PADDY BOURKE lay out rounding the first turn when over racing and near the 700 metres improved up on to the heels of **MYSTIGAN** and had to be steadied.

TWILIGHT JEWEL was slow to begin and then lost contact in the early stages despite being pressured. **TWILIGHT JEWEL** was not persevered with in the final straight finishing well back. Rider S Collett could offer no tangible excuse. **BIGSIE** lay out under pressure near the 150 metres having to be straightened.

RUSTY IN MELBOURNE shifted ground out under pressure passing the 100 metres and near the 20 metres shifted out making contact with **PADDY BOURKE** which was laying out under pressure. **M Dravitzki** was reminded of her obligations with respect to keeping her correct line of running in the final straight.

Race 4 PLACEMAKERS HAWERA CARTER HOLT HARVEY MAIDEN 1400

WYNTHORPE began awkwardly and was then hampered when MARIPOSA shifted out leaving the barriers.

MR ENTHUSIASTIC bounded on jumping away, shifted out abruptly making heavy contact with **OUR WONDER**.

HUTCH bounded at the start bumping heavily with THIN CUT which shifted in abruptly leaving the barriers.

CAPER CALEB raced fiercely in the early and middle stages having to be heavily restrained for some distance.

HUTCH lay out near the 200 metres and bumped with **CAPER CALEB** and near the 150 metres **CAPER CALEB** when laying in shifted inwards into the line of **HUTCH** which had to steady.

Apprentice D Hirini was shown footage of the final stages and advised that when in similar circumstances she is expected to stop and straighten her mounts sooner than she did on this occasion.

When questioned regarding the performance of **RED FOX** rider L Allpress reported that the gelding had raced greenly once placed under pressure in the final straight however was not overly disappointed with its run.

Race 5 PLACEMAKERS HAWERA MAIDEN 2100

DAL DUNVEGAN was crowded shortly after leaving the barriers and settled back.

RHIANNON began awkwardly and lost ground.

BLAZING OPAL and ZBEAUTY both raced keenly in the early and middle stages.

MASTER WILLIAM was held up throughout the final straight and went to the line untested.

CHEERS FOR NADIA lost its left hind plate during the running.

Race 6 NZB INSURANCE PEARL SERIES RACE RATING 65 – 1600M

SAKURA began awkwardly and lost ground.

SHEZASTUNNA was slow to begin.

GILT was inclined to over race for a short distance near the 1200 metres.

GILT lay out when improving forwarding passing the 600 metres and made the final turn awkwardly losing momentum. **Rider D Mo** reported that **SAKURA** had felt indifferent in its action during the running with a subsequent post-race

veterinary examination revealing no abnormality.

Race 7 KASER ELECTRICAL RATING 75 – 1200M

WAITINO BISCUIT was a late scratching at 8.31 am after being found to be sore when exercising prior to being transported to the meeting. Trainer R Patterson was advised that a veterinary clearance will be required.

BEACON OF HOPE which was fractious in its gate prior to the start began awkwardly when the start was affected losing several lengths (6L). After viewing video footage of the start of the race and hearing from rider C Lammas it was established that the off hind leg of **BEACON OF HOPE** came into contact with the barriers simultaneously as the start was

affected and this had resulted in the gelding beginning awkwardly and losing ground.

MAXSSISTAR was held up and unable to improve for a short distance prior to entering the home straight.

Race 8 ECOLAB RATING 65 – 2100M

THE BIG OPAL raced three wide without cover throughout.

When questioned regarding the performance of **FRED FLINTSTONE** rider C Perrett had no excuse.
