RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	MATAMATA VETERINARY SERVICES 3YO
KNIGHT COURT (D Nolan) was slow to begin. SHERPA (M Hills) raced keenly in the middle stages. HARBOUR STAR (M Coleman) was inclined to lay out over the final 200 metres when placed under pressure. When questioned regarding the performance of SHERPA rider M Hills advised the gelding had failed to quicken in the existing track conditions.	
Race 2	BOP PUNTER OF THE YEAR – SAT 20 JUNE TGA 1400
THE MIG (T Thornton) was slow to begin. ADRENALINE RUSH (C Lammas) over-raced in the early and middle stages. THE MIG raced three wide without cover for the majority of the race.	
Race 3	MICO'S-STEVE'S PLUMBING & GAS 1300
PHEROZ FLAME (G Cooksley) sprung both hind plates with Stewards granting permission for the mare to have the plates removed and race without these plates. PHEROZ FLAME and MAREEBA (T Thornton) were slow to begin, and then came together.	

Race 4	BDO TAURANGA-EXCEPTIONAL CLIENT SERVICE 1200
<p>AIRFIELD ROAD dislodged rider M Coleman when being loaded in the barrier and escaped. AIRFIELD ROAD was quickly recaptured and passed fit to run by the veterinarian.</p> <p>FLOWER BOMB (S Collett) proved difficult to load with co-trainer Mr P Williams being advised that a warning would be placed against the mare's barrier manners.</p> <p>FOREFRONT (T Thornton) and JOHN GRAY (M Hills) were both slow to begin.</p> <p>FLOWER BOMB and QUEENS ROSE (V Colgan) came together leaving the barrier.</p>	
Race 5	VARIETY BASH 1400
<p>CLARA JANE (L Magorrian) jumped away awkwardly.</p> <p>MAKARSKA (M Coleman) was slow to begin.</p> <p>IRISH HEARTBEAT (M Hills) and MAKARSKA made brief contact near the 100 metres when both runners shifted ground.</p>	
Race 6	BARRETT HOMES – MAKING THINGS HAPPEN 2100
<p>LADY SAYYIDA (V Colgan) was slow to begin.</p> <p>Approaching the 2000 metres SECOND INNINGS (J Oliver) shifted in and away from KEEPHER CLOSE (L Magorrian) crowding QUINTASTICS (M Coleman) on to LIL MISS WAITOKI (C Lammas) with QUINTASTICS and LIL MISS WAITOKI both being hampered and steadied. Contributing to the incident was some outward movement from LADY SAYYIDA. Apprentice riders L Magorrian and J Oliver were advised to exercise greater care in similar circumstances. EL PISTOLA (P Holmes) was also hampered as a result.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of EL PISTOLA rider P Holmes advised that the mare had not been entirely comfortable in the existing track conditions.</p>	
Race 7	PACIFIC COAST TECHNICAL INSTITUTE 1200
<p>CASINO PARK (C Lammas) and COOKIE MONSTER (M Hills) were slow to begin.</p> <p>POPP 'N LINDAUER (B R Jones) and INCREDITABLE HULK (L Magorrian) both began awkwardly, losing ground.</p> <p>ARTIFACT (M Chui) was crowded shortly after the start and steadied.</p> <p>Passing the 350 metres CASINO PARK lay out making contact with FLYING FANTASY (J Oliver).</p> <p>PURCENTAGE (V Colgan) raced in restricted room entering the final straight.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of COOKIE MONSTER rider M Hills advised that the gelding had travelled well in the early and middle stages, but had failed to respond once placed under pressure. COOKIE MONSTER underwent a subsequent veterinary examination which failed to find any obvious abnormality.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of PURCENTAGE V Colgan advised that after rider had not travelled as well as expected, and had failed to respond to pressure. A subsequent veterinary examination failed to find any obvious abnormality.</p> <p>An inquiry was opened into the riding tactics aboard ALICUDI (S Collett). ALICUDI underwent a veterinary examination failed to find any obvious abnormality.</p>	
Race 8	TELFERYOUNG VALUERS & PROPERTY ADVISORS 1600
<p>PUMP UP THE VOLUME (V Gatu) and GREY POWER (C Lammas) were both crowded leaving the barrier.</p> <p>TAAXMAN (A Jones) began awkwardly.</p> <p>OHOPE PRINCE (B R Jones) over-raced in the early and middle stages.</p> <p>Approaching the 1200 metres RE DEEL (T Thornton) had to steady when awkwardly placed on the heels of GUSTAVO (L Innes) which shifted out.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of GREY POWER rider C Lammas was of the opinion that the gelding had not been entirely comfortable in today's track conditions, and would further improve with the outing.</p>

<p>ST D'ORE (J Oliver), MRS SIN (B R Jones) and EDWARD THE EIGHTH (Z Moki) were all slow to begin.</p> <p>HAMACHO (V Colgan) raced keenly in the early and middle stages.</p> <p>HAMACHO was inclined to lay out when placed under pressure in the final straight.</p>
