RACE COMMENTS:

Race 1PORT FM RESTRICTED OPEN HURDLES (3000m)HEXIE HAO made contact with REGALO REAAL mid-air after jumping the second fence, with both horses becoming

momentarily unbalanced.

HEXIE HAO hit the fence at the 1000 metres, losing considerable momentum.

LOOSE GOOSE put in a poor leap at the fence passing the 600 metres.

ADDITUP landed awkwardly after jumping the fence at the 600 metres, losing some momentum.

YIPSON was retired from the race passing the 400 metres and did not jump the last two fences. Rider M Gillies reported that **YIPSON** had been under pressure from the 1000 metres and had been very disappointing. Stewards ordered a post-race veterinary inspection of **YIPSON** which revealed the gelding to be dehydrated and suffering a slow recovery rate. **HEXIE HAO** was retired from the race passing the 400 metres after mixing it's jumping throughout. Trainer C Anderton

advised the Stewards that the mare would now be retired as a racing proposition from her stable.

ADDITUP lay in early in the run home and brushed with LOOSE GOOSE prior to jumping the second last fence.

PROXIMITY was retired from the race passing the 200 metres and did not jump the last fence.

Both **REGALO REAAL** and **SEEKING REDEMPTION** made poor leaps at the final fence.

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Passing the 200 metres **MISS MIA** had to be steadied and shift ground outwards when becoming awkwardly placed on the heels of **SHEZATOUCHA**.

MAGGIE'S SECRET lay outwards in the middle of the run home and had to be straightened passing the 150 metres. When spoken to regarding the performance of favoured runner **SOFIA LOREN**, rider J Lowry advised that the mare had only battled fairly over the concluding stages and had been disappointing. Trainer C Anderton advised she would now give consideration to giving **SOFIA LOREN** a short spell.

Race 8 ROBBIES BAR & BISTRO STAYERS MAIDEN (2100m)

HIGH IN DEMAND was slow to begin.

BRILLANTE ROSSO raced keenly in the early stages and had to be restrained off heels passing the 1700 metres.

HIGH IN DEMAND made the first bend awkwardly shifting wider on the track forcing **SWEET TIME** over extra ground on two occasions.

HOOFINIT gave ground from the 800 metres.

SWEET TIME improved wide from the 800 metres.

ANCIENT had to be restrained passing the 700 metres when attempting a marginal run and crowded by the tiring **BRILLANTE ROSSO** and **HOOFINIT**.

MRS NEVILL made contact with the running rail at this point when crowded by the tiring runners also.

VILLA ELBA lay in passing the 400 metres making contact with HIGH IN DEMAND.

HIGH IN DEMAND was held up rounding the final bend and in the run home, having to change ground passing the 300 metres.

LIFESAHIGHWAY raced in restricted room for several strides passing the 200 metres.

ANCIENT lay in early in the run home and had to be steadied passing the 150 metres when laying inwards across the heels of **LIFESAHIGHWAY**.

VILLA ELBA lay inwards near the 50 metres.

LIFESAHIGHWAY which returned to the birdcage with blood present on a back leg underwent a post-race veterinary inspection which revealed a minor laceration to the off hind leg.

Race 9 HARDGRAVE DECORATING LTD 2100 RATING 75 (2100m)

DILLINGER and CLEM began awkwardly with both runners getting back.

GO GO GONZO raced wide in the early and middle stages.

SKILLS which finished a distant last was reported by its rider to have made abnormal breathing noises during the running. A post-race veterinary inspection of the mare revealed **SKILLS** had suffered an atrial fibrillation. The connections were advised a veterinary clearance is required prior to racing next.

When questioned regarding the performance of favoured runner **HIGHLY LIKELY**, rider M Cameron advised that in his opinion the gelding was feeling the effects of recent racing.
