footage of his ride, in particular the final stages, after he allowed his mount to shift inwards when using the whip into the line of **CARNATION** which was improving to its inside resulting in **CARNATION** having to be steadied. V Ravikumar was advised that he is expected to straighten his mount earlier than he did on this occasion.

**CHEESEMAKER** hung inwards under pressure in the home straight and had to be steadied near the finish.

When questioned into the run of **BRIGANTINE** rider S Wynne had no excuse. Stewards ordered a subsequent veterinary examination which did not reveal any abnormality.

**Race 8**

**NEXT TWILIGHT RACEDAY NOVEMBER 21<sup>ST</sup> (1800 metres)**

**N Teeluck** (DUCATI) was advised to exercise care after he allowed his mount to shift in passing the winning post on the first occasion when not clear of **LEAPER FAITH** which had to be steadied and went back on to **KEWZERO. TORRADO** which was improving to the outside of **KEWZERO** was forced over extra ground.

Approaching the 600 metres **MILACHI LAD** (K Chion) had to be steadied off the heels of the rapidly tiring **TORRADO**. This resulted in **HIGHLAND ROSE** which was following **MALACHI LAD** having to be steadied. **HIGHLAND ROSE** was then angled inwards to the inside of **TORRADO** to improve and on straightening was momentarily held up prior to gaining clear running near the 200 metres. **MASH** was held up nearing the turn when awkwardly placed on the heels of **TORRADO**.

A Donald was questioned into his ride on **TORRADO** which after being slow away rapidly looped the field rounding the first turn to be near the front in the back straight. A Donald said his riding instructions were to lead if possible but after being slow away, agreed with the Stewards that he should have ridden the gelding in a more patient manner which would have been the preferred option.

**J Oliver** (PRICKLEY PRINCESS) lost his whip near the 100 metres.

**KEWZERO** had to be continually straightened in the run home when inclined to shift ground under pressure.
