RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1	INFUSION CATERING MAIDEN 2060
<p>BRICKLEBERRY was slow to begin.</p> <p>MACROTH shifted outwards leaving the barrier crowding ROCK ON which settled back.</p> <p>GYPSY VERSE raced fiercely when being restrained near the post on the first round.</p> <p>KALDOREI over-raced in the early stages and passing the winning post on the first occasion had to be firmly restrained when awkwardly placed near the heels of PERRAN BEACH. KALDOREI continued to over-race during the middle stages so was improved three-wide near the 1400 metres to obtain a leading position.</p> <p>HARE BAWL was held up for a short distance near the 350 metres.</p> <p>VOXER had to be angled outwards across the heels of ROCK ON near the 300 metres to obtain better running.</p> <p>EN SUITE made the corner near the 325 metres awkwardly and shifted out bumping with ROCK ON (J Parkes) and when being corrected shifted in and bumped with PERRAN BEACH which became unbalanced. A short distance further ROCK ON ducked inwards abruptly when struck with the whip which resulted in tightening to EN SUITE and PERRAN BEACH which shifted in and bumped with BLAZING OPAL. The movement was considered beyond the control of Rider J Parkes. Prior to the authorisation of dividends the connections of the second placed EN SUITE viewed footage of the interference near the 300 metres with a view to lodging an objection against the winner ROCK ON but elected not to proceed.</p>	
Race 2	SPOONERS DRYCLEANERS MAIDEN 800
<p>GRACE INVADER was slow away.</p> <p>UNDERCOVER, MCPHOEBE and GALAXY respectively made the home turn awkwardly, shifting out approaching the home turn.</p>	

Rider J Parkes reported that STORYTIME was feeling the effects of shin soreness during the running. Co-trainer E Rayner advised that STORYTIME would be sent for an immediate spell.	
Race 3	G BRISTOL & SONS MAIDEN 1200
<p>IRISH STAR shifted inwards leaving the barrier forcing RHIZA in to the line of CLIFFORD and HOOFLUNG, both of which were hampered losing ground.</p> <p>GLADSTONE BELLE raced three-wide without cover throughout.</p> <p>PAUA EYES over-raced for a distance near the 800 metres.</p> <p>RHIZA had to be steadied near the 700 metres when awkwardly placed near the heels of SECRET WAR.</p> <p>Rider L Hemi (SIR BUCKALOT) lost her whip near the 200 metres.</p> <p>CLIFFORD had to be angled wider passing the 200 metres to improve.</p> <p>When questioned in to the run of RAWINIA Rider L Allpress was of the opinion the mare was not suited to being taken on in front through the early and middle stages.</p> <p>GLADSTONE BELLE was unable to be ridden out fully when in restricted room over the final stages.</p>	
Race 4	WANGANUI RACEHORSE OWNERS ASSOCIATION MDN 1200
<p>DANACANTO was slow to begin and then raced greenly through the early stages.</p> <p>MISS OAHU made the bend passing the 1000 metres awkwardly forcing RED HOT RUBY wider. MISS OAHU raced three-wide without cover for the remainder.</p> <p>DANACANTO had to be steadied for a distance passing the 600 metres when becoming awkwardly placed near the heels of ETHNEE.</p> <p>MISS OAHU hung outwards when making the bend near the 350 metres.</p> <p>RED HOT RUBY lay out under pressure through the early stages of the final straight and had to be straightened.</p> <p>RUSTY IN MELBOURNE was inclined to race greenly when placed under pressure over the final 100 metres.</p> <p>Rider D Bradley (SHOCKTILLYOUDROP) was reminded of his obligations regarding his use of the whip prior to the 200 metres.</p>	
Race 5	RAY STEVENS MAYORAL CANDIDATE? 1200
<p>PEPPERPOT ANNIE was slow to begin.</p> <p>KINGOFPLATINUM raced up onto the heels of POSTER GIRL passing the 800 metres and shifted outwards abruptly to avoid those runners' heels when the pace ahead eased. This resulted in SILVER NACHO being dictated outwards into the line of MAXSISTAR which had to be steadied.</p> <p>MACFINN raced wide without cover throughout.</p> <p>When questioned into the disappointing run of NAHEMA, Rider M McNab said the filly hung throughout and made the bend very awkwardly. M McNab considered something may be amiss with NAHEMA. A subsequent veterinary inspection did not reveal any abnormality. Connections of NAHEMA were advised to report any apparent findings to the Stewards over the coming days.</p>	
Race 6	MANELY HORSE MAIDEN 1360
<p>HEATWAVE jumped outwards abruptly leaving the barrier hampering SHOWYOUHOW which lost ground.</p> <p>TOUCH 'N GO raced awkwardly over the early stages when racing keenly.</p> <p>ALL CHARM raced three-wide without cover throughout.</p> <p>TOUCH 'N GO was held up for a short distance near the 300 metres.</p> <p>RHIANNON had to be angled inwards across the heels of GUY near the 200 metres to improve.</p> <p>BELLE CADEAU raced greenly when placed under pressure in the home straight and near the 150 metres shifted outwards abruptly having to be straightened.</p> <p>TAMORA was slow to begin and then tailed off finishing well back. Connections were advised that a warning is placed on the mare with regard to its competitiveness.</p>	
Race 7	RACE IMAGES VISIT YOUR HORSE @ RACEIMAGES.CO.NZ 1360
<p>MATOVANI and MIDNIGHT FLYER began awkwardly with MIDNIGHT FLYER losing ground.</p> <p>MALIBU MISS raced keenly in the early stages.</p> <p>MACHA raced three-wide without cover throughout.</p> <p>HOTSHOT LASS raced in restricted room near the 400 metres and again approaching the 200 metres.</p> <p>LIGHT EM UP had difficulty obtaining clear racing room for a short distance near the 200 metres.</p> <p>When questioned regarding the performance of MATOVANI Rider J Parkes could offer no excuse</p> <p>R Myers the rider of PRESH reported that in her opinion the filly may be better suited to a longer distance and any easing of the going.</p>	
Race 8	OFFICE SMARTS MAIDEN 1600
<p>GATES OF EDEN was slow to begin.</p> <p>DIVERSITY hung outwards shortly after the start resulting in severe crowding to MISS BONDI, MOUNTAIN MAN, ETOILE D'ANGE and TICKET CLIPPER. ALL IN VOGUE was also bumped in this incident, and then made the 1,400 bend awkwardly when wide. A short distance further ETOILE D'ANGE had to be steadied when on the heels of MOUNTAIN MAN going into</p>	

the first turn. This resulted in **TICKET CLIPPER** and **WHAT NOW MY LOVE** being very wide going in to the first bend.

ACCLAIM made the first turn awkwardly when wide.

ETOILE D'ANGE over-raced through the middle stages.

S McKay reported **GATES OF EDEN** attempted to get its tongue over the bit during the running. Connections advised that **GATES OF EDEN** would be retired as a racing proposition from that stable.

Race 9

TERRY BROTHERS MAIDEN 1600

MASTER WILLIAM was slow away.

DREAM DANCER and **BEAR GRYLS** got back at the start.

NESSUN DORMA made the first turn awkwardly.

BEAR GRYLS raced three-wide without cover throughout.

DREAM DANCER raced greenly in the home straight and ducked in when struck with the whip near the 250 metres dictating **BEAR GRYLS** into the line of **MASTER JACK** which was improving into a run to the outside of **MISCHELT**. This resulted in **MISCHELT** and **MASTER JACK** both becoming unbalanced. **DREAM DANCER** continued to shift in under pressure over the final stages.

HUMIDOR over-reacted when being angled outwards near the 100 metres and shifted out abruptly in to the line of **DYNAMITE LUCY** which was hampered.

Race 10

PALAMOUNTAINS NUTRITION 1600

ROSEOFPLATINUM was tightened soon after the start and settled well back.

ELLIES EMPRESS (M McNab) dipped making the crossing in the back straight. Shortly after Rider M McNab considered there may be something amiss with the mare so did not persevere over the final stages. A subsequent veterinary inspection did not reveal any abnormality.

When questioned regarding the disappointing performance of **ROSEOFPLATINUM** Rider R Hannam could offer no tangible excuse.
