RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	HOKONUI CONTRACTING LTD HANDICAP (2000M)
<p>CROYDON began awkwardly and lost ground.</p> <p>STELLA who was racing keenly had to steady passing the 1800 metres when NUTINEAR (C Johnson) shifted inwards. C Johnson was advised to exercise care.</p> <p>THE ENERGIZER raced wide through the middle stages.</p> <p>FLY ME TO DA MOON raced wide from the 1000 metres when improving forward to lead.</p> <p>REVENGE had to steady and shift ground outwards passing the 600 metres when held up by the tiring NUTINEAR.</p> <p>GOLD LEAF shifted in under pressure passing the 100 metres momentarily inconveniencing STELLA.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the apparent disappointing performance of STELLA apprentice rider C Barnes could offer no tangible excuses.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of favourite GOLD LEAF rider J Lowry advised the gelding had only battled fairly in the very testing Heavy 11 track conditions.</p>	
Race 2	CLOVER EXPORT MAIDEN (1100M)
<p>DISCUSSING FLAGS was very slow to begin settling several lengths off the back of the field.</p> <p>DOUBLE CHOICE raced keenly while leading through the early stages.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of favoured runner ZARINA apprentice rider H Bennet advised the mare had lay out throughout the running and had proved very disappointing.</p>	

Race 3	DAVIS SHEARING & LIVESTOCK SUPPLIES HANDICAP (1100M)
<p>LIBETTO bounded at the start losing ground.</p> <p>LET'S ESCAPE shifted in as the start was made making firm contact with MARKS.</p> <p>AVECHII and MARKS both raced keenly through the early stages.</p> <p>Passing the 400 metres the rider of POPP 'N' LINDAUER momentarily dropped his right hand rein.</p> <p>LET'S ESCAPE lay out early in the run home and had to be straightened passing the 150 metres.</p> <p>Rider R Bishop reported MARKS had lay out from the 400 metres and could not be ridden to any advantage over the concluding stages.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of LET'S ESCAPE apprentice rider K Kalychurun advised the mare had travelled well until the home turn however when placed under pressure had only battled over the concluding stages.</p>	
Race 4	GORE SEPTIC TANK CLEANERS MAIDEN (1200M)
<p>RUB IT IN was a late scratching at 12.24 p.m. when found to be lame in the near fore leg upon arrival at the course.</p> <p>ZAH GOOD ONE shifted out at the start hampering CRISTALLO who lost ground.</p> <p>Shortly after the start LORD BEAVER lay out crowding DIVA'S HALO and JANEFIELD JEWEL.</p> <p>Passing the 1000 metres DIVA'S HALO who was laying out shifted away from LORD BEAVER crowding JANEFIELD JEWEL who was buffeted for several strides. The trailing LOCHAN ORA had to be steadied at this point.</p> <p>Apprentice riders K Kalychurun and R Black reported their respective runners LOCHAN ORA and ZAH GOOD ONE had failed to handle today's Heavy track conditions.</p> <p>Stewards ordered a post-race veterinary examination of KILMARNOC which revealed the gelding to have a minor laceration to its left hind leg which did not require treatment.</p>	
Race 5	ABERNETHY CONTRACTING HANDICAP (1335M)
<p>IRISH EXCUSE got its head up when racing keenly through the early stages.</p> <p>IRISH EXCUSE lay out passing the 100 metres and had to be straightened.</p> <p>Stewards ordered a post-race veterinary examination of SUREASYOUWEREBORN which tailed the field throughout and finished in a distant last placing. The subsequent examination revealed no clinical abnormalities.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of FASTFOOT apprentice rider J Lowry advised the gelding had failed to handle the prevailing Heavy track conditions.</p>	
Race 6	GORE TOWN & COUNTRY CLUB RESTAURANT MAIDEN (1335M)
<p>WHATWASTHAT was slow to begin.</p> <p>STAGE DOOR began awkwardly losing some ground.</p> <p>RHYTHMINYAFEET who was racing greenly shifted out passing the 1100 metres placing PADDY BLACK in restricted room for several strides. RHYTHMINYAFEET continued to race greenly and passing the 1000 metres shifted out taking HAVANA outwards on to HARDY'S REVENGE who in turn made contact with ZAH KEISHA with both these runners being unbalanced and buffeted for a stride.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performances of HARDY'S REVENGE and STAGE DOOR respective riders T Direen and T Moseley advised their runners had failed to handle today's Heavy 11 track conditions.</p> <p>Following the running of this event A Hoffman, the trainer of HARDY'S REVENGE reported the gelding had returned to the stabling area showing signs of soreness in its hind quarters. Stewards ordered a post-race veterinary examination of HARDY'S REVENGE which revealed the gelding to be suffering from soreness in the hamstrings of both hind legs requiring some remedial treatment.</p>	
Race 7	AON INSURANCE BROKERS HANDICAP (1335M)
<p>Both DREAMWORLD and THE ROOK began awkwardly losing ground.</p> <p>GOOD BYE SENORITA had to shift ground inwards passing the 900 metres when becoming awkwardly placed on the heels of SANDY'S STAR.</p> <p>CENTAVADA lay out throughout the running and could not be ridden to any advantage in the home straight. Rider R Bishop advised he has asked the trainer to make some alterations to the gelding's gear.</p> <p>Apprentice rider G Jogoo (GOLDEN TOWER) accidentally lost his whip passing the 200 metres.</p> <p>When spoken to regarding the performance of favoured runner THE ROOK apprentice rider J Lowry advised the mare had struggled in the testing ground today after not having raced for five weeks however would derive natural benefit from today's race.</p>
