TAVY (D Johnson) was a little slow to begin.

TOMORROWLAND (C Grylls) over-raced when being restrained in the early to middle stages.

NATUZZI raced ungenerously for a distance from near the 900 metres.

BREAKING DAWN (M Du Plessis) raced wide without cover from the 800 metres.

TAVY was unable to obtain clear running early in the final straight having to be angled outwards across heels near the 300 metres.

MISS FOXWOOD (V Colgan) was held up early in the final straight, and continued to have difficulty obtaining clear running until near the 150 metres.

MOSSE (S Collett) and **BECHTOLSHEIMER** (M McNab) were both held up rounding the final turn with **BECHTOLSHEIMER** continuing to be held up until near the 250 metres.

GUSTAVO (O Bosson) raced wide without cover throughout.

MISS FOXWOOD lost the left front plate during the running.

NATUZZI returned to the enclosure bleeding profusely from a laceration to the Palmar Digital Artery on the left foreleg requiring veterinary treatment.

A post-race veterinary examination of **TOMORROWLAND** which weakened appreciably over the final 250 metres to finish a distant last did not reveal any abnormality. Rider C Grylls advised that the gelding had not helped its chances by over-racing badly. When questioned trainer Ms D Guy advised that the gelding's preparation had been affected to a degree following its win at Otaki on 27 November due to an issue with bruised soles. Ms Guy further advised that

TOMORROWLAND had been swum for a few days as an alternative, and following its two track gallops this week she had been satisfied with its condition leading into today's race, but felt that the gelding had raced in a fresher state than she had anticipated with particular regard to stepping up to the 1400 metres of today's race. Ms Guy was reminded by the Stipendiary Stewards that in future she must report any issues that issue which may potentially affect the running of one of the horses in her care.

Race 7 SKYCITY HAMILTON WAIKATO CUP

MANGAROA FLO JO (A Jones) lost its footing and blundered jumping away losing ground.

DELAGO'S SECRET (S Collett) began awkwardly.

APACHE FIREWORKS (T Thornton) knuckled leaving the barriers.

DUBAI SHUFFLE (M Du Plessis) was slow away.

APACHE FIREWORKS had to be restrained to avoid the heels of **STORMING THE TOWER** (C Grylls) which shifted inwards near the 2200 metres when not fully clear. C Grylls was advised to exercise more care. **APACHE FIREWORKS** then raced ungenerously for a distance.

THE TIDY EXPRESS (M McNab) angled outwards to obtain clear running near the 250 metres making contact with **DECORAH** (O Bosson) which was forced onto **APACHE FIREWORKS.** Prior to the authorisation of dividends the connections of **DECORAH** viewed Stewards film footage before electing not to proceed with a protest. Rider M McNab was advised to exercise greater care.

M McNab (THE TIDY EXPRESS) dropped his whip passing the 150 metres.

Shortly after passing the winning post VAVASOUR (D Johnson) ducked outwards abruptly with both THE TIDY EXPRESS and DECORAH having to be checked to avoid the heels of VAVASOUR.

When questioned regarding the performance of **SAINT EMILION** rider M Cameron was of the opinion that the gelding may be feeling the effects of recent racing. Co-trainer Mr A Forsman indicated that **SAINT EMILION** was now likely to be spelled.

Race 8 CAL ISUZU STAKES

ULTRAVIOLET (M Du Plessis) began awkwardly making heavy contact with the hind quarters of **PIPI BEEL** (O Bosson) which became unbalanced with both horses losing ground.

IRION (G Cooksley) over-raced when being restrained in the early to middle stages.

KISSES (T Thornton) raced wide without cover.

When questioned regarding the poor performance of **TIE ME DOWN** rider M McNab advised that the mare had failed to respond once placed under pressure. A post-race veterinary examination found the mare to have an elevated heart rate.

Race 9 LODGE REAL ESTATE PREMIER

NEK MINNIT (A Collett) and BLUE FLAG (O Bosson) came together leaving the barriers.

THE SWEET ESCAPE (M Du Plessis) was slow to begin.

HEEZA DREIMER (C Johnson) blundered leaving the barriers losing ground.

KAKAHU NELL (S Collett) and LAMASON (M Coleman) both began awkwardly.

TABLE ONE (L Tiley) raced keenly when being restrained in the early stages.

SING FOR THE SUN (U Holmquist) raced three wide without cover throughout.

HEEZA DREIMER was inconvenienced near the 450 metres when TIARA CONCERTO (M McNab) shifted outwards across the heels of SING FOR THE SUN.

NEK MINNIT had to be steadied when awkwardly placed on the heels of **HALONG BAY** (T Thornton) passing the 300 metres.

GORGEOUS RYDER (A Jones) lay out under pressure in the final straight having to be straightened by its rider on a number of occasions.

Apprentice A Jones (**GORGEOUS RYDER**) was spoken to regarding the manner in which she used her whip near the 250 metres.

When questioned regarding the poor performance of **WOODSMAN**, which was not persevered with in the final straight, rider D Johnson was unable to offer any excuses other than the gelding possibly being better suited by some further easing of the ground. A post-race veterinary examination did not reveal any abnormality.
