RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	WESTEND BOWLING CLUB MAIDEN (1800 metres)
<p>SAKURA and CLYDE were slow away.</p> <p>I'M HARRY had to be steadied near the 1600 metres when crowded for room by IMPERIAL DUKE which was taken in by SELINE, which shifted inwards slightly when being restrained. Rider M Cameron was advised to exercise greater care. When being steadied I'M HARRY dropped back on to DURHAM ROSE and EASTER UPRISING.</p> <p>PENTECOUP over raced badly outside the leader through the early and middle stages.</p> <p>CLYDE commenced to over race badly passing the 1000 metres having to be firmly restrained off heels for a distance.</p> <p>LYKAROC over raced in the middle stages.</p> <p>When questioned into the run of PENTICOUP rider J Parkes stated the gelding over raced throughout and had little left at the finish. PENTICOUP underwent a post race veterinary inspection which failed to reveal any abnormality.</p> <p>SAKURA raced three wide without cover throughout.</p> <p>R Hutchings (IMPERIAL DUKE) dropped his whip passing the 50 metres.</p> <p>Trainer G MacBeth (SAKURA) was spoken to regarding the addition of rings after weighing out.</p> <p>L Magorrian reported that the track was too firm for KING PHEROZ.</p> <p>Following the running of race one the track conditions were upgraded to (Good 2), but due to a communication breakdown between the Club and on course TAB staff some outlets were not made aware of the upgrade. Further enquiries will be</p>	

made.	
Race 2	STELLA ARTOIS MAIDEN 3YO (1100 metres)
<p>DONLEE was slow away.</p> <p>PAINTBALL began awkwardly shifting outwards bumping ROCKAFILLY which was forced on to JEWEL OF THE NAKI.</p> <p>PAINTBALL shifted outwards abruptly away from MUCHADO near the 950 metres.</p> <p>MUCHADO then shifted outwards across the heels of ROCKAFILLY with PAINTBALL again shifting away from that runner when racing greenly.</p> <p>DONLEE was held up rounding the final turn.</p> <p>JEWEL OF THE NAKI was held up entering the final straight near the 350 metres and continued to have difficulty obtaining clear running until near the 100 metres.</p> <p>D Turner advised that his mount CALL DOUBT had felt the firm nature of today's track conditions.</p>	
Race 3	ECOLAB MAIDEN (1200 metres)
<p>ALY'S BELT began very awkwardly shifting outwards severely hampering LAST MESSAGE which was crowded on to the hind quarters BELLE CADEAU for some distance with LAST MESSAGE losing considerably ground as a result.</p> <p>PERFECTLYENCHANTED was slow away.</p> <p>BELLE CADEAU was restrained to avoid the heels of TOMBOLA approaching the 1000 metres.</p> <p>TEMPLE TIGER over raced in the middle stages.</p> <p>SILVER BUBBLES raced three wide without cover.</p> <p>Passing the 300 metres WILLBEOKAY became awkwardly placed on the heels on the weakening OUR BOI MAX and raced greenly when being steadied to shift across that runner's heels, ducking outwards abruptly and briefly inconveniencing PERFECTLYENCHANTED.</p> <p>M Cameron was unable to offer any excuses for the poor performance of OUR BOI MAX. A post race veterinary examination failed to reveal any abnormality.</p>	
Race 4	DENIS WHEELER EARTHMOVING MAIDEN (1400 metres)
<p>SILKYSAND, ZENOAH, I CANDY and THORNY were all slow away.</p> <p>MISS KAYLEE began awkwardly.</p> <p>ZENOAH over raced in the middle stages.</p> <p>KALDOREI raced three wide without cover.</p> <p>ZENOAH shifted outwards approaching the 600 metres dictating BIGREDMOON which was improving to its outside wider on the track.</p> <p>EFFECTAV raced greenly under pressure in the final straight.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of SKYWARDS rider D Johnson advised that in her opinion the mare had held its breath, recommending to connections the application of a tongue tie for its next start. A post race veterinary inspection including an endoscopic examination did not reveal any abnormalities.</p> <p>MISS KAYLEE required post race veterinary attention for a laceration to the right fore pastern.</p>	
Race 5	COMCAT MAIDEN 3YO (1600 metres)
<p>SUCHAPALAVA began awkwardly further hampering VICTORY DRIVE which had been slow to begin. VICTORY DRIVE then became tailed off in the early stages remaining distant last for the remainder of the race.</p> <p>Rider O Bosson reported that the gelding had hung throughout which in his opinion may have been due to VICTORY DRIVE feeling the track conditions. A post race veterinary examination failed to reveal any abnormalities. The connections were advised that a warning would be placed against VICTORY DRIVE due to its racing manners.</p> <p>LOLA TREVOLA began awkwardly hampering CRAFTY LADY which lost ground.</p> <p>THE DEPOSIT began awkwardly hampering TRUE SECRET which lost ground.</p> <p>ANGELICA ROX made the 400 metre bend awkwardly shifted out hampering CANDYBELLE and THE DEPOSIT.</p> <p>THE DEPOSIT was inclined to shift inwards in the home straight and had to be straightened on a numbers occasions momentarily inconveniencing CANDYBELLE near the finish.</p> <p>M Hills reported that in his opinion CRAFTY LADY may be better suited to any easing of the ground.</p>	
Race 6	DECEMBER 22ND TWILIGHT R65 (1600 metres)
<p>SECONDS OUT and CHEEKY BOY came together leaving the barriers.</p> <p>ADRIENNE was slow away.</p> <p>ASHALINI raced three wide without cover.</p> <p>CHOICE had to be restrained off heels going into the bend near the 800 metres dropping back on to CHEEKY BOY which shifted outwards hampering VICTOR HUGO and our PRINCESS ZARA. VICTOR HUGO then raced wide without cover around</p>	

the bend.

ZAFRENZY was held up for a short distance rounding the turn.

SHEZASTUNNA was unable to obtain clear running throughout the final straight.

SECONDS OUT and **ZAFRENZY** bumped on a number of occasions just short of the finish.

ASHALINI lost the left hind plate during the running.

Race 7	FORMAN COMMERCIAL INTERIORS R65 (1400 metres)

POROTENE CHANCE refused to leave the barriers at the start taking no effective part in the race. Trainer Mr P Pascoe was advised that **POROTENE CHANCE** is now required to barrier trial to the satisfaction of a Stipendiary Steward prior to racing again. The connections were of the opinion that the mare had resented the application of a tongue tie which it had been wearing for the first time on race day today. **POROTENE CHANCE** was observed to a small amount of blood present in the right nostril which was found to be from a small laceration.

I SUGGEST was slow away.

SINGAPORE GIRL began awkwardly losing ground.

WHATWEDO raced three wide without cover.

O Bosson reported that in his opinion his mount **BRAH SPRING** did not prefer the firm nature of the track.

Race 8	REVITAL FERTILISERS R65 (2000 metres)

KEWZERO was slow to begin.

DOING TIME began awkwardly and was slow away.

PADDY JO over raced early.

DOING TIME and **HIGHLAND ROSE** were held up rounding the final turn when racing in restricted room.

KEWZERO was momentarily held up near the top of the home straight. Rider M Hills advised that in his opinion the filly would prefer any easing in the ground.
