RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	MARSDEN SHEARING MAIDEN
KEEN TEMPO (M McNelis) which was fractious in the barrier prior to the start, reared on jumping away.	
KALDOREI (S Doyle) shifted out leaving the barrier bumping with ARSALAN (J Parkes) which in turn bumped with OUR ROBERTO (B Lammas) .	
AWESOME PRINCESS (K Smith) was slow to begin.	
OUR ROBERTO raced keenly in the early stages and when being restrained near the 900 metres was inclined to get its head up.	
FIGURAC (H Tinsley) was held up and unable to obtain clear running until near the 50 metres.	
ARSALAN raced wide throughout.	
KEEN TEMPO disappointed finishing well back. Rider M McNelis had no tangible excuse. A subsequent veterinary inspection did not reveal any abnormality.	

Race 2	ARANUI HARVESTERS 3YO MAIDEN
<p>BARTOLI (D Turner) and MASTER JACK (B Lammas) were slow to begin. MAGGIE'S SECRET (K Smith) got its head up when being restrained passing the 1200 metres. SLIMLINE (n Teeluck) was held up rounding the turn and had to be steadied off the heels of SHE KNOWS passing the 700 metres. SHE KNOWS (L Allpress) raced greenly in the home straight and shifted in near the 200 metres prior to being straightened. Stewards ordered a post-race veterinary examination of MARSHALLA which finished a distant last after rider V Johnston reported there may have been something amiss with the filly. This revealed no obvious abnormalities.</p>	
Race 3	THE TANK GUY
<p>ITSALRIGHT was a late scratching on veterinary advice at 1.27pm after being injured (superficial lacerations) in the tie-up stalls. GEMMA LASS (M Dravitzki) was slow to begin (2 lengths) WORLDCLASS (L Allpress) lay out rounding the bend near the 900 metres becoming awkwardly placed inside the heels of REILLY LINCOLN (R Myers).</p>	
Race 4	MACDONALD FAMILY MAIDEN
<p>WINDERMERE LAD (M Dravitzki) jumped away awkwardly making contact with SENRORITA (R Goldsbury). PLATINUM SONG (B Lammas) was slow to begin. QUALITY CHEVAL (N Teeluck) over-raced in the early and middle stages. SENRORITA raced wide without cover throughout. Near the home straight entrance BARTHEZ (K Smith) had to be steadied when racing to the outside of JONQUIL which shifted out when improving and SANTA POINT (T Johnson) which shifted in. After questioning riders and viewing video footage it was considered both runners had contributed when shifting ground. Both R Myers and T Johnson were advised to exercise care when in similar circumstances. Stewards ordered a veterinary examination of PLATINUM SONG after rider B Lammas reported that the gelding failed to hit out at any stage during the race and finished tailed off. This revealed a slower than expected heart and respiratory recovery rate. When questioned into the performance of JONQUIL, R Myers reported that the filly should take natural improvement from the run and may be better suited to a longer distance. The winner, BUCK CANNON underwent veterinary treatment following the race for injuries to the front and near forelegs also the near hind leg after slipping and falling on the concrete area adjacent to the swab box. As a consequence, no swab was taken from the gelding.</p>	
Race 5	CARTERS ASHHURST POHANGINA CUP
<p>TOUCHE (L Allpress) was slow to begin and was then further hampered when SURREAL STORM (J Parkes) shifted out. IRISH ENCORE (H Tinsley) shifted in leaving the barriers making contact with VINCENT STREET (B Lammas). WILD ROCK (R Myers) was slow to begin. VINCENT STREET was held up in the early part of the home straight and had to be angled wide near the 200 metres to improve. TOUCHE was held up rounding the home turn for a short distance. Following the race B Lammas advised stewards that he had aggravated a shoulder injury and after being attended to by paramedics was stood down from his remaining engagements.</p>	
Race 6	ROWDEN ELECTRICAL SERVICES HANDICAP
<p>Rider S Doyle (HIPPIE) was over the carded weight (1kg) and due to there being no suitable replacement, was given permission to ride. Due to there being no senior riders available, permission was given for apprentice S Wynne to ride QUEENOFTHEPALACE replacing the injured B lammas. HIPPIE (S Doyle) began awkwardly and was slow away. POSTBOY (H Tinsley) was slow away. LORD CASANOVA (M Cropp) commenced to over-race in the back straight so was shifted off heels near the 1300 metres and in doing so hampered ROCK BAND (R Goldsbury) which had to steady. HIPPIE raced in restricted room for a short distance near the 200 metres. POSTBOY was held up for some distance in the home straight and immediately prior to the 100 metres was dictated wider by SLAZENJAH (M Dravitzki) which shifted out marginally. M Dravitzki was advised to exercise care. Also hampered was PERRY MASON (V Johnston) which had to steady. PERONI (R Myers) was unable to take advantage of a narrow run near the 250 metres so had to change ground outwards</p>	

to continue to improve.

LORD CASANOVA and **MASH (K Smith)** came together over the final stages.

J Parkes reported that **STAREKRA** raced greenly throughout and may benefit with the addition of blinkers.

Race 7

COMMERCIAL TAVERN ASHHUST HANDICAP

Apprentice **D Turner (EYEFUL TOWER)** was over the carded weight (1kg) and due to there being no suitable replacement, was given permission to ride.

KALINGA (N Teeluck) and **THE BEAUT (R Myers)** were slow away.

OUTOFTIME (M Dravitzki) was crowded leaving the barriers between **EYEFUL TOWER** which shifted in abruptly and **LE 'VANTOS (K Smith) which** shifted out.

KALINGA over-raced in the early and middle stages and when being steadied in the back straight shifted in and made contact with the running rail.

OUTOFTIME was unable to obtain clear running throughout the home straight.

SOUTHERN SECRET (H Tinsley) was held up in the home straight until over the final stages.

When questioned regarding the run of **THE BEAUT, R Myers** said that after missing the start the gelding settled back and was unable to make progress from thereon.

Race 8

RICHARD ALGAR LTD HANDICAP

BEL SORRISO (J Parkes) was slow to begin.

ON THE HILL (R Goldsbury) raced keenly in the early and middle stages and got its head up when being restrained.

ON THE HILL then raced three-wide without cover throughout.

A post-race veterinary examination was ordered by Stewards of **NIPPIN** after rider **S Doyle** reported that he felt something may be amiss with the gelding. This revealed no abnormality.
