## RACE COMMENTS:

<b>Race 1</b>	<b>WARRNAMBOOL RACING CARNIVAL R65 &amp; JUMPERS 2000</b>
<p>The start of this race was delayed two and a half minutes due to <b>PICCADILLY</b> escaping from behind the barriers, galloping an excessive distance and taking a considerable time to be captured. In consequence <b>PICCADILLY</b> was declared a late scratching by order of the Stewards at 12:48pm.</p> <p><b>ENDOR</b> was slow to begin.</p> <p><b>SUPERCHARGED</b> was inclined to over race in the early stages.</p> <p><b>RED SUNSET</b> lay in under pressure in the final straight.</p> <p>When questioned into the disappointing run of <b>VETTEL</b> rider L Innes had no tangible excuse.</p>	
<b>Race 2</b>	<b>STELLA ARTOIS SC MDN SP COND 1800M</b>
<p><b>MACKLEMORE</b> shifted out on jumping hampering <b>POSTBOY</b> which lost ground.</p> <p><b>SAKURA</b> and <b>POSTBOY</b> both made the first bend awkwardly shifting wider on the track.</p> <p><b>SAKURA</b> raced wide from the 1000 metres.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the run of <b>POSTBOY</b> rider H Tinsley reported that the gelding had been unsuited to the indifferent tempo and had been unable to make any discernible ground over the final stages.</p> <p>Rider <b>V Johnston</b> (FIXATES) was reminded of her obligations with respect to the use of the whip when out of contention.</p>	
<b>Race 3</b>	<b>ENERGY VETS TARANAKI LTD SC MDN SP COND 1400</b>

<p><b>NOMISMA</b> was slow away.</p> <p><b>SILVER BUBBLES</b> and <b>ISOLA BELLA</b> raced keenly over the early stages.</p> <p><b>KAHUI LAD</b> had to steady off the heels of <b>ISOLA BELLA</b> near the 900 metres when <b>ISOLA BELLA</b> steadied.</p> <p><b>WHEELER FORTUNE</b> had to shift ground outwards to improve near the 200 metres.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of <b>NOMISMA</b> rider L Innes reported the filly had raced greenly throughout and in his opinion would benefit with experience. A post-race veterinary examination of <b>NOMISMA</b> did not reveal any abnormality.</p>	
<b>Race 4</b>	<b>METRO DIRECT INSPIRATIONS IN GLASS R75 1600</b>
<p><b>HIGH SOCIETY</b> began awkwardly and shifted out hampering <b>PACHENKO</b>.</p> <p><b>PACHENKO</b> commenced to over race entering the back straight having to be steadied, <b>PACHENKO</b> then raced three wide throughout.</p> <p><b>SKY CHI</b> was held up briefly near the 250 metres prior to being angled outwards to improve.</p> <p>On returning to scale L Innes reported concerns with the actions of <b>PACHENKO</b>. Stewards ordered a veterinary examination of the gelding which did not reveal any abnormality.</p>	
<b>Race 5</b>	<b>PHOEMIX PARK 2YO CLASSIC 1200</b>
<p><b>MAGIC DANCER</b> shifted out at the start simultaneously as <b>GIRLSAREBACKINTOWN</b> jumped in resulting in tightening to <b>ENSHRINE</b> and <b>IN ANOTHER LIFE</b> which got back.</p> <p><b>OUR ROKKII</b> made the first turn awkwardly near the 800 metres when three wide without cover.</p> <p><b>GIRLSAREBACKINTOWN</b> was held up rounding the turn and near the 200 metres, when attempting a narrow run, bumped with <b>SOUTHERN HUSSLER</b> and <b>IN ANOTHER LIFE</b>.</p> <p><b>ENSHRINE</b> lay out under pressure in the final straight.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the run of <b>BENOIT</b> rider K Myers reported the filly had felt flat throughout and finished the race off only fairly in the home straight.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the run of <b>HALLELOOJAH</b> apprentice R Hutchings reported that the colt had travelled comfortably throughout however when pressured had failed to respond and was disappointing. Trainer G Rogerson advised that the colt may have been affected by the firm going.</p>	
<b>Race 6</b>	<b>COCA COLA DASH OPEN HANDICAP 1100</b>
<p>The start of this race was delayed five and a half minutes after <b>STEEL ROSE</b>, <b>FLOWER BOMB</b>, and <b>COSMIC CUBE</b> all proved difficult to load.</p> <p><b>STEEL ROSE</b> shifted out abruptly on jumping severely hampering <b>SHELFORD</b> which lost ground.</p> <p><b>MAGIC SHAFT</b> jumped in at the start tightening <b>ANTONIA LOMBARDO</b>.</p> <p><b>DEELIGNA</b> raced fiercely when being restrained near the 800 metres and got its head up proving very difficult to control.</p> <p><b>MAGIC SHAFT</b> raced wide without cover throughout.</p> <p><b>SHELFORD</b> had to steady momentarily near the 600 metres when awkwardly near the heels of <b>CATWOMANDO</b>.</p> <p><b>SHELFORD</b> was held up rounding the turn and early in the final straight, only obtaining clear running near the 150 metres.</p> <p><b>MAGIC SHAFT</b> raced in restricted room for a short distance near the 250 metres.</p> <p><b>SCAPOLO</b> had to shift ground outwards to improve near the 250 metres.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the run of <b>STEEL ROSE</b> rider R Myers reported that the mare had been inclined to over race in the middle stages which proved detrimental to its chances.</p> <p><b>FLOWER BOMB</b> which was fractious in the barrier, returned to the enclosure with blood present in a nostril consistent with having hit the front of its gate, which a subsequent veterinary inspection revealed a minor nasal laceration.</p>	
<b>Race 7</b>	<b>HOOKER PACIFIC TARANAKI CUP OPN HCP 1800</b>
<p><b>KAWI</b> began awkwardly and was slow away.</p> <p><b>SILVERDALE</b> was slow away.</p> <p><b>LOVESTHESHOW</b> raced wide into and rounding the first turn.</p> <p><b>ATTIVAREE</b> raced three wide without cover until near the 1000 metres.</p> <p><b>SILVERDALE</b> was held up and unable to improve until passing the 200 metres.</p> <p><b>LIKEAPINS</b> was held up rounding the turn and did not obtain clear running until near the 200 metres.</p> <p><b>CAPONE</b> had to be angled wide to improve near the 200 metres.</p> <p><b>JUST THE TIP</b> returned to the enclosure with blood present in both nostrils. A subsequently veterinary examination revealed the gelding to have bled and consequently stood down from racing for three months.</p>	
<b>Race 8</b>	<b>PLATINUM HOMES OAKS PRELUDE 3YO 1800</b>
<p><b>DIXIE EXPRESS</b> was slow to begin.</p> <p><b>ANA</b> lay out shortly after leaving the barriers.</p> <p><b>TWIST AND TURN</b> jumped inward at the start inconveniencing <b>SKYWEKA</b>.</p> <p><b>TWIST AND TURN</b> had to steady near the winning post on the first occasion when awkwardly near the heels of <b>THE AULD FLOOZIE</b>.</p>	

**ACQUISTO, TWIST AND TURN, STARS IN ALIGN** and **QUEENOFTHEPALACE** all had to steady near the 1600 metres when the tempo eased. **QUEENOFTHEPALACE** was then taken forward to race adjacent to the leader near the 1000 metres. **CONSENSUS** was angled very wide rounding the final turn to make its finishing run and was then inclined to lay in under pressure in the home straight.

**SKYWEKA** was held up for a short distance passing the 400 metres.

**DIXIE EXPRESS** gave ground over the final stages finishing well back. When questioned rider D Bradley reported that in his opinion the filly was feeling the effects of the firm nature of today's track.

<b>Race 9</b>	<b>THE WATERFRONT HOTEL R85 1400</b>

**MISS DAISY** lay in shortly after leaving the barriers crowding **BRAVE KAT** in on to **DON'T GLOAT** which had to steady.

**AGENT ZIVA** over raced in the middle stages.

**MISS DAISY** raced three wide throughout.

**CASINO** was held up passing the 500 metres until near the 300 metres.

**CASINO** had to steady near the 200 metres when attempting to improve into a marginal run to the inside of **VINCENT STREET** which lay in under pressure.

**AGENT ZIVA** was held up rounding the turn and only obtained clear running near the 100 metres.

**AGENT ZIVA** was accidentally struck with the whip approaching the 100 metres.

**CORRIANDER** gave ground over the final stages finishing well back. When questioned rider R Myers could offer no excuse other than that the mare had been disappointing. A veterinary examination of **CORRIANDER** revealed a minor laceration to the nasal area consistent with striking the barriers before the start.

**S Doyle (CASINO)** was reminded of his obligations to ride fully to the finish when circumstances permit after he relaxed his ride noticeably over the concluding stages, narrowly maintaining fourth position.

**DON'T GLOAT** lost the near front plate during the running.
