RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1 THE EDGE 97.8 WAIKATO 1600

MATIMBA (B R Jones) made contact with MATO GROSSO (R Hannam) leaving the barriers.

FULL COUNT (V Colgan) was crowded jumping away.

TRAVEL WISE (R Hutchings) made contact with **FLYING ORCA** (D Johnson) approaching the 1200 metres, with **FULL COUNT** then shifting away from **FLYING ORCA** when placed in restricted room to the inside of that runner, crowding **BRONTE LASS** (L Magorrian) which had to steady.

CAPONE (M Coleman) and **FULL COUNT** were inclined to over-race in the middle stages.

TRAVEL WISE raced wide without cover throughout, and hung outwards rounding the bend running wide around the final turn. **TRAVEL WISE** was not persevered with over the final 250 metres when well beaten. A post-race veterinary examination did not reveal any abnormality.

V Colgan admitted a breach of careless riding in that he angled his mount **FULL COUNT** outwards approaching the 400 metres when there was insufficient room to do so making contact with **MATO GROSSO**. After hearing submissions the Judicial Committee suspended V Colgan's licence to ride in races from the conclusion of racing on Saturday 14 February until the conclusion of racing on Sunday 22 February, 5 riding days. **FULL COUNT** and **MATO GROSSO** continued to come together for some distance with **MATO GROSSO** becoming unbalanced.

FLYING ORCA had difficulty obtaining clear running between the 200 metres until passing the 100 metres.

FULL COUNT lost the right hind plate during the running.

Race 2 BLOODSTOCK ACHIEVING XCELLENCE LTD 1200

VEGAS FLING (M Du Plessis) requiring farrier attention prior to the start after casting a front plate with the race running late as a result.

ENSHRINE (M Cameron) began awkwardly before being further hampered when crowded by **STARSTRIPE** (M McNab) which shifted inwards abruptly.

FANATIC (C Grylls) began awkwardly losing ground.

ELEMENT (K Myers) and SHE IS STRYKING (M Coleman) both began a little awkwardly.

LAUBERHORN (D Johnson) made the turn near the 800 metres awkwardly.

STARSTRIPE over-raced in the middle stages, and when being restrained near the 700 metres went back on to **SHE IS STRYKING**.

ELEMENT hung outwards rounding the final turn, and continued to do so in the final straight.

FANATIC had to change ground on a number of occasions in the final straight to obtain clear running.

Race 3 THE GOLDSMITHS GALLERY 1400

UNKNOWN PLEASURES (M Du Plessis) began awkwardly making contact with the hind quarters of **SEIZE THE MOMENT** (D Johnson) which became briefly unbalanced.

SEIZE THE MOMENT raced ungenerously when being steadied for a distance passing the 1100 metres.

CURIOUS (M McNab) raced wide without cover throughout.

KLITSCHKO (N Harris) was held up near the 300 metres.

Race 4

PROCUREMENT (C Grylls) had difficulty obtaining clear running in the final straight until near the 150 metres.

BELL NEUHAUSER MATTHEWS OPTOMETRISTS 1600

SHINING BRAVE dislodged rider M Coleman during its preliminary. After being quickly recaptured and undergoing a veterinary examination **SHINING BRAVE** was passed fit to run.

HVALA (M Cameron) which had been fractious in the barriers reared as the start was effected losing considerable ground. Following the race co-trainer Mrs D Logan filed a request for a ruling as to whether **HVALA** had been denied a fair start. After viewing video footage and hearing submissions the Judicial Committee confirmed **HVALA** to have been a starter. Mrs Logan was advised that a warning would be placed against the filly for its barrier manners.

SHINING BRAVE stumbled shortly after leaving the barriers losing ground.

M Hills was suspended from the conclusion of racing on Saturday 14 February until the conclusion of racing on Saturday 21 February, 4 riding days, after admitting a breach of careless riding in that he permitted his mount **EMERALD LADY** to shift outwards when not sufficiently clear of **ENDEAN ROSE** (M Du Plessis) which was checked near the 500 metres.

EMERALD LADY was briefly held up near the 450 metres.

Race 5 CAMBRIDGE STUD SIR TRISTRAM FILLIES CLASSIC

EXQUISITE JEWEL (R Hannam) and **TAVY** (D Johnson) began awkwardly losing ground.

PALACE ROCK (M Du Plessis) had to be steadied when awkwardly placed on the heels of **PLATINUM WITNESS** (D Bradley) which shifted inwards approaching the 1800 metres. D Bradley was advised to exercise greater care.

EXQUISITE JEWEL (R Hannam) raced keenly through the middle stages.

VAVASOUR (L Innes) lay out rounding the final turn making contact with CHARMONT (O Bosson).

VAVASOUR lay out under pressure making slight contact with CHARMONT near the 100 metres.

A post-race veterinary examination of **DE KENSINGTON OVAL**, which dropped out to finish a distant last, did not reveal any significant abnormality. Rider V Colgan was unable to offer any excuses other than possibly feeling the firm nature of the footing.

Race 6 MEDIAWORKS RADIO WAIKATO 2400

QUEST (B R Jones) lost its footing leaving the barriers losing ground.

FULL MONTY (M Cameron) was inclined to over-race in the early stages getting its head up when being restrained to avoid the heels of **I'LL'AVA'ALF** (L Innes) near the 2100 metres.

ARIZONA JAZZ (M Du Plessis) underwent a post-race veterinary inspection, including endoscopic examination, with no abnormality detected.

Race 7HERBIE DYKE STAKES

BREAKING DAWN (M Coleman) shifted outwards leaving the barriers crowding **SORIANO** (R Hutchings) and **SHUKA** (D Johnson) on to **PONDAROSA MISS** (N Harris) which had been slow to begin, with **PONDAROSA MISS** clipping a heel of **SHUKA** (D Johnson) and blundering. Contributing was slight inward movement from **SURPASS** (O Bosson).

Rounding the turn approaching the 400 metres **NASHVILLE** (K Myers) lay in making contact with **SHUKA** simultaneously as **SURPASS** shifted outwards to obtain clear running resulting in **SHUKA** becoming awkwardly placed on the heels of **SURPASS**. O Bosson was advised to exercise greater care.

LAUREN TATE (L Innes) was held up rounding the final turn, and did not obtain clear running until angling outwards across the heels of **BREAKING DAWN** passing the 300 metres.

LAUREN TATE shifted inwards under pressure over the concluding stages inconveniencing **PONDAROSA MISS** just short of the finish.

When questioned regarding the disappointing performance of **SHUKA** D Johnson advised that the gelding had been flat throughout, and had never travelled comfortably. **SHUKA** required veterinary treatment post-race for a minor laceration to the left foreleg with no other obvious abnormalities detected.

HOLLYWOOD LAD (R Hutchings) and MACKA'S BACK (S Collett), which were both racing keenly when in restricted roo approaching the 1100 metres, then having to be firmly restrained when further crowded for room when INCREDITAB HULK (O Bosson) lay in. Contributing to the incident was some easing of the pace at that point of the race. THE DEPOSIT (V Colgan) over-raced for a distance when being restrained in the early stages, being inclined to rac	ce
ungenerously when being restrained hampering PANNO ROSSA (C Grylls) near the 1600 metres when shifting out to avo heels.	
SHEEZ ALL HEART (M Hills) raced keenly through the middle stages when leading.	
TABLE ONE (D Johnson) steadied to shift inwards across the heels of COPS 'N' COYOTE (B R Jones) near the 400 metres.	
RODDICK (L Magorrian) shifted outwards to obtain clear running near the 300 metres hampering the weakening TH	ΙE

GRINNER (O Bosson). L Magorrian was advised to exercise more care.

CHEEKY BOY (M Du Plessis) lay in under pressure inconveniencing **RULE THE COURT** (M Cameron) just short of the finish. When questioned regarding the performance of **THE GRINNER** rider O Bosson advised that after receiving a nice run the gelding had come under pressure approaching the 600 metres, failing to respond to his riding and being a beaten runner early in the final straight. O Bosson was of the opinion that the gelding may be feeling the effects of recent racing. Trainer Mr S McKee advised that he would be giving consideration to freshening **THE GRINNER**.
