ANOTHER GIRL made contact with SILENCER (C Grylls) when attempting to obtain clear running passing the 400 metres.

Cowley's Hire Centre 1200 Race 2

ITELLYOUONETHING (T Thornton) jumped inwards at the start, hampering SHOW LOVER (A Schwerin) which lost ground.

SECLUDED (M Cameron) and AMPARO (A Collett) were slow away.

FLYING ON RED (C Lammas) raced ungenerously when being steadied in the middle stages.

AMPARO raced wide without cover throughout.

MAASHKA (S Spratt) commenced to race ungenerously when being restrained and approaching the 900 metres and was then was crowded to the inside of AMPARO which laying in. As a result FLYING ON RED and

ITELLYOUONETHING which were racing to the inside of MAASHKA were both steadied. . .

RUBY FOUR SHOES (M Coleman) lay out rounding the final turn.

SUGGESTIONS (M McNab) was held up early in the final straight.

SUGGESTIONS was denied clear running when attempting a marginal run between **RUBY FOUR SHOES** and **AMPARO** which shifted in slightly approaching the 200 metres. **SUGGESTIONS** was then steadied and shifted to the outside of **AMPARO** near the 150 metres to obtain clear running.

The connections of the second placed horse **SUGGESTIONS** wished to view Stewards' footage alleging interference approaching the 200 metres by the winner **AMPARO**, electing not to proceed with a protest.

Race 3

Tavistock Syndicate Owners 2YO

ZAVISTIC (M Cameron) raced ungenerously through the middle stages.

FLAME N FORTUNE (L Magorrian) raced wide without cover.

LADY HASS (M McNab) was inclined to lay in and away from **SPINDLE** (S Spratt) when that runner improved to its outside early in the final straight when racing greenly.

When questioned regarding the improved performance of **SPINDLE** Mr S McKee was at a loss to explain the failure at Te Rapa on 7 May 2016, further advising that the filly had worked well leading into todays' race and the addition of blinkers today had been beneficial.

AGENT PROVOCATEUR underwent a veterinary examination following the race which could find no abnormalities.

Race 4

Lion Red 1400

THE KAIHU KID (T Wenn) refused to leave the barriers on terms with the rest of the field losing considerable ground and effectively its chance in the race. Trainer Mr C Stevenson was advised that **THE KAIHU KID** would be required to barrier trial to the satisfaction of Stewards before racing next. Trainer Mr C Stevenson advised that he would give consideration to spelling **THE KAIHU KID**.

RUM'N'COKE (U Holmquist) was slow to begin.

GRAZIA (S McKay) began awkwardly, inconveniencing **BUBBLEBUBBLE POP** (D Danis), **MONGOLIAN SPEAR** (L Magorrian) and **AFFOGATO** (A Jones).

RUM'N'COKE over-raced when being restrained near the 1000 metres and continued to do so through the middle stages.

GRAZIA lay out early in the final straight becoming awkwardly placed on heels passing the 300 metres.

CAMEAHOTFRIDAY (A Schwerin) shifted out under pressure passing the 250 metres inconveniencing **AFFOGATO**.

Race 5

Waipu Hotel 1400

GREENCAST (S Collett) began awkwardly, hampering **PICNIC BAY** (M Coleman) which was crowded on to **NATURAL VITALITY** (T Thornton).

MAKDANIFE (L Tiley) began awkwardly, making contact with **INNAMINCKA** (C Lammas) which was forced on to **SUN HOUSE** (C Grylls).

BELLA BLUE (L Magorrian) jumped away awkwardly.

SEATTLE (A Collett) had to be steadied when awkwardly placed on the heels of **PICNIC BAY** near the 850 metres.

GREENCAST had to steady when laying in and becoming awkwardly placed on heels passing the 450 metres.

SEATTLE had to steady when awkwardly placed on heels passing the 400 metres.

INNAMINCKA was steadied approaching the 250 metres when briefly crowded between **NEEDLEPOINT** (M McNab) and **GREENCAST**, both of which shifted ground slightly.

GREENCAST lay in badly in the final straight placing Rider S Collett at a disadvantage. S Collett reported that the gelding had hung throughout.

Race 6

David Cairns – Thank You For 24 Years Of Service

CADUCEUS (M Coleman) and **SHEEZ THE BOSS** (M Cameron) were crowded at the start between **SOLO** (T Thornton) and **OCEAN BOUND** (E Farr) which both began awkwardly.

GLOBAL WARRIOR (S Spratt) was slow away.

OCEAN BOUND raced three wide without cover until improving forward to sit outside the leader near the 1100 metres.

TEENA ROX (A Collett) shifted out off heels passing the 700 metres forcing **SOLO** and **SHEEZ THE BOSS** wider on the track.

Race 7 Adams Trimmer Insurance 1400

CELTIC BOY (M Coleman) and **ROYAL RAINE** (T Thornton) were slow away.

LORD AND MASTER (U Holmquist) was held up early in the final straight shifting out approaching the 300 metres to obtain clear running.

LUCKY HEIGHTS (M Cameron) was briefly steadied approaching the 300 metres when awkwardly placed.

CELTIC BOY had difficulty obtaining clear running until near the 200 metres.

Race 8 Ford Kuga 1200

STRIKING ACHIEVER (T Thornton) blundered when leaving the barriers, making contact with **WHERE THERES SMOKE** (L Magorrian).

SPIDER (L Satherley) jumped away awkwardly and shifted inwards hampering **MUSCADET** (M McNab) which lost ground.

I'VERACEDFIFTY (S Collett) was slow away.

SPIDER and **THE IRISH BOUNTY** (S Spratt) both tended to over-race when the pace eased in the middle stages.

SPIDER raced in restricted room over the concluding stages.
